Subject: Proposal for seeking prior approval of the Central Government under Section 2 (1) (ii) of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhinyam, 1980 for diversion of 19.00 ha Reserve forest land for open cast Mining of Pyrophilite/diaspore in Compartment No. RF-262, Range Jatara, Tikamgarh District of Madhya Pradesh State in favour of M/s Khajuraho Minerals Pvt. Ltd. (Online No. FP/MP/MIN/35835/2018) – reg.

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to refer to the Government of Madhya Pradesh's letter no.F-1/FP/MP/MIN/35835/2018/1805 dated 30.05.2019 and additional information provided vide letters dated 24.07.2025 and 09.09.2025 on the above mentioned subject, seeking prior approval of the Central Government under Section 2 (1) (ii) of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhinyam, 1980. The proposal was accorded '*In-Principle*' (Stage-I) approval by the Central Government vide letter dated 10.10.2025. The Government of Madhya Pradesh has reported/submitted the compliance report vide letter dated 26.02.2026 to the conditions stipulated in the '*In-Principle*' approval and requested for grant of final approval.

2. In this connection, I am directed to say that on the basis of the compliance report furnished by the Government of Madhya Pradesh vide letter dated 26.02.2026, Stage-II/Final approval of the Central Government is hereby granted under Section 2 (1) (ii) of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhinyam, 1980 for diversion of 19.00 ha Reserve forest land for open cast Mining of Pyrophilite/diaspore in Compartment No. RF-262, Range Jatara, Tikamgarh District of Madhya Pradesh State in favour of M/s Khajuraho Minerals Pvt. Ltd. subject to fulfilment of the following conditions:

- i. Legal status of the diverted forest land shall remain unchanged.
- ii. Compensatory Afforestation over 19 ha of identified Non-Forest land (Survey No. 13/1, Village Kasera, District Chhattarpur, M.P.) in a single patch shall be raised at the project cost and afforestation work shall start within two years from the date of final approval and maintained thereafter in accordance with the approved CA scheme by the State Forest Department.
- iii. The non-forest land transferred and mutated in favour of the State Forest Department shall be notified by the State Government as Protected Forests under section 29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 or under the relevant section(s) of the local Forest Act, before handing over the forest land to the user agency.

- iv. The User Agency shall pay the additional amount of NPV, if so determined, and as per the final decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- v. The User Agency shall maintain a buffer zone of at least 100 meters along the nalla passing through the proposed forest land for 6-MPC027/2019-BHO 1/137468/2025 diversion and the flow of water in the Nalla will not be obstructed due to the work of the proposed mine.
- vi. The User Agency shall provide settling tanks at suitable points in the garland drain, so that the water is discharged into the Jamanara nala without any silt. Further, the approach access should also be provided with at least two rows of plantation and its maintenance with native species at the cost of the User Agency.
- vii. The chain link fence shall be provided all around the 19.00 ha CA area before taking up plantations with native species. Suitable soil and moisture conservation works be incorporated in the afforestation scheme. Compensatory.
- viii. The User Agency shall undertake mining in a phased manner after taking due care for reclamation of the mined over area. The concurrent reclamation plan as per the approved mining plan shall be executed by the User Agency from the very first year, and an annual report on implementation thereof shall be submitted to the Nodal Officer, in the concerned State Government and the concerned Regional Office of the Ministry. If it is found from the annual report that the activities indicated in the concurrent reclamation plan are not being executed by the User Agency, the Nodal Officer or the concerned Deputy Director General of Forests (Central) may direct that the mining activities shall remain suspended till such time, such reclamation activities area satisfactorily executed.
- ix. The User Agency shall implement the schedule for surrender of the mined out and reclaimed forest land in accordance with existing mining plan as submitted along with the compliance report.
- x. The rehabilitated forest area after closure of mining operations shall be handed over to the State Forest Department for sustainable forest management in the future.
- xi. The following Safety Zone Management activities at the project cost shall be undertaken by the User Agency for management of safety zone as per relevant guidelines issued by the Ministry's guidelines:
 - a. User agency shall ensure demarcation of safety zone (7.5 meter strip all along the inner boundary of the mining lease area), and its fencing, protection and regeneration by erecting adequate number of 6 feet high RCC boundary pillars inscribed with DGPS coordinates with barbed wire fencing and deploying adequate number of watchers under the supervision of the State Forest Department.
 - b. Boundary of safety zone of the mining lease, adjacent to habitation/roads, should be properly fenced by the User Agency.
 - c. Safety zone shall be maintained as green belt around mining lease and to ensure dense canopy in the area, regeneration shall be taken up in this area by the user agency at project cost under the supervision of the State Forest Department; and
 - d. The State Government and the user agency shall ensure that safety zone is maintained as per the prescribed norms.

