The MoEF&CC notification dated 17,12,2024 states "Provisions of Rule 14(1) of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Rules, 2023, provides that the non-forest land identified for raising Compensatory Afforestation (CA) is to be notified as Protected Forests before final approval (Stage-II) approval is granted by the Central Government. However, in cases where non-forest land identified for CA has been transferred and mutated in favour of the State Forest Department (SFD), the Central Government may accord final approval keeping in view the fact that provisions of the (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 become applicable on such lands being entered as forest in government record/record of rights."

As the CA land located at Nongumiang, West Khasi Hills, has already been transferred and mutated & notified in favour of the State Forest Department vide Letter No: FOR.64/2021/1019-A dated 16-05-2025.

A copy of the letter is attached herewith as Annexure- 3A.

The non-forest land for CA should be free from all encumbrances at the time of submission of compliance report and the State government will submit a report in this regard after jointly verified by a team of State Forest Department and Regional Office;



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DEED OF TRANSFER OF LAND



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

Joint inspection and verification of 11.09 Hectares Compensatory Afforestation Land at Nonguminag transferred to Government of Meghalaya Forest Department by M/s Green Valliey Industries Limited.

In compliance to condition No.(v) of the In-Principle Approval of the Ministry letter dated 01.10.2024, a joint inspection was conducted on 28.02.2025 for the verification of 11.09 Ha Compensatory Afforestation Land at Nongumiang transferred to Government of Meghalaya Forest Department by M/s Green Valliey Industries Limited in lieu of the forest land diversion proposal of 11.09 Ha for Limestone Mining Project at Madan Pyrda (Block-II) Limestone Deposit located at Chiehruphi East Jaintia Hills District, Meghalaya by a team of officers from Regional Office and State Forest Department led by DIGF(C) MoEFCC, Regional Office Shillong along with representatives from Green Valliey Industries Limited.

Observations:

- The proposed area for compensatory afforestation, measuring 11.09 hectares, is located adjacent to the Nongumiang Reserve Forest of 31 ha. It is bounded on the Western and Northern sides by land allotted to M/s Green Valley Industries Limited, and on the Eastern and Southern sides by land allotted to M/s Lafarge Umiam.
- The 11.09 hectares patch of land for compensatory afforestation is part of a 31.14 hectares plot allotfed to M/s Green Valley Industries Limited, which has been transferred to the State Forest Department of Meghalaya via DFO, Social Forestry and Territorial Division, West & South West Khasi Hills, Nongstoin on the 22.10.2024.

- 3 The land documents and sale deed executed on 14/11/2019 between Shri. Sailen Nongrum and Green Valley Industries Limited, represented by its local director, Smt. kyrmenlang Wahlang, are verified as accurate.
- 4. The boundary has been demarcated with concrete boundary pillars marked with numbers and DGPS coordinates.
- All the DGPS Coordinates on the erected pillars has been verified.
- The land is free from all encumbrances and is now legally Government property.
- The proposed land is covered with invasive weeds such as Eupatorium, Mikanin, lantupa, thatch grass, and few naturally regenerating forest trees. There are open parches such as swamp and open areas covered only with grass. The soil is fertile and has gentle slopes.
- Trees species such as Castanopsis purpurella, Schima wallichii, Camellia caudate. Elacocuepus lanceifolius, Pterosperaum lanceifolium, Macaranga denticulate. Translicoco chinensis, Triadicaco chinensis, Cinnamamum cecicadaphne. Eurya japonica, Cirmamomum bejolyhota, Myrica integrifolia and shrubs species such as Alangium chinense, Casearia glomerata, Croton caudatus, Symplocas hookeri, Persen odoratissima, Rhus chinensis, Triumfettar homboidea, Urena lobata, Ziziphus ornopolia. Zizvplnis rugosowas seen during the Site Inspection in the CA land.
- 9. The staff accompanying the DFO, Nongstoin informed that they had spotted some wildlife during patrolling duties and some animals were recognized through sounds, pugmarks and droppings in the vicinity like Indian flying fox, Hoary-bellied squirrel, Common Hare, Small Indian Mongoose, Jungle cat, Leopard cat, Clouded leopard, Wild Dog, Common otter, Yellow throated Marten, Wild Boar, Indian Muntjac, Red Serow, Capped Langur, Rhesus macaque.

