We have heard counsel for the parties.

2. The learned Advocate General, on instructions, submits that the State is more than keen to find out solution to the impending problem. The State is not only willing to pay compensatory costs, as may be determined by the Appropriate Authority, but is, on its own, willing to provide more infrastructure and facilities to strengthen the

environmental cause in the concerned region. Those logistics can be worked out only after the decision of the Appropriate Authority with regard to the 841 road projects in question.

- 3. The learned Assistant Solicitor General of India submits that the MoEF, Government of India, has no objection to examine the proposal initiated by the State Government, but the officials of the said Ministry are finding difficulty in working out the final arrangement and, more particularly, because of the directions given by the learned Single Judge of this Court in order, dated 28th August, 2009, in COPC No. 56 of 2009.
- 4. Keeping in mind this grievance of the respondent-Authorities, we thought it appropriate to direct the Registry to circulate the papers concerning COPC No. 56 of 2009. Although, the order has not been challenged by any Authority or party to the proceedings, in the peculiar facts of the present case, it has become essential to consider whether the direction contained in the said order should be kept in abeyance or otherwise.
- 5. In our considered opinion, if the direction contained in COPC No. 56 of 2009 is required to be complied by the concerned Authority and, in particular, MoEF, it will not be possible for the MoEF to work on the proposal to be submitted by the State Government, which, as observed in our previous order, is in larger public interest. The issue regarding action to be taken against the erring officials of the concerned departments and Ministry can always be redressed at the appropriate stage, but consideration of the proposal submitted by

regarding ratification of the action of the State Government regarding construction of 841 road projects across the State of Himachal Pradesh will have to be resolved in the first place in conformity with the requirement of law, which the State Government as well as the MoEF has assured the Court to consider the same in right earnest.

6. In these peculiar facts, we are inclined to hold that it is but appropriate that the direction given in COPC No. 56 of 2009, in order dated 28th August, 2009, should be kept in abeyance to enable the concerned departments to take a final decision on the proposal submitted by the State Government.

Counsel appearing for the department as well as the State Government have submitted that the Authorities would report about the possibility and feasibility of granting approval or otherwise on the proposal of the State before the next date of hearing, which can be scheduled after three weeks. In the circumstances, hearing of these matters is deferred till 5th September, 2013, to enable the MoEF, Government of India and the State Government to work out a holistic plan for not only restoration of the environment, besides quantifying the compensatory costs to be paid by the State Government. That will have to be in conformity with the provisions of law and uninfluenced by the observations in the order dated 28th August, 2009 in COPC No. 56 of 2009, referred to above.

8. The learned Advocate General assures the Court that in

the joint meeting to be held between the officials of the concerned departments and Authorities, broad guidelines will be worked out on the basis of which the plan can be taken forward. We place this submission on record. The joint meeting to be convened on 19th August, 2013, in the office of Conservator of Forests (Central), Government of India, Chandigarh, at 11-90 a.m.

Rajiv Sharma, Judge.

The present petition has been preferred for initiating action against respondents No. 1 to 3 for the violation of the directions issued by this Court in CWP No. 1358/2001.

The precise case of the petitioner is that respondents No.1 to 3 are instrumental in construction of road in Sharoli Jungle without seeking the mandatory permission under the provisions of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and also for felling of trees despite the directions issued by this Court on 29.5.2007 whereby green felling was prohibited in the entire State of Himachal Pradesh. Respondent No.1 has filed the reply. He has denied his involvement in illicit felling of trees in Sharoli Jundge (Mandal Beat). Respondent No.2 has also filed reply to the petition. He has admitted in his reply that certain people of surrounding villages, including respondent No.1 started construction of a road in Mandal Beat and as many as 29 kail saplings were damaged. Accordingly, the damage report was prepared and that a sum of Rs. 23,925/- was recovered towards damages. Accordingly, the JCB, which was in possession of the Forest Department, was released after the receipt of fine and compensation. Respondent No.3 also filed reply. According to him, the tenders were floated on 10.4.2008 for the work in question i.e. C/O link road from Bakan Nallah to village Kohali. These were to be opened on 25.5.2008. However, the same stood cancelled due to technical reasons on 17.5.2008. The petitioner has also filed supplementary affidavit whereby he has given the details of five link roads, which were constructed without the permission under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The 'no objection certificates' as per the contents of the supplementary affidavit had been issued by the Range Forest Officer, Sarswati Nagar for construction of these roads. The 'no objection certificates' are marked as Annexures PC-1 to PC-5. The petitioner has also placed on record the photographs reflecting the damage caused to the forest wealth while undertaking the construction of the roads in question. The petitioner has reiterated in the rejoinder filed to the reply filed by respondent No.1 that the road was constructed in Panchayat, Mandal. According to the contents of rejoinder, the illicit felling has taken place in forest Sharoli and Dulu.

