Sub: Diversion of forest land for non-forest purpose under Forest Conservation Act, 1980 proposed for Construction of Kondagaon Bypass Road (from NH-30 KM 223/2 To KM 230/10 from 1/2 to 9/8 =8.727 KM) area – 9.304 Ha in Dahikonga Range in RF Compartment no. 795, 794, 777 and RF 793 in South Kondagaon Forest Division, Kondagaon District in the State of Chhattisgarh- regarding.

Sir,

Kindly refer to the letter no. F-5-24/2022/10-2 dated 26.12.2022, of State Government and letter no. LM/Misc.-1/115-738/2794 dated 06.12.2022, APCCF, Nodal Officer (FCA), Chhattisgarh received in this office on 02.01.2023, on the above subject seeking prior approval of the Central Government under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. It is to say that the said proposal has been examined in the Integrated Regional Office in the light of the relevant provisions of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and Guidelines issued thereunder.

After examination of the proposal of the State Government and on the basis of the approval of the proposal by the Regional Empowered Committee, the Central Government hereby accords **'In-principle'** approval under Section -2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for Diversion of forest land for Construction of Kondagaon Bypass Road area – 9.304 Ha in Dahikonga Range in RF Compartment no. 795, 794, 777 and RF 793 in South Kondagaon Forest Division, Kondagaon District in the State of Chhattisgarh subject to the fulfillment of the following conditions:

- i. Legal status of the diverted forest land shall remain unchanged;
- ii. **Compensatory Afforestation:**
 - a) Compensatory afforestation shall be taken up by the User Agency carried out on 18.608 ha. Degraded revenue forest land in Khasra No. 1/1 (total area 38.019 ha) at Village Aadnar, in Kondagaon Forest Division at the cost of the user agency. As far as possible, a mixture of local indigenous species shall be planted and monoculture of any species may be avoided;
 - b) The revenue forest land shall be transferred and mutated in favour of the State Forest Department.
- iii. The cost of Compensatory Afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The

CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years;

iv. **NPV:**

- a) The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 9.304 ha forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 30/10/2002, 01/08/2003, 28/03/2008, 24/04/2008 and 09/05/2008 in IA No. 566 in WP (C) No. 202/1995 and as per the guidelines issued by the Ministry vide letters No. 5-1/1998-FC (Pt.II) dated 18/09/2003, letter No. 5-2/2006-FC dated 03/10/2006, letter No. 5-3/2007-FC dated 05/02/2009 and letter No. 5-3/2011- FC(Vol-I) dated 06.01.2022 in this regard;
 - b) Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after finalization of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on receipt of the report from the Expert Committee, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect;
- v. All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/ deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portai (<https://parivesh.nic.in/>);
- vi. The State Government of Chhattisgarh/ Nodal Officer (FCA), Forest Department of Chhattisgarh shall ensure settlement of rights under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 (No. 2 of 2007) before issuing an order for handing over of forest land to the User Agency as per Rule- 9 (6) (b) (ii) of Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2002 dated 28.06.2022;
- vii. The total project affected trees are 321; comprised of 59 trees above 90 cm girth and the remaining 262 trees below 90 cm girth class. The User agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department and the cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department;
- viii. The RoW of existing road and proposed road is 18 m;
- ix. The boundary of the diverted forest land, shall be demarcated on ground at the project cost, by erecting four feet high reinforced cement concrete pillars, each inscribed with its serial number, forward and back bearing and distance from pillar to pillar;
- x. Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/ Forest Areas;
- xi. User Agency shall obtain Environmental Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if applicable;

- xii. The State Forest Department shall ensure that all proposed structures provide safe passage for the smooth movement of wildlife and cattle as suggested by the Wildlife Institute of India in manual entitled "Eco-friendly Measures to Mitigate Impacts of Linear Infrastructure on Wildlife, published in 2016 and as desired that KML file of the entire alignments highlighting the location of all structures (Culverts, Box culverts, and Slab Culverts etc.) should be submitted to the IRO, Raipur along with the Stage-I compliance report;
- xiii. The designing of culverts/bridges, over the natural streams/rivers/canals should be done in such a manner that it does not hamper the natural course of water, does not give rise to water-logging, and also does not hamper movement of wild animals;
- xiv. The plantation along the road side or in RoW of the road as per the IRC norms should preferably be done by the State Forest Department besides general and standard conditions from the funds provided by the User Agency. The State forest department shall prepare the plantation proposal giving preference to the native forest tree species including fruit-bearing tree species, and shall submit to the IRO, Raipur along with the Stage-I compliance report;
- xv. The plantation schemes along with the selection of species and other technical inputs should be approved from the concerned State Forest Department. Further the user agency & State Forest department shall ensure good quality of plantation & ensure survival of all such plantations.
- xvi. No labour camp shall be established on the forest land;
- xvii. The User Agency shall provide fuels preferably alternate fuels to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas;
- xviii. The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal;
- xix. The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government.
- xx. No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work;
- xxi. The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of lease to be granted in favour of the user agency or the project life, whichever is less;
- xxii. The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Govt. of India;
- xxiii. Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guideline F. No. 11- 42/2017-FC dt 29/01/2018;
- xxiv. Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.

xxv. The compliance report shall be uploaded on e-portal (<https://parivesh.nic.in/>).

After receipt of a satisfactory compliance report from the State Government in respect of condition no. ii, iii, iv (a), v, vii, ix, xii, xiii, xiv and undertakings, duly authenticated by the competent authority in the State Government, in respect of all other conditions, from the State Government, formal approval will be considered in this regard under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.
