INSPECTION OF THE PROPOSED DIVERSION AREA

Forest Division-Rewa, Range-Mauganj; Forest Comp. No. PF-334, Area-4.59 Ha

The area is generally plain with gentle sloping towards northerly direction. In the north there is a black top road. The proposed diversion area for mining is proposed to be connected to the main road by the road proposed in the proposal no. FP/MP/MIN/152431/2022- 4.46 ha, which also belongs to the same proprietor, i.e. Swami Nityanandji Maharaj Stones. The project proponent has also proposed 7.5 meter width all around the mining lease area as a safety zone area.

The area is partly covered with bamboo plantations and in the rest of the area it is rocky outcrops with some sparse vegetation comprising of the species as shown in column no. 06. Most of the area is having rocky outcrops and in the rest very shallow red sandy loam soil is available. The wild life found in the area are as shown in columns 05. The area is not very important from wildlife point of view as it is at about 10 km from the nearest protected area i.e. Son Gharial WLS and it is also not a part of any notified wildlife corridor. There is no major nala passing through the area, hence there is not much impact on the hydrology of the area. There is no encroachment found in the area.

The proposal is for mining of stones by open cast method of mining. The stones will be extracted by rock breaker and extractor combination without any blasting. The extracted material will be evacuated from the mine by trucks and will be taken to crusher situated in non-forest land. As discussed with the project proponent, the shelter for the workers and supervisors would be in a temporary shade. The water for drinking and dust suppression would be by purchased water in tankers. The reclamation of the mine would be as per the approved mining plan.

The area is plain with gentle slope. The soil is red sandy loam with excellent depth. In about 3.00 ha of the area, the vegetation is MDF comprising of middle-aged canopy of *Tectona grandis, Diospyros melanoxylon, Lagerstroemia parviflora,* etc. In the rest of the area, it is open and suitable for taking up plantations. The area is surrounded by protected forests on three sides. As the CA area is in continuity with the existing protected forest about 3.00 ha area is already having forest like cover with medium dense forest comprising of the native forestry species as shown above. In the rest of the area, the

balance no. of plants (4590-3000=1590) only need to be planted as per the guideline. As per discussion with the local Forest Officials, it is very much possible to plant 1590 plants in the said open area. Therefore, there is no requirement of any plantations to be taken up in degraded forest land. But as per Parivesh 1.0 Part-II, the DFO has proposed an additional CA area of 5.00 ha in degraded forest land which is not required. The DFO needs to withdraw the same.

The DFO shall propose crop improvement plan in the 3.00 ha MDF area. The crop improvement plan may include Silvicultural operations such as removal of weeds, Cut back operation of high cuts, singling operations, Soil and moisture conservation works like gully plugging, formation of percolation tanks, staggered contour trenching, gap planting, seed dibbling, etc.

The area shall be fenced from all sides by chain link fence; a watcher's hut is suggested for providing shelter to the watcher engaged in protection of plantation.

Taking into consideration, all the facts mentioned above, the CA land provided is an excellent one and very much suitable for raising plantations with native species.