What emerges from the pleadings of the parties is that the road in question was constructed despite the mandatory directions issued by this Court from time to time in CWP No. 1358/2001. An LPA was preferred against the judgment of this Court dated 23.11.2007. The Division Bench of this Court upheld the judgment except that respondent-State and the Corporation were permitted to remove fallen and diseased trees. Respondent No.1 though has denied his involvement in the illicit felling of trees, but it is evident from the damage report placed on record that he was involved in illicit felling of trees and he has paid the damages amounting to Rs. 23,925/-. Respondent No.2 has also admitted in the reply that respondent No.1 along with other persons was involved in illicit felling of trees. Respondent No.1 is the Pradhan of the Gram Panchayat, Mandal. Respondent No.2 is the custodian of the forest wealth in his area. He was supposed to be very prompt to take action against the persons who were involved in felling of trees. In the supplementary affidavit filed by the Additional Chief Secretary (Forest), it has come that

respondent No.2 was not involved in any manner since his subordinates have issued the 'no objection certificates'. According to the contents of the supplementary affidavit, the officers, namely Pratap Singh, Jia Lal, Hiteshwar and Surinder Kumar were involved in issuing the 'no objection certificates' and against them action has been initiated.

The Court after taking into consideration the material placed on record has added the Principal Secretary (PW) and Principal Secretary (Forests) to the Government of Himachal Pradesh vide order dated 10.7.2009. The Court had issued the following directions to the newly added respondents:

- i) Whether necessary permission under the Forest (conservation) Act, 1980 was ever sought and granted by the authorities while initiating the construction work of the link roads mentioned in the supplementary affidavit;
- ii) In case no permission was ever granted by the authorities under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, why the Forest Range Officer, Sarswati Nagar has issued 'no objection certificate' and what action, including disciplinary action has been taken against him;
- iii) Whether the construction has been carried of the roads in question through the agency of Public Works Department or by the contractor. In case the construction has been carried by the agency of the Public Works Department, the names of the officers, who have undertaken the construction of the link roads without the permission under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 are to be disclosed giving their rank as well. In case the construction has been

- undertaken by the contractor(s) his/their name(s) be disclosed;
- iv) The Principal Secretary (PW) and Principal Secretary (Forest) shall give the details of all the roads and link roads which have been constructed through the State of Himachal Pradesh without the necessary permission contemplated under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980;
- v) The Principal Secretary (Forest) is further directed to explain the manner in which the trees, which have been illicitly felled while undertaking the construction of the road, have been disposed of."

Respondents No.4 and 5 filed supplementary affidavit as directed by this Court vide orders dated 10.7.2009 and 28.7.2009. The Principal Secretary (PW) has undertaken on behalf of the State of Government by way of this affidavit that the Public Works Department/State shall not undertake construction of any road in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and the action shall be initiated as per law against the defaulters/erring officers/officials, who have constructed the roads in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. It will be apt to reproduce paras 4 and 5 of the affidavit filed by the Principal Secretary (PW) on 28.7.2009:

"4. That as far as the position with regard to necessary permission contemplated under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is concerned, the deponent on behalf of Public Works Department/State undertakes that henceforth no road shall be constructed by the Public Works Department in violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

5. That with regard to violation if any found to have been committed of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 while constructing public roads by the Public Works Department, the Deponent undertakes that action as provided under the law shall be initiated against the defaulting/erring officers/officials who have constructed the said road(s) in violation of Forest (Conservation) Act."

Respondent No.5 also filed supplementary affidavit on It has been admitted by respondent No.5 that no 29.7.2009. permission under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 was sought for the construction of the link roads mentioned in the affidavit filed by the petitioner. It has come in this affidavit that the Deputy Ranger, who was holding the charge of Sarswati Nagar and Sh. Jai Prakash, Deputy Ranger, Sarachali Block have issued 'no objection certificates' at their own level without the information of the Divisional Forest Officer for the construction of the roads mentioned in the supplementary affidavit of the petitioner. It has come in the affidavit that 80 roads/link roads were constructed throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh without necessary permission under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. Out of these 80 roads, no permission has been sought in respect of 67 roads/link roads whereas 13 roads forest land diversion of which was either under process or had been accorded in principal approval by the Government of India had been constructed without waiting final approval of the proposal from the Government of India under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The Additional Chief Secretary (Forests) filed supplementary affidavit on the basis of directions issued on 29.7.2009. In this affidavit, the

number of roads constructed without the permission has gone up from 80 to 116. The Principal Secretary (PW) also filed the affidavit in sequel to order dated 29.7.2009. In his affidavit, it is stated that 47 roads alleged to have been constructed by the Himachal Pradesh Public Works Department in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The deponent had sought for additional four weeks time to supply the information. The Principal Secretary (PW) filed the affidavit on 11.8.2009. In this affidavit, the numbers have increased to 75 roads, which were constructed by the Public Works Department.

The Court issued detailed directions to the respondents i.e. respondents No.4 and 5 on 6.8.2009 to supply the complete information of the roads which were constructed in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and the proposed action against the defaulters. The Additional Chief Secretary (Forests) filed an affidavit on 11.8.2009. It was for the first time that in this affidavit it has come that the Deputy Commissioner has been requested to initiate the action against the Patwaris, who had issued 'no objection certificates' in violation of law. The matter was also referred to the Principal Secretary (RD) to the Government of Himachal Pradesh for initiating action against the Block Development Officer, Jubbal for construction of roads undertaken by him in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

A bare perusal of the affidavit filed by the Additional Chief Secretary (Forests) dated 16.8.2009 reveals that 98 roads have been constructed in the forest areas without seeking the permission under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. It is a startling figure. The details of these roads are placed on record vide Annexure A-I with the

supplementary affidavit dated 16.8.2009. Similarly, the construction of the roads has been undertaken by the authorities in which forest land diversion proposal was either under process or principal approval has been accorded but the roads were constructed without waiting for the final approval from the Government of India. This information has been placed on record vide Annexure A-II. The perusal of this Annexure A-II reveals that in the process of construction of these 18 roads, in all, 1513 trees have been felled by the authorities without the prior permission of the competent authorities under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

