Sub: EDS regarding Malhar to Marhoon PGMSY Road

Sir,

On the subject cited above, the undersigned wants to draw to your kind attention to the fact that certain deficiencies have been noticed in respect of the Essential Documents submitted by you for the forest clearance of PMGSY road Malhar to Marhoon. Therefore, you are requested to provide the following Essential Documents after making necessary corrections in the documents already submitted to this office enabling the undersigned to proceed further in the matter:

1. No mention of '**Legend**' in the Toposheet uploaded on PARIVESH. Take corrective action and furnish the corrected hard copies.
2. Road alignment on Toposheet is incongruent with the alignment provided in the GPS map. Take corrective action.
3. Muck disposal plan is still incomplete as the said Muck Disposal Plan does not mention in quantitative terms, the quantity of muck to be used in filling sections and the balance amount to be disposed at various muck dumping sites. There is also no mention of the muck retention structures proposed for retention and compaction of muck at various sites (Site Specific Plan).
4. The uploaded GPS map (KML File) does not depict the existing road as per the Legend mentioned in the hard copies. Take corrective action and furnish hard copies.
5. Cost Benefit Analysis:
 - i. **Point 4:** Remarks do not give the details of details asked in the corresponding parameters. Please give details as asked.
 - ii. **Point 6:** From the GPS map, there appears to be loss to oustees as lot of private lands are coming under the road alignment. The loss needs to be quantified as lot of private land are involved in the road alignment. Therefore, the loss to oustees like agricultural income etc. be shown.
6. **Benefit Analysis sheet:**
 - i. **Point 1:** There is no mention of the increase in productivity to the tune of ₹ 276.67 Lakhs in the DPR. The detail must be furnished in this regard.
 - ii. **Point 5:** Economic benefit due to corresponding Afforestation have not been quantified in clear terms
