Proposal for diversion of 345.189 ha of forest land involved in the mining lease area over 366.311 ha of Khandbandh Iron Ore Mines of M/s OMC Ltd in Keonjhar district, Odisha, has been received online from the Addl. Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Forest Diversion and Nodal Officer, FC Act. O/o the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Odisha, Bhubaneswar vide No. FP/OR/MIN/8707/2014, State Sl. No. OR-012/2017 on dated 20.03.2017. The submitted proposal, over 345.189 ha forest land including 6.77 ha forest land located within safety zone all along the inner side of the ML boundary of the mining lease, in 5 sets is sent herewith for approval under section-2(ii) of Forest Conservation Act, 1980 (Amended) after due scrutinization in compliance with the guideline F No. 8-78/1996-FC (pt.) dt.10.03.2015 read with F No. 8-78/1996-FC(pt.) dt.09.03.2016 of MoEF&CC, Govt. of India.

A. Brief description of the Project Proposal

A1 - Brief description of the Project

The mining lease of Khandbandh Iron ore mine was granted over 366.311 ha vide letter No. III (A) II-9/63- 11708, dated 22.11.1963 of Govt. of Odisha Mining & Geology Department. The said Mining lease was executed on dated 30.11.1963 for a period of 30 years with effect from 30.11.1963 to 29.11.1993 over an area of 366.311 ha. The first RML was applied on 09.11.1992 one year prior to expiry of the original mining lease period over 366.311 ha which comprises 98.221 ha Revenue Forest, 207.309 ha DLC Forest, 60.781 ha non-forest land. The second RML was applied on 06.11.2012 over the said area from extension of ML period 30.11.2013 to 29.11.2033.

The Mining Lease of Khandbandh Iron Ore Mines of M/s OMC Ltd lies between longitude E 85° 23'12.66888" – 85° 24' 45.86016" and latitude N 21° 55' 40.27579" – 21^0 57' 29.90066" in Survey of India topo sheet no. F 45 N 5. The said mining lease over 366.311 ha involves 97.217 ha Village Forest, 209.973 ha DLC forest land and 37.999 ha Non-forest land recorded as Forest as on 25.10.1980. The schedule area of Revenue Forest plots and DLC Forest plots involved in the mining lease has been arrived following DGPS survey of the mining lease at 97.217 ha as per RoR against the schedule area over 98.221 ha and at 209.973 ha as per RoR against the schedule area over 207.309 ha. The discrepancies in Revenue Forest and DLC Forest due to DGPS survey. The instant diversion proposal has been submitted over 345.189 ha (Revenue forest-97.217 ha, DLC Forest209.973 ha and 37.999 ha Non- Forest land recorded as Forest as on 25.10.1980) including safety zone area over 6.77 ha Forest land for diversion under Section-2 (ii) of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The certified status of the non-forest land, involved in the mining lease, depicts that 37.999 ha non-forest land in village Khandbandh, Guruda & Jaroli is Forest as on 25.10.1980. The certificate furnished by the Tahasildar, Barbil in this regard is enclosed as **Annexure- XI.** The total broken up land, involved in the mining lease, is 129.095 ha.

The instant diversion proposal has been submitted over 345.189 ha forest land, 97.217 ha Revenue Forest, 209.973 ha DLC Forest and 37.999 ha Non-forest land recorded as Forest as on 25th October 1980, for approval under Section 2(ii) of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

The Mining Lease contains total mineable reserve of 22.574 million tonnes of Iron Ore. The annual production capacity is 1.00 million tonnes iron ore. This project will generate direct and indirect employment for more than 100 and 500 local tribal people respectively.

