

Provide comprehensive details of the likely impact of the current proposal in terms of sections 29 and/or section 35(6) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972

Under section 29 of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972

Clause:- No person shall destroy, exploit or remove any wild life including forest produce from a sanctuary or destroy or damage or divert the habitat of any wild animal by any act whatsoever or divert, stop or enhance the flow of water into or outside the sanctuary, except under and in accordance with a permit granted by the Chief Wild Life Warden, and no such permit shall be granted unless the State Government being satisfied in consultation with the Board that such removal of wild life from the sanctuary or the change in the flow of water into or outside the sanctuary is necessary for the improvement and better management of wild life therein, authorizes the issue of such permit: Provided that where the forest produce is removed from a sanctuary the same may be used for meeting the personal bona fide needs of the people living in and around the sanctuary and shall not be used for any commercial purpose.


Likely impact: This project is related with constructing Atal Progress Way (four/six lane road) with two over bridges on Chambal River in National Chambal Sanctuary. During construction of this progress way total 39 trees of average girth size 58 cm. And species namely of acacia, Azadirachta indica, mangifera indica and Eucalyptus are to be removed. During construction Including the above impact some habitats of wild animal may be affected under this project. During this project there is no diversion, stop or enhancement of the flow of water into or outside the sanctuary is needed. Hence Due to this project only some above described trees will be affected and a little impact on habitat of any wild animal of National wild life Sanctuary may be occurred.

Under Section 35(6) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act 1972

No person shall destroy, exploit or remove any Wild Life including forest produce from a National Park or destroy or damage or divert the habitat of any wild animal by any act whatsoever or divert, stop or enhance the flow of water into or outside the National Park, except under and in accordance with a permit granted by the Chief Wild Life Warders, and no such permit shall be granted unless the State Government being satisfied in consultation with the National Board that such removal of wild life from the National Park or the change in the flow of water into or outside the National Park is necessary for the improvement and better management of wild life therein authorizes the issue of such permit Provided that where the forest produce is removed from a National Park, the same may be used for meeting the personal bona fide needs of the people living in and around the National Park and shall not be used for any commercial purpose