It is evident from the information supplied by respondent No.4 and 5 that 116 roads have been constructed in the State of Himachal Pradesh without seeking mandatory permission under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. Out of them, 75 roads have been constructed by the Himachal Pradesh Public Works Department under the supervision of the Block Development Officers after sanctioning of the amounts by the respective Deputy Commissioners. The Pradhans of Gram Panchayats like respondent No.1 are also instrumental in construction of roads in negation of rule of law. It was imperative for the Deputy Commissioners and other agencies of the State to ensure that no road is constructed without permission from the Government of India under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The officers/officials of the Forests Department, Himachal Public Works Department and the Contractors to whom the work was assigned are guilty of undertaking the construction of roads despite the mandatory directions issued by this Court from time to time and also in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. Respondent No.1, as discussed

hereinabove, has indulged in illicit felling of trees which resulted in issuance of damage report. As sum of Rs. 23,925/- stood recovered from him. Respondent No.2 was not involved directly in granting the 'no objection certificate' as per the supplementary affidavit filed by the Principal Secretary (Forests). The 'no objection certificates' have been issued by the persons, who are not authorized to do so as per the contents of the supplementary affidavit filed by respondents No. 4 and 5 by the Patwaris, Deputy Rangers, Forest Guards etc. The stern action is to be taken against those persons, who have failed to abide the directions issued by this Court punctually and also violated the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

The Principal Secretary (PW) has in a very bold manner undertaken to take action against the defaulting officers/officials. He has also undertaken that the State Government and Public Works Department shall not construct any road in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The action has also been initiated by the Forests Department by punishing officers involved in illicit felling of trees in Sharoli and Dulu forest areas. In this case the action is also to be taken against the Block Development Officers, who have undertaken the construction of the roads on the basis of various schemes floated by the Centre/State Governments after the money was sanctioned by the respective Deputy Commissioners in violation of the mandatory provisions of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The respondents have supplied the information in piecemeal to the State Government after the issuance of repeated directions. Since the information as directed was not forthcoming, the Central Bureau of Investigation was arrayed as respondent No.7.

The Parliament has enacted the Act called "the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. Section 2 thereof imposes restrictions on the de-reservation of forests or use of forest land for non-forest purposes. Section 3-B deals with offences by authorities and Government Departments. The Central Government has also framed the rules called "the Forest (Conservation) Act, 2003. Rule 9 thereof provides the mechanism for proceedings against persons guilty of offences under the Act.

Accordingly, in view of the observations made hereinabove, respondent No.1 is found guilty of committing contempt of this Court for willful disobedience of the orders passed by this Court in CWP No.1358/2001. Respondent No.2 is absolved/exonerated. Respondent No.3 knowing fully well being a Government Officer that there is a ban on green felling has invited tenders though the same were subsequently cancelled. However, he is directed to be careful in future.

Respondent No.1 is the Pradhan of Gram Panchayat, Mandal. He has already deposited the fine imposed amounting to Rs. 23,925/-. Respondent No.1 has been held guilty for committing contempt of the orders passed by this Court in CWP No. 1358/2001. However, instead of sentencing or directing him to pay a fine, the interest of justice will suffice if he is directed to plant at least 500 plants of Deodar on the land to be provided by the Forest Department. The nourishment of these plants shall be the responsibility of respondent No.1 under the supervision of the Divisional Forest Officer concerned. He shall look after the plants for a period of five years. Thereafter the

up-keep of the trees planted by respondent No.1 being Pradhan of Gram Panchayat, Mandal shall be taken over by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned of the area. This will also ensure the participation of the local people in protecting, conserving and preserving the forest wealth of the State of Himachal Pradesh.

In view of the specific directions issued to respondent No.1 to plant 500 trees of Deodar, the conviction of respondent No.1 under the contempt jurisdiction shall not in any manner affect the status of respondent No.1 as Pradhan of the Gram Panchayat. It is clarified that no separate proceedings shall be initiated against him.

The Court takes judicial notice of the fact that in the process of seeking 'no objection certificates' from the agencies constituted under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is tardy and time consuming. Consequently, respondent No.6 is directed to ensure that as and when the applications for 'no objection certificate' are received, the needful be done within a reasonable period so that there is no delay in undertaking the construction of projects through forests areas. The delay in granting the permission escalates the cost of construction and the burden passes on to the tax-payers.

The agencies while issuing 'no objection certificate' shall also ensure that at least the site is visited once to ensure minimum damage to the forest wealth. They should not merely rely upon the report furnished by the State agencies.

Now, the Court has to issue necessary directions to respondent-State to take suitable action against the persons, whose details find mention in the Annexures annexed with the supplementary affidavits filed by respondents No.4 and 5. The persons mentioned in

these Annexures resumed the construction of roads without prior the \Forest of the Central Government under (Conservation) Act, 1980. The Principal Secretary (PW) has also undertaken to take disciplinary action against the persons involved in the construction of roads in violation of law. The Additional Chief Secretary (Forests) to the Government of Himachal Pradesh has also suspended three Officers of the Department. The necessary instructions have been issued to the Deputy Commissioner to take action against the Block Development Officer, Jubbal. The directions have also been issued to the Deputy Commissioners to initiate proceedings against the Patwaris, who have issued 'no objection certificates' at their own level.

