Reserved Forest under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 in favour of Executive Engineer, Public Works Division, Allapalli for construction of RRP-2 additional works of roads and Bridges in Korepalli-Kavtharam-Kapwancha-Assa-Modumadagu road with 1 minor bridge VR 36 & 128 km, Tal. 2.00 The proposal has been initiated by the Executive Engineer, Public Works Division 1, Gadchiroli for seeking approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The User Agency has certified that the forest land admeasuring 13.800 ha is the minimum demand for the project. The existing road has very poor geometry, congestion leading to traffic jams. Therefore the User Agency has decided to undertake improvement and maintenance of RRP-2 additional works of

roads and Bridges in Korepalli-Kavtharam-Kapwancha-Assa-Modumadagu road with 1 minor bridge VR 36 & 128 km, Tal. Sironcha, Dist. Gadchiroli. Because of the project, over all road safety situation will be improved. There will be decrease in road traffic accidents immediately after implementation of the project. Summarily, widening of the project road will have following benefits.

- The proposed project is rehabilitation and up-gradation of existing two lane alignment to four lane configuration.
- There is no suitable alternatives non-forest land to construct the road as the proposed rehabilitation is along the existing road.
- Earthwork cutting and banking is minimum.
- Minimum numbers of trees are affected.
- Road gradients are suitable for traffic.

The site inspection report of the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sironcha Forest Division, Sironcha is enclosed on page no.69 to 67

4.00 The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sironcha Forest Division, Sironcha has certified that:-

4.1 no suitable alternate land is available and the forest land required is minimum.

4.2 the area belongs to Eco-value class-III having density is 0.8 (Dense Forest).

4.3 there are 2847 trees of various species and trees is involved in implementation of the Project. The Girth wise break up is as under:-

4.4 the area involved in the project does not form part of any existing National Park, Wildlife Sanctuary, Nature Reserve etc.

4.5 proposed project is not likely to affect any monumental site of cultural, historical, religious, archeological or recreational importance.

4.6 there is no violation of Forest (Conservation) Act 1980.

4.7 proposed project is 7.00 kms from the boundary of the Pranhita Wild Sanctuary and 2.5 kms Kolamarka Conservation Reserve

4.8 the area involved in the project is part of the Tiger Corridor as per TCP and TATR. However, it is part of the Tiger Corridor as per TCP and TATR. In this regard the CWLW vide office note dated 27/05/2021 has offered his comments and the same are reproduced as under-

In this regard PCCF (HoFF) on 31/05/2021 has submitted to the User Agency has submitted the proposal for prior approval of the National Board of Wildlife and the same has been submitted by the Conservator of Forests (T) Gadchiroli to Additional Principal Chief Conservator (Wildlife) East, Nagpur for onward submission to Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) Maharashtra State Nagpur

4.9 As per clause 2.5 of the Handbook under the FCA, 1980. The Special provisions for CA for certain categories of projects is as under:-

- (i) CA shall be raised and maintained at the cost of the user agency on degraded forest land twice in extent of the forest area diverted in the cases of:
- (g) Construction of link roads, small water works, minor irrigation works, school building, dispensaries, hospital, tiny rural industrial sheds of the Government or any other similar work excluding mining and encroachment cases, which directly benefit the people of the area in hill districts and in other districts having forest area exceeding 50% of the total geographical area, provided diversion of forest area does not exceed 20 hectares..

4.9 In the instant case the construction of the aforesaid link road in less than 20 ha. and the Gadchiroli District forest area exceeding 50% of the total geographical area. Therefore, the User Agency shall have to defray the cost for compensatory afforestation over double 27.600 ha degraded forest land including 10 years maintenance.

4.1 and proposed Compensatory Afforestation over 28.00 ha. degraded Forest land (i) 10 ha. in Compartment No.10,12, in Village Shekapur Zopadi, Range Wardha, Dist. Wardha (ii) 8.00 ha. in Compt No.87, Village Gadegaon, Range Wardha, Dist. Wardha. (iii) 5.00 ha. in Compt No. 12 of Village Shivani, Range Wardha, Dist. Wardha (iv) area 5.00 ha. in Village Warpindkepar Range Bapera it is contiguous, suitable for afforestation and management purpose and it is free from encroachment and an encumbrances

