 - The 80.77 Ha Forest Land was already diverted vide MoEF letter no. 8-123/2003-FC dated 08.11.2005 for the period of 8 years (Annexure-2). Presently, renewal of forest clearance is required for expansion of mine. Brief chronology is attached.
 - 3. The 80.77 Ha Forest Land was acquired u/s 9(i) of Coal Bearing Areas (Acquisition & Development) Act 1957 vide SO No.450E, dated 04.08.1979. Copy of the CBA Notification attached.
 - 4. The renewal of this mining area is required for gaining access to another mining lease area for which forest clearance has already been obtained by the User Agency (Proposal No.: FP/MH/MIN/6602/2011. Stage-II approval obtained on 22/12/2021). No further mining will be carried out in the instant area as informed by the User Agency.

CHRONOLOGY of APPROVALS IN DURGAPUR OC MINE, CHANDRAPUR AREA, WCL

DURGAPUR OPENCAST MINE



Durgapur Opencast Project is started by the Government of India under the Ministry of Energy in Oct 1978. Revised Project Report of Durgapur Extn. (Deep) Opencast Project was approved by the WCL Board on 21.02.2017.



The Project was accorded environmental clearance for 3.00 MTPA in a Mine lease area of 1622.50 ha by MoEF & CC vide its letter no. Vide No J-11015/381/2015-IA-II(M) dated 10.11.2017.



The total mine lease of Durgapur Opencast Project is 1597.50 Ha excluding 25.00 Ha for rehabilitation purpose. Recently, an area measuring 410.96 Ha for Durgapur Deep was acquired in 2010 vide CBA (A&D) Act 1957. The proposed 80.77 Ha Forest Land was acquired vide CBA (A&D) Act 1957 Notification vide SO No.450E, dated 04.08.1979.



80.77 Ha forest land was diverted vide MoEF letter no. 8-123/2003-FC dated 08.11.2005 for the period of 08 years. During this period total area has been broken for coal mining except the Safety Zone area as per Forest Clearance. Coal Mining was stopped in 80.77 Ha forest land since 30.10.2013. During various Site Inspections by the State Forest Department stoppage of mining activities is verified.



Presently mining is going on in Sector V which is a non-forest land. Renewal of Forest Clearance proposal has been submitted vide letter no. WCL/CHA/AGM/PLG/ REV/6704 dated 01.02.2013.



The Renewal Proposal was submitted online in FORM B in Parivesh 1.0 Portal with a proposal no. FP/MH/MIN/6704/2014. Proposal was recommended by the Nodal Officer (FC), Maharashtra State vide letter dated 23.08.2019.



Renewal of Forest Clearance was recommended by the Government of Maharashtra vide letter FLD-2019/CR-310/F-10 dated 19.06.2024.

Sir.

I am directed to refer to your letter No. FLD-3603/CR-40/F-10 dated 28.10.2003 and subsequent letter No. Desk-17/NC/I/CR-11192/2691/04-05 dated 20.01.2005 and letter No. Desk-17/NC/I/CR-11192/1082/05-06 dated 26.09.2005 on the above mentioned subject whereunder the above proposal and compliance of various conditions was submitted, seeking prior approval of the Central Government in accordance with Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

- 2. After careful consideration of the proposal of the State Government, the Central Government hereby conveys its approval under Section-2 of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 80.77 ha of forest land for Durgapur open cast coal mine project, in District Chandrapur, Maharashtra, subject to fulfilment of following conditions:-
- (i) / Legal status of the forest shall remain unchanged.
- (ii) Compensatory Afforestation shall be raised over degraded forest land double in extent to the area being diverted, i.e., over 162.00 ha and shall be maintained at the project cost.
- (iii) The lease period under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 will be for 8 years.
- (iv) The State Covernment should transfer amount of NPV and other funds to Compensatory Afforestation Fund Management and Planning Authority (CAMPA), which has already been constituted and notified by the Central Government on 23.04.2004. Till such time, the CAMPA intimates the Head of Accounts for deposition of funds, the funds will be maintained in the form of fixed deposits in the name of Nodal Officer or concerned Divisional Forest Officer of the State Government. The funds realized towards the NPV shall not be utilized by the State Government.
- (v) RCC pillars of 4 feet height shall be erected to demarcate the area by the user agency at the project cost and will be marked with forward and back bearings.

- (v) The user agency shall raise, fence and maintain a safety zone around the mining area and will also raise and maintain the plantation over an area one and half times in extent of the safety zone at the project cost.
- (viii All necessary measures should be taken by the user agency to protect the environment.
- (viii) The user agency should implement the reclamation works as per the reclamation plan. Monitoring of the reclamation works should be done continuously by the State Folest Department. The user agency shall submit progress report of reclamation works to the State Forest Department and Regional Office, Bhopal
- (ix) Trees shall be felled only when it becomes necessary and that too under strict supervision of State Forest Department, and at the cost of the project.
- (x) No labour camps shall be established on the forest land.
- (xi) Sufficient firewood shall be provided by the user agency to the labourers at the project cost after purchase from the State Forest Department/Porest Development Corporation
- (xii) The user agency shall ensure that there should be no damage to the available wildlife.
 - (xiii) The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal.
 - (xiv) The forest land thus diverted shall be non-transferable. Whenever the forest land is not required, it shall be surrendered to the State Forest Department under infimation to this Ministry.
