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### Checklist for site inspection by DFO/CF/CCF

At Present the inspection Report submitted by the DCF level is very sketchy and does not convey much to higher officers going for verification of the facts in the field, monitoring of the project on a later date as mandated in the guidelines. This is possible only when exhaustive check is carried out at the DCF/DFO level. This would help the authorities to verify the facts to arrive at appropriate decisions.