Positive Aspects of the Proposed CA land:

As per observation during the site Inspection, the proposed CA land having an area of 11.09 Ha is suitable for CA as the land is adjacent to the existing RF,i.e., namely Nongumiang RF which offers several benefits for natural Regeneration.

The adjacent RF can serve a source of seeds, facilitating natural regeneration on the proposed CA land.

The existing RF microelimate can positively influence the CA land, creating a favourable environment for plant growth.

The soil quantity on the CA land may benefit from the adjacent forest's ecosystem processes such as nutrient cycling and soil formation. The CA land's adjacent to the existing RF can also enhance ecological connectivity.

- The CA land can serve as a wildlife corridor connecting the RF to other habitat promoting biodiversity.
- The CA land may provide additional habitat for wildlife, expanding the existing RF ecological footprint.

Afforestation and Reforestation:

The proposed CA land offers oppurtunities for afforestation and reforestation. The CA land can be used to plant native species promoting biodiversity and ecosystem services. The CA land can also contribute to carbon sequestration efforts, mitigating climate change impacts.

The proposed CA land can also provide socio-econimie benefits. It can create livelihood oppurtunities such as employment in forest management and Conservation.

The proposed CA land's proximity to the RF can support ecotourism initiatives, generating income for the local communities.

Recommendation:

The proposed CA land adjacent to the RF offers numerous benefits for natural regeneration, ecological connectivity afforestation and socio-economic development. By invertiging these opportunities, the proposed CA land can contribute to the biodiversity conservation, ecosystem services and sustainable development and in the light of the above the proposed CA land is suitable for Compensatory afforestation.

CONCLUSION:

As per the inspection of 11.09 hectares Compensatory Afforestation Land at Nongumians transferred to Government of Meghalaya Forest Department by M/s Green Valliey Industries Limited in lieu of the forest land diversion proposal of 11.09 Ha for Limestone Mining Project at Madan Pyrda (Block-II) Limestone Deposit located at Chieliruphi East Jaintia Hills District, the observation is hereby summarised as follows:

- Land was degraded during handing and taking over.
- Land is fertile and suitable to carry out Compensatory afforestation works with Assisted Natural Regeneration.
- Land is free from all encumbrances.

4 Even though this is a non-forest area but the vegetation, animals / wildlife present, making this is an ideal area as a Land Bank to conserve which is very far from homan habitation which will increase / supplement the very meagre 4% of recognized Government Forest land unique only to the State of Meghalaya.

The Land is to be notified as 'Reserved Forest' prior to submission of APO for Compensatory Afforestation.



A) Mitigation measures to minimize sail erosion and choking of stream shall be implemented within a period of three year with effect from the issue of Stage-II clearance in accordance with the approved Plan in consultation with the State Forest Department.

PROTECTIVE MEASURES TO MINIMIZE SOIL EROSION AND CHOKING OF STREAM:

Madan Pyrda Block-2 covering an area of 10.71 Ha and having an undulating topography lies in the midst of limestone belt. The basic nature of such land/deposit is that rain water gets percolated into the ground. However, due to the undulating topography, the rain water travels a bit before getting percolated. Hence precautionary measures are to be taken so that the flowing water does not affect the surrounding.

The effects of rain water are:

- 1 Wash off of loose materials dumped (Waste material) / stacked (Top soil) / fragments/dust generated during blasting in the mine pit
- 2. Soil erosion

Mitigation measures:

1. Wash offs from Dump/Stack:

No water from the quarry will be discharged to any natural water course directly. It will be channelized through garland drain/ water channel with restricted flow utilizing series of settling tanks/sedimentation ponds. The slope of the area is towards the west direction at 795 mHL along the waste dump and 803 mRL and in West direction along the top soil stack. Retaining wall of width at the top - 1m and width at the bottom- 2 m, length (899 m) will be erected at the foot of the waste dump & top soil stack at a distance of 5m from the top toe, to prevent any wash off during rainy season.

a) Retaining wall: To restrict flowing away of debris from dump/stack, a retaining wall consisting of boulders will be erected surrounding the waste dump and topsoil stack area at a distance of 5 m from the top toe of proposed dump/stack in the 1st year of mining.