A.2. Physiography and Geological formation

Khandbandh Iron Ore mines of M/s OMC Ltd, located within longitude E 85^o 23'12.66888" – 85^o 24' 45.86016" and latitude N 21^o 55' 40.27579" – 21^o 57' 29.90066" in Survey of India topo sheet no. F 45 N 5, consists of Revenue Forest, DLC Forest land and Non-Forest land recorded as Forest as on 25.10.1980. This site falls under the physiographic-Joda Barbil plateau extending from Chamakpur to the boarder of Singhbhum of Jharkhand in north and boarder of Bonai in the west. This region is an extension southwards of Singhbhum rocks. This group of rocks comprising Trap, Tuffites, Shale, Quartzite, Phyllite, Banded Haematite Jasper and Banded Haematite Quartzite form high hill ranges with narrow deep valley. This region is characterised by massive deposit of iron and manganese are associated with B.H.J. and shales. The iron ores precipitates are in the form of oxide, carbonates, silicates and sulphides. The most characteristics feature of the iron ore i.e haematite is it's availability in the form of massive beds, pockets and large lensoid soil bodies. Hard massive, Laminated, Lateritoid & Blue dust are the major form of ore located in this physiographic zone. The mineable reserve of Iron ore established so far is 22.574 Million Ton of + 45 % Fe grade.

A.3. Floristic- Faunal Composition

The geological formation of this area is quite suitable for growth of Sal. Sal constitutes around 70 to 75% of the top canopy. The middle storey is un-conspicuous. The quality of Sal varies from all India Quality II to IV. Quality II sal is mainly confined to the valleys while Q III occurs on the hill slopes of moderate gradient. Q IV sal mainly confined in the ridges. Q I sal is completely absent.

The principal associates of Sal includes Terminalia alata, Lagerstroemia perviflora, Anogeissus latifolia, Terminalia belerica, Syzygium cumini, Mangifera indica, Schleichera oleosa. Adina cordifolia, Pterocarpus marsupium, Bombax ceiba, Bridelia retusa, Madhuca indica. The middle story is represented by Syzygium cumini, Ougeinia ougenensis, Careya arborea, Treama orientalis, Emblica officinalis, Cassia fistula etc. The shrubs and undergrowth are characterized by Indigofera pulchella, Ardisia solenacea, Flemingia chhapar, Helicteres ixora and Clerodendron viscosum etc. The prevailing climbers include Bauhinia vahlii, Combretum decandrum and Beutia parviflora. The grasses over the forest floor include Chrysopogon aciculatus, Imperata cylindrica, Dicanthium carricosum, Cynodon dactylon etc.

The canopy density of the prevailing forest growth in the adjacent Baitarani Reserved Forest varies from 0.2 to 0.8. The prevalence of pole crop to middle aged sal crop

in this area indicates the shifting cultivation in the past and the crop can therefore be considered to be secondary origin. But the secondary moist deciduous forest replacing primary forest of the same type is not differentiated as almost all the primary forests have been practically influenced by human interference. The prevailing forest growth & structure of the forest crop in the proposed forest land is categorised as 3C/C2e(iii) Moist Peninsular Valley Sal mainly "dense jungle mainly Sal" with canopy density 0.5.

Movement of wild elephants is often witnessed in Baitarani Reserved Forest and adjoining Forest land. The applied site falls under elephant habitat zone- 2 as mentioned by ORSAC, Bhubaneswar.

B.3 Tree Enumeration.

There are 8639 nos. of sound, 12843 Nos. of unsound trees in the virgin forest land over 216.094 ha and 2241 nos. of sound, 9530 Nos. of unsound trees in the broken up forest land over 129.095 ha enumerated over 345.189 ha forest land involved in the Mining Lease in the instant proposal. The species wise and diameter class wise abstract of enumerated trees in respect of virgin and broken up land in separate sheets is enclosed as Annexure- XXXVII.

B.4 Cost benefit analysis.

The Cost Benefit analysis has been worked out as per the guide lines of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and enclosed in the proposal as Annexure- XV(B). The Cost Benefit ratio is 1:10.36.

B.5 Re-settlement and Rehabilitation.

The project does not involve displacement of any human habitation. Therefore, Re-settlement and Rehabilitation plan is not insisted upon.

B.6. Safety Zone

The mining lease granted over 366.311 ha involves 97.217 ha Revenue Forest, 209.973 ha DLC Forest land and 37.999 ha Non-Forest Land recorded as Forest as on 25.10.1980. The total Non-Forest land involved in the mining lease is 21.122 ha. The total forest land including non-forest land recorded as Forest as on 25.10.1980 located in the safety zone 7.5 mtr strip all along the inner side of the M.L. Boundary of the mining lease is 6.77 ha. The details of Forest and Non-Forest land located in the safety zone of the mining lease, in respect of the submitted diversion proposal, is furnished hereunder-