5.00 The User Agency has submitted an undertaking that:-

- 5.1 to defray the cost of compensatory afforestation.
- 5.2 to defray the cost of Net Present Value of the forest land proposed under diversion.
- 5.3 Government of India vide letter No.11-43/2013-FC, dt.3/12/2018 has issued guidelines regarding compliance of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forests Right) Act, 2006. As per these guidelines:-

'Accordingly, it is clarified that within the time period stipulated for compliance of Stage I condition, Deputy Commissioner shall complete the process of compliance of FRA (including forwarding its findings to be concerned CF), hence for the purpose of the MoEF & CC, as per the provisions under the Forest (Conservation) amendment rules, 2016 the compliance under FRA is not required for consideration of in-principle approval. This has to be furnished by the State Government for consideration of the proposal by the Ministry for final approval'.

Hence, the user agency has given an undertaking regarding the compliance under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act,

2006 has been applied and is under process and shall be submitted before in-principle approval.

- 5.5 Copy of the technical approval accorded by the Executive Engineer, Public Works Division, Allapalli vide letter dt.24/12/2020.
- 7.00 The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sironcha Forest Division and the Chief Conservator of Forest (T), Gadchiroli have recommended the proposal for diversion of 13.800 ha. of forest land.
- 8.00 **In view of this, the proposal is recommended for approval under the section -2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 subject to the following conditions: –**
- 7.1 The legal status of the forest land required will remain unchanged.
- 7.2 **Compensatory Afforestation :-**
Compensatory afforestation shall be taken up by the Forest Department over 28.00 ha. degraded Forest land (i) 10 ha. in Compartment No.10,12, in Village Shekapur Zopadi, Range Wardha, Dist. Wardha (ii) 8.00 ha. in Compt No.87, Village Gadegaon, Range Wardha, Dist. Wardha. (iii) 5.00 ha. in Compt No. 12 of Village Shivani, Range Wardha, Dist. Wardha (iv) area 5.00 ha. in Village Warpindkepar Range Bapera at the cost of the user agency. As far as possible, a mixture of local indigenous species shall be planted and monoculture of any species may be avoided. The area shall be fenced with Chain link fence at the cost of User Agency.
- 7.3 The cost of compensatory afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.
- 7.4 **NPV:-**
- a) The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 13.800 ha. forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 30/10/2002, 01/08/2003, 28/03/2008, 24/04/2008 and 09/05/2008 in IA No.566 in WP (C) No.202/1995 and as per the guidelines issued by the Ministry vide letters No.5-1/1998-FC (Pt.II), dated 18/09/2003 as well as letter No.5-2/2006-FC, dated 03/10/2006 and 5-3/2007-FC, dated 05/02/2009 in this regard.
- b) Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after finalization of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on receipt of the report from the Expert Committee, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect.

- 7.5 User Agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department and the cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department.
 - 7.6 All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal (<http://parivesh.nic.in/>)
 - 7.7 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector before Stage-II approval.
 - 7.8 User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
 - 7.9 Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/Forest Areas.
 - 7.10 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
 - 7.11 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government.
 - 7.12 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.
 - 7.13 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
 - 7.14 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
 - 7.15 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
 - 7.16 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.
 - 7.17 It Shall mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals
 - (a) The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mt and Height 3.00 mt.
 - (b) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.
 - (c) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
 - (d) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km
 - 7.18 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
 - 7.19 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.
 - 7.20 As the proposed is part of the Tiger Corridor as per TCP and TATR, therefore the project proponent will seek prior clearance from the Standing Committee of National Board for Wildlife. The User Agency shall bear the cost of implementation of any mitigation or conservation plan as suggested by the Chief Wildlife Warden or the Standing Committee of National Board for Wildlife.



Sironcha, Dist. Gadchiroli in the State of Maharashtra, under section 2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

3.00 The proposal has been initiated by the Executive Engineer, Public Works Division 1, Gadchiroli for seeking approval under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The User Agency has certified that the forest land admeasuring 13.800 ha is the minimum demand for the project. The existing road has very poor geometry, congestion leading to traffic jams. Therefore the User Agency has decided to undertake improvement and maintenance of RRP-2 additional works of roads and Bridges in Korepalli-Kavtharam-Kapwancha-Assa-Modumadagu road with 1 minor bridge VR 36 & 128 km, Tal. Sironcha, Dist. Gadchiroli. Because of the project, over all road safety situation will be improved. There will be decrease in road traffic accidents immediately

after implementation of the project. Summarily, widening of the project road will have following benefits.