Dimension of such retaining walls will be:

For Waste Dump: 1 m X 1 m X 687 m,

For Top soil stack: 1 m X 1 m X 212 m

b) Garland drain: Water passing out of the retaining wall may contain finer dust particles; hence it will be made to channelize through a garland drain, cut at a distance of 1 m from the retaining wall and surrounding it. It will be developed in the 1st year itself.

Dimension of such retaining walls will be:

For Waste Dump: 1 m X 1 m X 700 m,

For Top soil stack: 1 m X 1 m X 225 m

c) Settling Tanks/Sedimentation Ponds: The water running through the garland drain will contain some debris; hence to check this & settle the sedimented particles, running water shall be made to pass through settling tanks/sedimentation ponds of appropriate capacity where the debris/finer particles will get settled & Sediment free water shall be discharged. Three settling tanks/sedimentation ponds have been proposed; 1 near Top soil stack, 2 near waste dump () will ultimately discharge the sediment free water out of lease area).

Dimension of settling tanks: 3 m X 3 m X 9 m

- d) Water channel: The water cannot be left flowing over the lease area unattended; hence channels, having 1 m depth and 1 m width will be cut to guide the flowing water to pass the lease boundary at a fixed point. Before leaving the lease area, water has to flow through a settling tank again.
- w) Check dam: It is the general condition that if water is allowed to run uninterrupted, the speed of water flow will be high, thereby causing soil erosion and carrying out the soil particles up to the settling tanks (settling tank will get filled up easily requiring clearing of settled material frequently). Hence check dams will be erected to restrict the flow speed as well as to control sitt/sedimentation flow, 3 check dams have been proposed. Dimension of such check dams will be:

 $1\,\mathrm{m}$ X $1\,\mathrm{m}$ X $1\,\mathrm{m}$ with $3\,\mathrm{m}$ concrete base to avoid direct water fall on the ground soil layer.

A schematic sketch of all the above precautionary measures has been attached below.




Fig:1 Schematic Diagram Showing the Design of Check Dam, Settling Tank, Garland Drain and Retaining Wall

2. Soil erosion:

Flowing water always tend to erode the soil; to control this aspect, settling tanks/check dams will be developed as described above. Further, as described below in Point no. 8, plantation shall also be done in progressive manner.

It may be noted here that the quality of water, both surface & underground has been tested in the vicinity of this Block. Underground water was collected from a dug well, situated in Chiefiruphi village and surface water sample was collected from the spring flowing near NH 6; parameters of both the water samples tested within the permissible limit. The test report is attached herewith.

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

B) Planting of adequate plant species and sowing of seeds, in the appropriate area within the mining lease to arrest soil erosion in accordance with the approved scheme.

Plantation: The entire safety zone, covering an area of 1.11 Ha will be developed as a green belt during the first five years plan period. At the end of the conceptual stage the total degraded area of 10.71 ha will be afforested which includes safety zone and mined out benches. Suitable species will be planted after discussion with the forest department. During the first five years approximately a total 2700 nos. of plants will be planted in 1.00 ha area. The Capital Cost for Green Belt Development is Rs. 3,50,000.00 and annual recurring cost Rs. 2,00000.00. At the end of the conceptual period a total nos. of 16,320 plants will be planted on the mined-out benches over an area of 9.60 Ha area. The total 19,295 (approximately) nos. of saplings will be planted in the entire lease area. Local species as Artocarpus Heterophyllus, Artocarpus Chaplasha, Albitia Procera, Toona Ciliata etc. are proposed to be planted; however, local and indigenous species will be preferred and species selection will be done in consultation with the Forest Department.




Fig: Reclamation Plan Madan Pyrda Black-It Limestone Deposit

C. Construction of check dams, retention /toe walls to arrest sliding down of the excavated material along the contour in accordance with the approved scheme.

Mitigation measures:

Wash offs from Dump/Stack:

No water from the quarry will be discharged to any natural water course directly. It will be channelized through garland drain/ water channel with restricted flow utilizing settling tanks/sedimentation ponds.

a) Retaining wall: To restrict flowing away of debris from dump/stack, a retaining wall consisting of boulders will be erected surrounding the dump/stack area and at a distance of 2 m from the proposed type of such dump/stack in the 1st year of mining plan.