Mr. Sandeep Sharma, learned Assistant Solicitor General of India on the previous date of hearing has assured the Court that the action shall be taken against the defaulters who have violated the mandatory provisions of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

It is evident from the contents of Annexure R-3 (Page 124) that the Forest Department has been compounding the matters in violation of section 68 of the Indian Forest Act. The necessary notification for compounding has to be issued by the State Government and the same has to be published in the Gazette. There is no deterrence in the prevailing instructions issued by the State Government. The stern action is required to be taken against the persons, who are involved in illicit felling of trees. The action should be taken departmentally and the prosecution should also be launched against the defaulters.

Accordingly, the following directions are issued to the respondent-State:

- i) The Himachal Pradesh Public Works Department/State shall not undertake the construction of any road in the forest areas without the mandatory permission under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 as undertaken by the Principal Secretary (PW) in his affidavit;
- ii) Stern disciplinary action be taken against the persons as per the undertaking given by the Principal Secretary (PW) against the officers/officials whose details are given in the Annexures filed with the supplementary affidavits while constructing roads in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The disciplinary proceedings shall be commenced within a period of six weeks and the same shall be concluded as far as possible within a period of one year;
- iii) The Additional Chief Secretary (Forests) is also directed to take suitable disciplinary action against the persons, who are involved in granting 'no objection certificates' in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 while undertaking the construction of 166 roads. The disciplinary proceedings shall be commenced within a period of six weeks and the same shall be concluded as far as possible within a period of one year;
- iv) The Deputy Commissioners in the State of Himachal Pradesh are directed to ensure that the Block Development Officers/Pradhan/Patwaris, who are instrumental in the construction of roads in violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 are dealt with departmentally. The necessary charge-sheet etc. shall be issued within a period of six weeks and the inquiry be completed as far as possible within a period of one year;
- v) Since admittedly 116 roads have been constructed in violation of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, the action under this Act shall also be taken against the

persons by the competent authorities prescribed under the Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2003. The action shall be initiated by the prescribed authorities within a period of one month from today. The details of the persons against whom the action is to be taken are provided in the Annexures filed with the supplementary affidavits of respondents No.4 and 5.

- vi) The respondent-State is suggested to issue necessary notification under section 68 of the Indian Forest Act dealing with the cases of illicit felling. The Court hopes and trusts that strong action will be taken against the persons, who are involved in the illicit felling of trees.
- vii) In order to ensure and supervise that the directions issued are complied with punctually, a committee of following two officers comprising of Mr. P.C. Kapoor, Principal Secretary (PW) Government of Himachal Pradesh and Mr. Upasak, Addl. S.P., Central Bureau of Investigation is constituted. The committee shall file the status report after every three months disclosing the latest status of the disciplinary proceedings initiated against the defaulters for a period of one year;

In view of the aforesaid discussion, the petition is disposed of. The pending application(s), if any, also stand disposed. The notices issued to respondents No. 1 to 3 stand discharged. No costs.

Sandeep Sharma, Judge (oral):

Taking cognizance of letter addressed to the Chief Justice of this Court, wherein person namely Shri Anant Ram Negi, resident of Village Halaila, Post Office Kotkhai, District Shimla, Himachal Pradesh, highlighted a serious issue with regard to illegal felling of trees by various private persons as well as administration for construction of roads through forest land, this Court directed Registry of this Court to register the instant petition as Public Interest Litigation (CWPIL). In the letter petition, petitioner alleged that many disgruntled persons residing in Himri Panchayat, Tehsil Kotkhai, District Shimla have indulged in illegal felling of trees for the construction of roads to their respective houses. Though the letter petitioner specifically raised issue with regard to construction of road

from Village Tharmala to Bertu via Village Guthan but also expressed his concern with regard to unauthorized construction of roads in the State of Himachal Pradesh, through forest land in violation of the Forest Conservation Act. Petitioner has alleged that since the officials of Forest Department are hands in glove with the forest mafia, no steps are being taken to stop/check illegal felling of trees, as a result of which, forest wealth is decreasing day by day. Apart from above, petitioner also highlighted the issue with regard to raising of orchards by private persons on the forest land in and around Shimla District.

- 2. Apart from above, this Court also received one letter in continuation to aforesaid letter petition, wherein, it is alleged that one person namely Keshav Ram Dogra, constructed road to his orchard by felling trees standing on forest land. Though letter petitioner by way of petition referred to herein above, alleged that more than four hundred roads have been constructed through forest land in District Shimla, after felling approximately 4000 deodar trees but no material has been placed on record to substantiate the aforesaid allegation.
- 3. This Court, taking note of the aforesaid serious allegations contained in the letter petition, directed the learned Additional Advocate General appearing on behalf of the State to have instructions in the matter. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, while filing reply on behalf of the State, denied aforesaid allegations levelled in the letter petition and claimed that the roads in the State of Himachal Pradesh and in District Shimla are being constructed after obtaining approval under Forest Conservation Act, 1980. It is further