- a) The proposed project is rehabilitation and up-gradation of existing two lane alignment to four lane configuration.
- b) There is no suitable alternatives non-forest land to construct the road as the proposed rehabilitation is along the existing road.
- c) Earthwork cutting and banking is minimum.
- d) Minimum numbers of trees are affected.
- e) Road gradients are suitable for traffic.

4.00 The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Sironcha Forest Division, Sironcha has certified that:-

- 4.4 the area involved in the project does not form part of any existing National Park, Wildlife Sanctuary, Nature Reserve etc.
- 4.5 proposed project is not likely to affect any monumental site of cultural, historical, religious, archeological or recreational importance.
- 4.6 there is no violation of Forest (Conservation) Act 1980.
- 4.7 proposed project is 7.00 kms from the boundary of the Pranhita Wild Sanctuary and 2.5 kms Kolamarka Conservation Reserve

4.9 As per clause 2.5 of the Handbook under the FCA, 1980. The Special provisions for CA for certain categories of projects is as under:-

(i) CA shall be raised and maintained at the cost of the user agency on degraded forest land twice in extent of the forest area diverted in the cases of:

(g) Construction of link roads, small water works, minor irrigation works, school building, dispensaries, hospital, tiny rural industrial sheds of the Government or any other similar work excluding mining and encroachment cases, which directly benefit the people of the area in hill districts and in other districts having forest area exceeding 50% of the total geographical area, provided diversion of forest area does not exceed 20 hectares..

4.9 In the instant case the construction of the aforesaid link road in less than 20 ha. and the Gadchiroli District forest area exceeding 50% of the total geographical area. Therefore, the User Agency shall have to defray the cost for compensatory afforestation over double 27.600 ha degraded forest land including 10 years maintenance.

5.00 **The User Agency has submitted an undertaking that:-**

5.1 to defray the cost of compensatory afforestation.

5.2 to defray the cost of Net Present Value of the forest land proposed under diversion.

5.3 Government of India vide letter No.11-43/2013-FC, dt.3/12/2018 has issued guidelines regarding compliance of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forests Right) Act, 2006. As per these guidelines:-

'Accordingly, it is clarified that within the time period stipulated for compliance of Stage I condition, Deputy Commissioner shall complete the process of compliance of FRA (including forwarding its findings to be concerned CF), hence for the purpose of the MoEF & CC, as per the provisions under the Forest (Conservation) amendment rules, 2016 the compliance under FRA is not required for consideration of in-principle approval. This has to be furnished by the State Government for consideration of the proposal by the Ministry for final approval'.


Hence, the user agency has given an undertaking regarding the compliance under the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 has been applied and is under process and shall be submitted before in-principle approval.

- 8.00 **In view of this, the proposal is recommended for approval under the section -2 (ii) of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 subject to the following conditions: –**
- 7.1 The legal status of the forest land required will remain unchanged.
- 7.2 **Compensatory Afforestation :-**
Compensatory afforestation shall be taken up by the Forest Department over 28.00 ha. degraded Forest land (i) 10 ha. in Compartment No.10,12, in Village Shekapur Zopadi, Range Wardha, Dist. Wardha (ii) 8.00 ha. in Compt No.87, Village Gadegaon, Range Wardha, Dist. Wardha. (iii) 5.00 ha. in Compt No. 12 of Village Shivani, Range Wardha, Dist. Wardha (iv) area 5.00 ha. in Village Warpindkepar Range Bapera at the cost of the user agency. As far as possible, a mixture of local indigenous species shall be planted and monoculture of any species may be avoided. The area shall be fenced with Chain link fence at the cost of User Agency.
- 7.3 The cost of compensatory afforestation at the prevailing wage rates as per compensatory afforestation scheme and the cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars if required on the CA land shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the project authority. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years.
- 7.4 **NPV:-**
- a) The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) for the 13.800 ha. forest area to be diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 30/10/2002, 01/08/2003, 28/03/2008, 24/04/2008 and 09/05/2008 in IA No.566 in WP (C) No.202/1995 and as per the guidelines issued by the Ministry vide letters No.5-1/1998-FC (Pt.II), dated 18/09/2003 as well as letter No.5-2/2006-FC, dated 03/10/2006 and 5-3/2007-FC, dated 05/02/2009 in this regard.
- b) Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after finalization of the same by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on receipt of the report from the Expert Committee, shall be charged by the State Government from the User Agency. The User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to this effect.