Dimension of such retaining walls will be:

For Waste Dump: 1 m X 1 m X 687 m,

For Top soil stack: 1 m X 1 m X 212 m

 b) Garland drain: Water passing out of the retaining wall may contain finer dust particles; hence it will be made to channelize through a garland drain, cut at a distance of 1 m from the retaining wall and surrounding it, it will be developed in the 1st year itself.

Dimension of such retaining walls will be:

For Waste Dump: 1 m X 1 m X 700 m,

For Top soil stack: 1 m X 1 m X 225 m

c) Settling Tanks/Sedimentation Ponds: The water running through the garland drain will contain some debris; hence to check this, running water is made to pass through tanks/sedimentation ponds where the debris/finer particles get settled. Sediment free water shall be discharged. Three settling tanks/sedimentation ponds have been proposed; 1 near Top so stack, 2 near waste dump (1 will pass out the water out of lease area)

Dimension of settling tank: 3 m X 3 m X 9m

- d) Water channel: The water cannot be left flowing over the lease area unattended; hence channels, having 1 m depth and 1 m width will be cut to guide the flowing water to pass the lease boundary at a fixed point. Before leaving the lease area, water has to flow through a settling tank again,
- e) Check dam: It is the general condition that if water is allowed to run uninterrupted, the speed of water flow will be high, thereby causing soil erosion and carrying out the soil particles up to the settling tanks (settling tank will get filled up easily requiring clearing of settled material frequently). Hence check dams will be erected to restrict the flow speed as well as to control slit flow. 3 check dams have been proposed during the first year. Dimension of such check dams will be: 1 m X 1 m X 1 m with 3 m concrete base to avoid direct water fall on the ground soil layer.




Fig: Schematic Diagram showing the design of Check Dam, Settling Tank, Garland Drain and Retaining Wall

D) Stabilize the overburden dumps by appropriate grading/benching, in accordance with the approved scheme, so as to ensure that angles of repose at any given place is less than 28°

Overburden generated from the mine will be mainly comprise of sandy soil and Sandstone. Total 1.413 million cubic meter waste comprising of sandy soil and sandstone will be generated during the life of the mine and 13,56,683.06 Tons of waste will be generated from the mine during the first plan period which will be temporarily dumped in the waste Dump Area (proposed to be located over the mineralized area) of 3.05 ha area in the Eastern side within the lease. 7280.06 m³ (14,560.14 tons) of topsoil will be generated during the first plan period which will be stacked separately in 0.27 ha area in the southernmost side within the mining lease and further it will be used for green belt development and plantation purposes over the worked-out benches. The Sandstone will be utilized in the applicant's coment plant for production purpose after taking necessary permission from the concerned authorities.

Dump Stabilization:

Dump stabilization will be done by dozing, maintaining proper slopes, stacking the topsoil in terraced fashion; for this purpose, crawler mounted KOMATSU make dozer of capacity 200 HP will be used, besides this 06 numbers of 14 m³ capacity dumpers, Front end loader, and 0.9 m³ capacity backhoe shovels will be utilized for mining, overburden management and Topsoil management. Retaining walls will be constructed around the toe of the overburden dump, Topsoil and waste will be stacked as terraces to increase the stability. Estimated expenditure for dump area stabilization, development and Topsoil Stacking is approximately ₹14.70 Lakh.

Steps to be taken for stabilization and management of overburden:

- Rain water accumulation will be avoided by proper leveling of dump.
- 899 m retaining wall and 925 m garland drain around the waste dump and Topsoil stack will be constructed to arrest the wash off.
- D3 nos. Check Dams will be constructed to control the speed of rain water flow as well as the debris.
- To increase stability of the dump, overburden and Topsoil will be kept as terraces.
- Proper bench height and slope will be maintained.
- Overburden will be stabilized by dozing.
- Proper monitoring of the dumps will be done.

During the first five years plan period 7280.06 cum topsoil will be generated. The topsoil will be stacked within the mining lease area on 0.27 Ha land in the Southern part of the least area, the topsoil will entirely be used for plantation.

During the first five years plan period total 7280.07m³ Topsoil will be generated and 250 m³ of the topsoil will be utilized, remaining 7030.07 m³ of the Topsoil will be stored. Maximum 3738.42m³ Topsoil will be generated during the first year. The following steps will be taken for Topsoil Management.