- xii. Following activities, as per approved plan/schemes, shall be undertaken in the lease area by the User Agency under the supervision of the State Forest Department. Approved scheme/plan shall be submitted to the Ministry along with compliance of Stage-I approval
 - a. Mitigative measures to minimize soil erosion and choking of stream shall be implemented within a period of three year with effect from the issue of Stage-II clearance in accordance with the plan as submitted along with the compliance report in consultation with the State Forest Department.
 - b. Planting of adequate drought hardy plant species and sowing of seeds, in the appropriate area within the mining lease to arrest soil erosion in accordance with the approved scheme.
 - c. Stabilize the overburden dumps by appropriate grading/benching, in accordance with the approved scheme, so as to ensure that angles of repose at any given place is less than 28°; and
 - d. No damage shall be caused to the top-soil and the user agency will follow the top soil management plan.
- xiii. The validity of approval granted under the Adhiniyam shall be for a period co-terminus with the validity of the mining lease proposed to be granted under the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, as amended from time to time or Rules framed there under, or for such period as may be specified by the Central Government.
- xiv. The User Agency either himself or through the State Forest Department shall undertake gap planting and soil and moisture conservation activities to restock and rejuvenate the degraded open forests (having crown density less than 0.40), if any, located within the periphery of 100 m from outer perimeter of the mining lease as per approved plan for plantation and SMC activities in consultation with the State Forest Department.
- xv. The User Agency shall comply with the Hon'ble Supreme Court order on re-grassing, and re-grass the mining area and any other areas which may have been disturbed due to mining to restore them to a condition which is fit for growth of fodder, flora, fauna, etc. in a timely manner.
- xvi. Adequate care shall be taken to check any rolling of overburden/dumps beyond the designated area and to check soil erosion caused due to mining activities.
- xvii. The User Agency shall undertake de-silting of the village tanks and other water bodies located within five km from the mine lease boundary so as to mitigate the impact of siltation of such tanks/water bodies, whenever required.
- xviii. The User Agency will undertake comprehensive soil conservation measures at the project cost in consultation with the State Forest Department. A scheme of the same shall be submitted to the Regional Office.
- xix. Trees should be felled in phased manner as per the requirement in the approved Plan with prior permission of concerned Divisional Forest Officer (DFO).
- xx. The cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department.
- xxi. The User Agency shall explore the possibility of translocation of maximum number of trees identified to be felled and shall ensure that any tree felling

- shall be done only when it is unavoidable and that too under strict supervision of the State Forest Department.
- xxii. The State Government shall upload KML files of the polygons of forest area under diversion and non forest land identified and accepted for raising compensatory afforestation, in the E-Green watch portal with all the requisite details before handing over the land to the User Agency.
 - xxiii. The User Agency shall obtain the Environment Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if required.
 - xxiv. No labour camp shall be established on the forest land and no work shall be allowed after sunset.
 - xxv. The User Agency shall provide fuels preferably alternate fuels to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas.
 - xxvi. No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
 - xxvii. The boundary of the diverted forest land, mining lease and safety zone, as applicable, shall be demarcated on ground at the project cost, by erecting four feet high reinforced cement concrete pillars, each inscribed with its serial number, distance from pillar to pillar and GPS coordinates.
 - xxviii. The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government and the forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal except the change in land use allowed on the forest land vide Ministry's guideline dated 26.12.2024.
 - xxix. The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agency, department or person without prior approval of the Central Government.
 - xxx. No damage to the flora, fauna or the environment of the adjoining area shall be caused; Adequate measures to ensure no damage to the adjoining areas should be taken by the User Agency at the project cost.
 - xxxi. The concerned Divisional Forest Officer, will monitor and take necessary mitigative measures to ensure that there is no adverse impact on the forests in the surrounding area.
 - xxxii. The User Agency shall submit the annual self compliance report in respect of the above stated conditions to the State Government, concerned Regional Office and to this Ministry by the end of March every year regularly.
 - xxxiii. Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife shall be carried with by the State Government and user agency.
 - xxxiv. The User Agency shall comply all the provisions of all Acts, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Hon'ble Court Order (s) and NGT Order (s) pertaining to this project, if any, for the time being in force, as applicable to the project.
 - xxxv. Violation of any of these conditions will amount violation of Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhinyam, 1980 and action would be taken as prescribed in para 1.16 of Chapter 1 of the consolidated guidelines and clarifications issued under Van (Sanrakshan Samvardhan) Adhinyam, 1980 and Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Rules, 2023 as issued by this

Ministry's letter No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 29.12.2023.

- xxxvi. The State Government shall complete settlement of rights, in terms of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006, if any, on the forest land to be diverted and submit the documentary evidence as prescribed by this Ministry in its letter No. 11-9/1998-FC (pt.) dated 03.08.2009, in support thereof.
- xxxvii. The State Government after receiving the 'Final Approval' of the Central Government under subsection (1) of Section 2 of the Adhiniyam, and after fulfillment and compliance of the provisions of the all other acts and rules made thereunder, as applicable including ensuring of settlement of rights under the Scheduled Tribes or Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act. 2006 (2 of 2007), shall issue order for diversion.