disclosed in the affidavit that roads involving upto one hectare area are also being constructed after getting due sanction under Forest Rights Act, 2006, from the Divisional Forest Officer concerned. Above named deponent, specifically denied the allegation with respect to construction of 05 kms of road by forest mafia in the recent past, rather, it has been stated in the affidavit that Divisional Forest Officer Theog has accorded approval of 32 roads comprising of area measuring 16.1091 hectares under Forest Rights Act, from January, 2016 to 30.6.2017, under his jurisdiction. While refuting the contention of the letter petitioner that forest cover in the State of Himachal Pradesh is decreasing, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests has stated in his affidavit that there is an increase of 13 sq metres of forest cover in the State of Himachal Pradesh as per Forest Survey of India report, 2015. While dealing with specific instances as quoted in the letter petition with regard to Tharmala-Bertu and Guthan-Bohal roads, falling in Himri Panchayat of Kotkhai Tehsil, it has been informed by the State that necessary directions were issued to the Range Forest Officers, Kotkhai and Theog to visit the spot and submit a fact finding report. Aforesaid officer after having visited the spot, has reported that roads mentioned herein above were constructed about five years back and their length is only 2 kms and same figure in the list of cases registered for construction of roads in violation of Forest Conservation Act at Sr. No. 245.(Annexure R-I).

4. Similarly, the Range Forest Officer, Kotkhai after having inspected the spot alongwith Block Officer, Shillaru, Forest Guard Incharge of Sharmla Beat and Forest Guard Shillaru Beat, reported

that 480 metres long road has been constructed from Tharmala to Bertu in DPF Solku of Sharmla Beat. He has further reported that the road in question appears to have been constructed ten years ago. As per report submitted by Range Forest Officer, Kotkhai, person namely Keshav Ram manually widened the path by 2 feet making it motorable, qua which Range Forest Officer, Kotkhai chalked out damage report No. 10/17-18 dated 23.8,2017, against Shri Keshav Ram for the alleged offence committed by him and same shall be disposed of as per departmental procedure. As per reply submitted by the respondent-State, road in question has been fenced on both sides by the State and Deodar trees have been planted, as is evident from the photographs placed on record as Annexure R-IV.

- 5. Most importantly, perusal of annexure R-III suggests that Range Forest Officer, Kotkhai also contacted the letter petitioner namely Shri Anant Ram Negi on his cell phone, who in turn informed the concerned officer that this is a false complaint made in his name and he has nothing to do with these roads. Similarly, inquiry with regard to construction of Tharmala-Bertu road has been entrusted to Divisional Forest Officer, Theog.
- 6. Though, this court after having perused aforesaid reply filed by the respondent-State sees no reason to issue further directions in the matter, especially when complaint allegedly having been filed by Shri Anant Ram Negi has not been actually filed by the letter petitioner, as is stated by him to Range Forest Officer, Kotkhai, but this Court after perusing the documents placed on record by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, annexure R-I, sees substantial

force in the averments contained in the letter petition that roads are being constructed in the State of Himachal Pradesh in violation of Forest Conservation Act. As per own calculation of the Forest Department, approximately 2183 roads have been constructed in the State of Himachal Pradesh in violation of the Forest Conservation Act, which is a large number and can not be overlooked. It also emerges from the perusal of documents placed on record by the Forest Department that the matter with regard to construction of roads in the State of Himachal Pradesh in violation of Forest Conservation Act had come to the notice of this Court, in CWP No. 5600 of 2012 titled as Manoj Kumar versus Union of India & others and connected matters and COPC No. (56) of 2009 titled as Kuldeep Singh Chauhan versus Balbir Thakur and others, wherein, directions were issued to the State of Himachal Pradesh as well as Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India, for inspection of such roads by Committees and thereafter to report the matter to the Northern Regional Officer, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Chandigarh, for consideration of proposal for approval.

Though this Court, after having perused specific reply qua the roads allegedly constructed by private persons or authorities in violation of Forest Conservation Act, sees no reason to keep this petition alive, but, definitely, this Court can not lose sight of the fact that thousands of roads have been constructed in the State of Himachal Pradesh, in violation of Forest Conservation Act as such, this Court deems it proper to call for a detailed report from the respondent-State with regard to steps taken by the Forest Department for obtaining approval from the Ministry of Environment

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and Forests, Government of India, pursuant to directions issued by

this Court in CWP No. 5600 of 2012 (supra) and COPC No. 56 of 2009

(supra).

8. Before issuing necessary directions in light of the

discussion made herein above, it may be noticed that the issue with

regard to encroachment on forest land by private persons in District

Shimla for raising orchards is already pending adjudication before

this Court in CWPIL No. 9 of 2015 and CWPIL No. 17 of 2014, as

such, no directions in that regard are required to be issued in the

present petition.

9. Consequently, in view of discussion made herein above,

present petition is disposed of with a direction to the Chief Secretary

to the Government of Himachal Pradesh to file his personal affidavit,

detailing therein number and names of roads constructed in the State

of Himachal Pradesh, in violation of Forest Conservation Act. Chief

Secretary may also indicate in his affidavit that what steps have been

taken by the State for getting necessary permission from the Ministry

of Environment and Forests, Government of India, for regularization

of roads constructed in violation of Forest Conservation Act. Needful

be done within a period of two weeks from today.