- The topsoil will be store in the southern most part within the mining lease area on 0.27 Ha
 land.
- The Topsoil will be stacked properly, maximum bench height will be maintained 3.30m.
- Retaining wall will be constructed around the Topsoil Stack to arrest the wash off.
- As the topsoil will not be stored for a long time, it will be utilized for plantation in the green belt and work-out benches.



1. Project Details:

Madan Pyrda Block-2 Limestone Deposit is located in Village: Chiehruphi, East Jainta Hills District of Meghalaya; this Limestone mining project belonging to M/s Green Valley Industries Limited spreads over an area of 11.09 Ha (Mt area: 10.71 Ha + Approach Road 0.38 Ha). It is bounded by the latitude is 25°12'29.57°N to 25°12'39.62°N, and longitude 92°22'52.73°E to 92°23'12.91°E and falls on the SOI Toposheet 83C/8. The Maximum production of Limestone is 400602 TPA. Mining Plan for Madan Pyrda Block-2 Limestone Deposit has been approved by the Indian Bureau of Mines vide letter No: MCDR-MPCP0CaFl/3/2023-GUH-IBM_RO_GUH diated 20/06/2023; Environment Clearnce for the said Limestone mining project has been issued by SEIAA on 03.03.2025, (Proposal No - SIA/ML/MIN/505476/2024 dt. 29/11/2024). Forest Diversion proposal under section 2 (1) (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act 1980 has been submitted on 18/10/2019 (Proposal No: FP/ML/MIN/40422/2019); subsequently, "In-Principle" Approval has been granted by MoEF&CC on 30.09.2024.

2. Tree Transplantation/Translocation Scheme:

The total project area is 11.09 Ha (ML Area: 10.71 Ha+ Approach Road 0.38 Ha), MOEF & CC accorded in principle approval for diversion of 11.09 Ha of deemed private forest land vide MOEF & CC uniter No: F.NO-3-MGC017/2022-SHI dated 30.09.2024 subject to fulfilment of various condition No. (XX) of the in Principle Approval states as follows:


2.1 Condition No. (XX)

The user agency shall explore the possibility of translocation of maximum number of trees identified to be falled and shall ensure that any tree folling shall be done only when it is unavoidable and that too under strict supervision of the State Forest Department.

in order to meet the above stated condition, Tree Transplantation/Translocation Scheme has been prepared in consultant with the State Forest Department. The details of the Tree transplantation/translocation Scheme is further explained in detail in this report.

3. Location and Communication:

Madan Pyrda (Block-II) Limestone Deposit spreading oven an area of 11.09 ha located at Chiehruphi Millage. East Jaintia Hills District of Meghalaya. The Block is covered under the Survey of India Foposheet Not 83C/8. The area is bounded by latitude is 25°12'29.57"N to 25°12'39.62"N, and longitude 92°22'52,73°E to 92°23'12.91". The area is well connected to NH-6 which is at a distance of 1.01 Km from the lease boundary and the nearest town Khiliehriat. The nearest liver is UM-Lunar which is located at a distance of 5 km and the nearest village is Chiehruphi which is 0.800m away from the lease boundary. Narpuh wildlife sanctuary is located at a distance of 8.16 km SSE.

4. Land Cover

The total land coming within the lease hold area of proposed Madan Pyrda (8lock-2) Limitstone Deposit is 11.09 Ha. At present the land area is deemed private forest land.

5. Geomorphology and Topography:

5.1 Geomorphology:

The elevation of the area varies from 798m to 769. The maximum basin elevation is 769m is found at the Southern side of the lease area while minimum elevation 769 is present near the road in the North direction of the lease area.

5.2 Topography:

The area is a part of Shillong Plateau, which is comprised of rugged undulating terrain having hills and deep dissected valleys. The limestone deposits are seated on several such hills. The proposed mine area is a gentle aloping bowl sloping land, with elevation difference of 29m, from 769 m to 798 m.

above mst. A few water courses develop during rainy season along the undulating profile of the surface and these water courses have their flow directed either towards the south and southeast.

