With reference to the above mentioned subject the Government of India has fulfillment of 16 issues in this proposal. The user agency has submitted the compliance report by their reference letter no. 4. According to the following compliance report are being submitted for necessary action.

		Under Renovation of Asolamendha Project, it is proposed to raise the height of dam by 2.7 m. to increase the storage capacity of Dam. Further it is also proposed to feed the Dam by Feerer Canal off taking from Right Bank Canal of Gosikhurd Project.
		Since the Dam is to fed from source other than Rain water, Dam will be full for major period of time and therefore the trees in the submergence area will be under water. As per CCF Part-III suggestions Total trees to be cut are 117224, out of which 7501 trees are along the canal.
		It is further mentioned in Part-III of CCF, Chandrapur, that since the Forest Proposal was prepared in the year 2018-19 i.e. 3 to 4 years back, the re-marking of trees is to be done for all the trees to be cut.