और उक्त पारिस्थितिकीय और पर्यावरणीय दृष्टि से पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के रूप में कालेसर राष्ट्रीय पार्क और कालेसर वन्यजीव अभयारण्य के संरक्षित क्षेत्र के चारों ओर के क्षेत्र को, जो इस अधिसूचिना के पैरा 1 में विनिर्दिष्ट विस्तार और सीमाओं के क्षेत्र को संरक्षित और सुरक्षित करना आवश्यक है तथा उक्त पारिस्थितिकीय संवेदी जोन में उद्योगों के प्रचालन या प्रसंस्करण या उद्योगों के वर्गों का प्रचालन और प्रसंस्करण करने को प्रतिषिद्ध करना आवश्यक है;

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अतः, अब, केन्द्रीय सरकार, पर्यावरण (संरक्षण) नियम, 1986 के नियम 5 के उपनियम (3) और पर्यावरण (संरक्षण) अधिनियम, 1986 (1986 का 29) की धारा 3 की उपधारा (2) के खंड (v) और खंड (xiv) के साथ पठित और उपधारा (1) द्वारा प्रदत्त शक्तियों का प्रयोग करते हुए, हरियाणा राज्य में कालेसर राष्ट्रीय पार्क और कालेसर वन्यजीव अभयारण्य संरक्षित क्षेत्र की सीमा से 1900 मीटर तक के विस्तारित क्षेत्र को कालेसर राष्ट्रीय पार्क और कालेसर वन्यजीव अभयारण्य पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन (जिसे इसमें इसके पश्चात् पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन कहा गया है) के रूप में अधिसूचित करती है, जिसका विवरण निम्नानुसार है, अर्थात् :--

- 1. **पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन का विस्तार और उसकी सीमाएं**--(1) पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन हरियाणा राज्य में कालेसर राष्ट्रीय पार्क और कालेसर वन्यजीव अभयारण्य की सीमा से शून्य से 1900 मीटर तक विस्तारित होगा और पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन का क्षेत्रफल लगभग 38.92 हैक्टेयर है । कालेसर राष्ट्रीय पार्क और कालेसर वन्यजीव अभयारण्य के निर्देशांक उपाबंध I में दिये गये हैं ।
- (2) पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन पूर्व-दक्षिण (उपाबंध Iए मानचित्र के बिन्दु सं.14) की ओर 30°18'49.861" उ. अक्षांश और 77°35'7.269" पूर्व देशांतर; पश्चिम (उपाबंध Iए मानचित्र के बिन्दु सं.1) की ओर 30°24'35.016" उत्तर अक्षांश तथा 77° 24'37.293" पूर्व देशांतर; दक्षिण (उपाबंध Iए मानचित्र के बिन्दु सं. 12) की ओर 77° 32'26.990" पूर्व देशांतर और उत्तर की ओर तथा यमुना नदी के पूर्व की ओर हिमाचल प्रदेश सिवंलबाड़ा राष्ट्रीय पार्क लगता है।
- (3) अक्षांश और देशांतर के साथ पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन की सीमा का मानचित्र में **उपाबंध** Iए के रूप में दिया गचा है।
- (4) पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन का समन्वयक उनके अक्षांश और देशांतर सहित **उपाबंध** \mathbf{II} के रूप में उपाबद्ध है ।
- (5) पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में जिन गांवों का क्षेत्र या भाग आता है वो हैं, इब्राहिमपुर, तारापुर कलां, तारापुर खुर्द, फकीर माजरा, फतेहगढ़ कोट मुश्तरका, बच्चोंन, शाहबुदीनपुर कलां, शाहबुदीनपुर खुर्द, याराह, सिंपियान वाला, जतन वाला, दारपुर, वानीवाला, कांसली, चिकन, खिलनवाला, बागपत, खिजरी, अंबवाली, टिबरीयों, नगलपत्ती, मिलक, बामवेवाला, चांदपुर, रामलवाला, झण्डु ओडु, फैजपुर, कालेसर, गाढ़ी, बेंजारवास, मम्दुवास हैं।
- **2. पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के लिए आंचलिक महायोजना** (1) राज्य सरकार, पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के प्रयोजनों के लिए राजपत्र में इस अधिसूचना के अंतिम प्रकाशन की तारीख से दो वर्ष की अवधि के भीतर, स्थानीय व्यक्तियों के परामर्श से, इस अधिसूचना में संलग्न अनुबंधों के सामंजस्य से आंचलिक महायोजना तैयार करेगी।
- (2) आचंलिक महायोजना राज्य सरकार में सक्षम प्राधिकारी द्वारा अनुमोदित होगी।
- (3) पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के लिए आचंलिक महायोजना इस अधिसूचना में विनिर्दिष्ट रूप में ऐसी रीति में राज्य सरकार तथा सुसंगत केंद्रीय और राज्य विधियों के सामंजस्य में भी तथा केंद्रीय सरकार द्वारा जारी मार्गनिर्देश, यदि कोई हों, द्वारा तैयार होगी।
- (4) आंचलिक महायोजना, इसमें पर्यावरणीय और पारिस्थितिक विचारों को समाकलित करने के लिए निम्नलिखित सभी संबद्ध राज्य सरकार के विभागों के परामर्श से तैयार होगी, अर्थात्:--
 - (i) पर्यावरण ;
 - (ii) वन :
 - (iii) नगर विकास ;
 - (iv) पर्यटन ;
 - (v) नगरपालिक ;
 - (vi) राजस्व ;
 - (vii) कृषि ; और
 - (viii) हरियाणा राज्य प्रदूषण नियंत्रण बोर्ड ।