6. Geology:

Line-units of Jaintia Group of the Epcene age are generally encountered surrounding the Block area. However, the area exposes only two litho-units viz, Narpuh sandstone followed by Umlaidoh Linestone, besides brownish sandy soil and bouldery sandstones. The overburden consists of reddish brown to yellowish brown sandy soil. The soil is comparatively soft and generally dry. The other component of the overburden is sandstone. The sandstone is Gray, fine to medium grained with well-slefined bedding, at places weathered producing brown strains. The limestone occurring below the landstone is generally grey in colour having moderate specific gravity, with concholdal fractures and readily effervesces with HCL; Limestone is always hard and at places forms deep escarpments.

Narpuh Sandstone: The sandstone band lies just above the Umlatdon Limestone, gray in colour, medium grained, moderately hard to hard.

Umlatdoh Limestone: Umlatdoh is the main unit of interest in the prospect iles conformably over the Lakadong Sandstone and covered on the top by overburden soil and sandstone boulden. The limestone is visible only at some places in the area, solution cavities are common in the deposits.

takadong Sandstone: The Sandstone is of variegated colours from white to yellow and brownish yellow, soft and friable to hard and compact at depth, it is coarse grained.

7. Reclamation of Overburden Dump:

- Following activities shall be taken up for reclamation of Overburden Dump
- Stabilization of the overburden dumps.
- · Construction of retaining walls.
- · Construction of garland drains.
- Construction of check dams and settling tanks.
- A green belt will be developed along the mine boundary that will intercept dust, gaseous pollutants and noise.

& Afforestation Programme:

The afforestation plan has been prepared keeping in view the land use changes that will occur due to mining operation in the core area. Plantation will be done along the safety zone of the lease area having 1.11 ha land. In addition, the minded-out area of 9.60 ha mined out benches will also be rehabilitated with planation at the end of the lease period.





1. Specific Additional Conditions

S. No	EC Conditions
1.1	A settling Tank is to be constructed, at a suitable site within the mining area for collection of debris, sediment, silt, fragmented stones etc carried by surface water channelized through the Curtain drain. The deposited debris, spoils etc are to be removed/cleared, both from the tank and drain as and when required. Overflowing water that flows downhill shall be dispersed but precautions to be taken that, spoils etc. generated from mining are not carried along.
1.2	A retaining wall of adequate height not less than 6 ft above the ground level and 4-6 ft below the ground level is to be constructed within mining site for stacking of Over Burden (OB), to ensure that no debris etc. overflows to adjoining land/agricultural field.
1.3	Garland drains is to be constructed along the periphery of the mining lease boundary to capture the storm water run-off from the mining area, all drains will link to a settling tank with compartments to check and arrest siltation in the mine water prior to discharge.
1.4	Curtain Drain is to be constructed properly to intercept the surface water from flowing into the mining area and water flowing out of the mine channelized to the Settling tank.
1.5	To increase the allocation for plantation and maintenance as well as increase the number of saplings to be planted.

1.6	The Nurseries and planting operations for the approved species as given in the EIA report should be completed before commencement of the mining operation and the types of species, planting techniques should be as per the Forest Department Plantation Norms (Amended in 31.03.2023) & plantation should be done in the 1st and 2nd year of the plan period, followed by maintenance, vacancy filling every year till attainment of maturity/establishment.
1.7	To increase the allocation for sewage treatment plan and construction of three chambered septic tank is recommended.
1.8	GPS coordinates of each pillar should be carved/painted clearly on the pillars with red colour.
1.9	A board highlighting the name of project and project proponent, location name, total area of the mine, date of issue of EC by SEIAA and CTO & CTE by MSPCB should be installed at the entrance to the mining site and clearly visible.
1.10	Fencing of the boundary of site with minimum four strands of barbed wire or ordinary split bamboo fencing is to be erected all around the periphery of the approved mining area.
1.11	The Green Belt shall be created within the Safety Zone area and if there are any sorts of vegetation in the said area, they shall be preserved and not damaged.
1.12	In annual EMP budget under CER, an addition capital cost should be allocated for Water treatment and filtration plant for nearby villages, contribution towards plantation in nearby villages by creating Community Nurseries for free distribution of seedlings. Budget under said head stands revised accordingly.

The ambient air quality shall also be monitored at prominent places like office building, canteen etc. as per the site condition to ascertain the exposure characteristics at specific places. 