- 7.5 User Agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department and the cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department.
- 7.6 All the funds received from the user agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited to CAMPA fund only through e-portal (<http://parivesh.nic.in/>)
- 7.7 The complete compliance of the FRA, 2006 shall be ensured by way of prescribed certificate from the concerned District Collector before Stage-II approval.
- 7.8 User Agency shall raise strip plantation on both sides and central verge of the road as per the IRC norms.
- 7.9 Speed regulating signage will be erected along the road at regular intervals in the Protected Areas/Forest Areas.
- 7.10 The user agency shall provide suitable under/over pass in Protected Area/ Forest Area as per recommendation of CWLW/NBWL/FAC/REC.
- 7.11 The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without prior approval of Central Government.
- 7.12 No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.
- 7.13 Sufficient firewood, preferably the alternate fuel, shall be provided by the User Agency to the labourer after purchasing the same from the State Forest Department or the Forest Development Corporation or any other legal source of alternate fuel.
- 7.14 The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost, as per the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- 7.15 No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work.
- 7.16 The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the project proposal.
- 7.17 It Shall mandatory to provide underpass for safe crossing of wild animals
 - (a) The underpass shall have a minimum size of width 4.00 mt and Height 3.00 mt.
 - (b) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence, then no need to construct new underpass subject to existing structure nearly complying above mentioned dimensions, as suggested in (a) above.
 - (c) Wherever natural cross drainage works are in existence but as per engineering requirement, it is required to reconstruct then that structure shall comply with the minimum dimensions as suggested in (a) above.
 - (d) Interval between such underpasses shall not be more than 2.00 km
- 7.18 The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agencies, department or person without prior approval of Government of India.
- 7.19 Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guidelines F.No.11-42/2017-FC, dated 29/01/2018.
- 7.20 As the proposed is part of the Tiger Corridor as per TCP and TATR, therefore the project proponent will seek prior clearance from the Standing Committee of National Board for

Wildlife. The User Agency shall bear the cost of implementation of any mitigation or conservation plan as suggested by the Chief Wildlife Warden or the Standing Committee of National Board for Wildlife.

- 7.21 Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife.
- 7.22 The compliance report shall be uploaded on e-portal (<https://parivesh.nic.in/>)
- 7.23 The said proposal is in area classified as LWE area in Maharashtra & proposal would benefited in ^{increasing communication} ~~increasing communication~~





Please find enclosed a copy of D. O No. no. 43012-15-2018-CPAM dated 26.10.2018 as received from Secretary, Ministry of Coal, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi intimating that the Western Coalfield Limited informed that the proposal of Stage-I (In-Principle) approval for diversion of Forest Land under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for Coal Mining Projects in State Of Maharashtra are stalled at various levels of State Forest Department for want of certificate in compliance to circular issued by Govt. of Maharashtra, Department of Revenue & Forests dtd. 23.02.2016 directing not to forwarding the proposals for Stage-I FC approval without necessary compliance of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006, whereas, the Forest (Conservation) Amendment Rules, 2016 with regard to FRA states that:

"(e) the District Collector shall.

- (i) complete the process of recognition and vesting of forest rights in accordance with the provisions of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 (2 of 2007) for the entire forest land indicated in the proposal;*
- (ii) obtain consent of each Gram Sabha having jurisdiction over the whole or a part of the forest land indicated in the proposal for the diversion of such forest land and compensatory and ameliorative measures, if any, having understood the purposes and details of diversion, wherever required; and*
- (iii) forward his findings in this regard to the Conservator of Forests;*

(f) the entire process referred to in clause (e) shall be completed by the District Collector within the time period stipulated in these rules for grant of in-principle approval under the Act to the proposal;

Accordingly, it is clarified that within the time period stipulated for compliance of stage-I condition, Deputy Commissioner shall complete the process of compliance of FRA (including forwarding its findings to the concerned CE) hence for the purpose of the MoEF&CC, as per the provision under Forest (Conservation) amendment rules, 2016 the compliance under FRA is not required for consideration of in-principle approval. This has to be furnished by the state Govt. for consideration of the proposal by the ministry for final approval.

In view of above, the State Govt. of Maharashtra is requested to adhere the provisions contained in Forest (Conservation) Amendment Rules, 2016 for FRA purpose while forwarding the proposal for seeking prior approval under Section 2 of Forest(Conservation) Act, 1980 to this Ministry for consideration.