- (5) आंचलिक महायोजना अनुमोदित विद्यमान भू-उपयोग, अवसंरचनात्मक और क्रियाकलापों पर कोई निर्बंधन अधिरोपित नहीं करेगी जब तक कि इस अधिसूचना में और आचंलिक महायोजना में सभी अवसंरचना और अधिक प्रभावी और पारिस्थितिक अनुकूल क्रिया क्रियाकलाप कारक इस प्रकार विनिर्दिष्ट न हों।
- (6) आंचलिक महायोजना में अनाच्छादित क्षेत्रों के जीर्णोद्धार, विद्यमान जल निकायों के संरक्षण, आवाह क्षेत्रों के प्रबंधन, जल-संभरों के प्रबंधन, भूतल जल के प्रबंधन, मृदा और नमी संरक्षण, स्थानीय समुदायों की आवश्यकताओं तथा पारिस्थितिक और पर्यावरण से संबंधित ऐसे अन्य पहलओं, जिन पर ध्यान देना आवश्यक है, के लिए उपबंध होंगे।
- (7) आंचलिक महायोजना सभी विद्यमान पूजा स्थलों, ग्रामों और नगरीय बंदोबस्तों, वनों के प्रकार और किस्मों, कृषि क्षेत्रों, ऊपजाऊ भूमि, हरित क्षेत्र जैसे उद्यान और उसी प्रकार के स्थान, उद्यान कृषि क्षेत्र, फलोद्यान, झीलों और अन्य जल निकायों का अभ्यकंन करेगी।
- (8) आंचलिक महायोजना पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में विकास को पारिस्थितिक अनुकूल विकास और स्थानीय समुदायों की जीवकोपार्जन को सुनिश्चित करते हुए विनियमित होगी ।
- 3. **राज्य सरकार द्वारा किए जाने वाले उपाय--** राज्य सरकार इस अधिसूचना के उपबंधों को प्रभावी करने के लिए निम्नलिखित उपाय करेगी, अर्थात् :--
- (1) **भू-उपयोग -** पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में आमोद-प्रमोद के प्रयोजन के लिए चिन्हित किए गए वनों, उद्यान-कृषि क्षेत्रों, कृषि क्षेत्रों, पार्कों और खुले स्थानों का वाणिज्यिक और औद्योगिक संबद्ध विकास क्रियाकलापों के लिए उपयोग या संपरिवर्तन नहीं होगा:

परंतु पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के भीतर कृषि भूमि का संपरिवर्तन, मानीटरी समिति की सिफारिश पर और राज्य सरकार के पूर्व अनुमोदन से, स्थानीय निवासियों की आवासीय जरूरतों को पूरा करने के लिए और पैरा 4 की सारणी के स्तंभ (2) के अधीन मद सं. 27, 35, और सं. 40 के सामने सूचीबद्ध क्रियाकलापों को पूरा करने के लिए अनुज्ञात होंगे, अर्थात् :-

- (i) प्रदूषण उत्पन्न न करने वाले लघु उद्योग;
- (ii) वर्षा जल संचय; और
- (iii) कुटीर उद्योग, जिसके अंतर्गत ग्रामीण शिल्पी भी हैं :

परंतु यह और कि राज्य सरकार के पूर्व अनुमोदन और संविधान के अनुच्छेद 244 या तत्समय प्रवृत्त विधि के उपबंधों के अनुपालन के बिना, जिसके अंतर्गत अनुसूचित जनजाति और अन्य परंपरागत वन निवासी (वन अधिकारों की मान्यता) अधिनियम, 2006 (2007 का 2) भी है, वाणिज्यिक या उद्योग विकास क्रियाकलापों के लिए जनजातीय भूमि का उपयोग अनुज्ञात नहीं होगा:

परंतु यह और भी कि पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के भीतर भू-अभिलेखों में उपसंजात कोई त्रुटि, मानीटरी सिमिति के विचार प्राप्त करने के पश्चात् राज्य सरकार द्वारा प्रत्येक मामले में एक बार संशोधित होगी और उक्त त्रुटि के संशोधन की केन्द्रीय सरकार के पर्यावरण, वन और जलवायु परिवर्तन मंत्रालय को सूचना देनी होगी।

परंतु यह और भी कि उपर्युक्त त्रुटि का संशोधन में इस उप पैरा के अधीन यथा उपबंधित के सिवाय किसी भी दशा में भू-उपयोग का परिवर्तन सम्मिलित नहीं होगा ।

परंतु यह और भी कि जिससे हरित क्षेत्र में जैसे वन क्षेत्र, कृषि क्षेत्र आदि में कोई पारिणामिक कटौती नहीं होगी और अनप्रयुक्त या अनउत्पादक कृषि क्षेत्रों में पुन: वनीकरण करने के प्रयास किए जाएंगे ।

- (2) **प्राकृतिक जल स्रोत** आचंलिक महायोजना में सभी प्राकृतिक जल स्रोतों की पहचान की जाएगी और उनके संरक्षण और पुनरुद्भूतकरण के लिए योजना सम्मिलित होगी और राज्य सरकार द्वारा ऐसे क्षेत्रों पर या उनके निकट विकास क्रियाकलाप प्रतिषिद्ध करने के लिए ऐसी रीति से मार्गनिर्देश तैयार किए जाएंगे।
- (3) **पर्यटन** (क) पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के भीतर पर्यटन संबंधी क्रियाकलाप, जो आंचलिक महायोजना का भाग निम्नलिखित रूप में होंगे।
- (ख) पर्यटन महायोजना पर्यटन विभाग, हरियाणा सरकार द्वारा राजस्व और वन विभाग, हरियाणा सरकार के परामर्श से तैयार होगी ।
- (ग) पर्यटन संबंधी क्रियाकलाप निम्नलिखित के अधीन विनियमित होंगे, अर्थात् :-
 - (i) पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के भीतर सभी नए पर्यटन क्रियाकलापों या विद्यमान पर्यटन क्रियाकलापों का विस्तार भारत सरकार के पर्यावरण, वन और जलवायु परिवर्तन मंत्रालय के मार्गदर्शक सिद्धांतों के द्वारा तथा पारिस्थितिक पर्यटन राष्ट्रीय व्याघ्र संरक्षण प्राधिकरण, द्वारा जारी (समय-समय पर यथा संशोधित) मार्गदर्शक सिद्धांतों के अनुसार, पारिस्थितिक पर्यटन, पारिस्थितिक शिक्षा और पारिस्थितिक विकास को महत्व देते हुए पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन की वहन क्षमता के अध्ययन पर आधारित होगा;
 - (ii) पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के भीतर होटल और सैरगाहों के नए संनिर्माण अनुज्ञात नहीं होंगे।
 - (iii) आंचिलक महायोजना का अनुमोदन किए जाने तक, पर्यटन के लिए विकास और विद्यमान पर्यटन क्रियाकलापों के विस्तार को वास्तविक स्थल विनिर्दिष्ट संवीक्षा तथा मानीटरी समिति की सिफारिश पर आधारित संबंधित विनियामक प्राधिकरणों द्वारा अनुज्ञात किया होगा।
- (4) **नैसर्गिक विरासत** -- पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में महत्वपूर्ण नैसर्गिक विरासत के सभी स्थलों जैसे सभी जीन कोश आरक्षित क्षेत्र, शैल विरचनाएं, जल प्रपातों, झरनों, घाटी मार्गों, उपवनों, गुफाएं, स्थलों, भ्रमण, अश्वरोहण, प्रपातों आदि की पहचान की जाएगी और उन्हें संरक्षित किया जाएगा तथा उनकी सुरक्षा और संरक्षा के लिए इस अधिसूचना के प्रकाशन की तारीख से छह मास के भीतर, उपयुक्त योजना बनाएगी और ऐसी योजना आंचलिक महायोजना का भाग होगा।
- (5) **मानव निर्मित विरासत स्थल -** पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में भवनों, संरचनाओं, शिल्प-तथ्य, ऐतिहासिक, कलात्मक और सांस्कृतिक महत्व के क्षेत्रों की पहचान करनी होगी और इस अधिसूचना के प्रकाशन की तारीख से छह माह के भीतर उनके संरक्षण की योजनाएं तैयार करनी होगी तथा आंचलिक महायोजना में सम्मिलित की जाएगी।
- (6) **ध्विन प्रदूषण** -- पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में ध्विन प्रदूषण के नियंत्रण के लिए राज्य सरकार का पर्यावरण विभाग, वायु (प्रदूषण निवारण और नियंत्रण) अधिनियम, 1981 (1981 का 14) और उसके अधीन बनाए गए नियमों के उपबंधों के अनुसरण में मार्गदर्शक सिद्धांत और विनियम तैयार करेगा।
- (7) **वायु प्रदूषण** -- पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में, वायु प्रदूषण के नियंत्रण के लिए राज्य सरकार का पर्यावरण विभाग, वायु (प्रदूषण निवारण और नियंत्रण) अधिनियम, 1981 (1981 का 14) और उसके अधीन बनाए गए नियमों के उपबंधों के अनुसरण में मार्गदर्शक सिद्धांत और विनियम तैयार करेगा।
- (8) **बहिस्राव का निस्सारण** -- पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में उपचारित बहिस्राव का निस्सारण, जल (प्रदूषण निवारण तथा नियंत्रण) अधिनियम, 1974 (1974 का 6) और उसके अधीन बनाए गए नियमों के उपबंधों के अनुसार होगा।
- (9) ठोस अपशिष्ट ठोस अपशिष्टों का निपटान निम्नलिखित रूप में होगा -
 - (i) पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में ठोस अपिशिष्टों का निपटान भारत सरकार के तत्कालीन पर्यावरण और वन मंत्रालय की समय-समय पर यथा संशोधित अधिसूचना सं. का.आ. 908(अ), तारीख 25 सितंबर, 2000 नगरपालिक ठोस अपिशष्ट (प्रबंध और हथालन) नियम, 2000 के उपबंधों के अनुसार किया जाएगा;
 - (ii) स्थानीय प्राधिकरण जैव निम्नीकरणीय और अजैव निम्नीकरणीय संघटकों में ठोस अपशिष्टों के संपृथक्कन के लिए योजनाएं तैयार करेंगे;

- (iii) जैव निम्नीकरणीय सामग्री को अधिमानतः खाद बनाकर या कृमि खेती के माध्यम से पुनःचक्रित किया जाएगा ;
- (iv) अकार्बनिक सामग्री का निपटान पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन के बाहर पहचान किए गए स्थल पर किसी पर्यावरणीय स्वीकृत रीति में होगा और पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में ठोस अपशिष्टों को जलाना या भष्मीकरण अनुज्ञात नहीं होगा।
- (10) **जैव चिकित्सीय अपशिष्ट** पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में जैव चिकित्सीय अपशिष्टों का निपटान भारत सरकार के तत्कालीन द्वारा पर्यावरण और वन मंत्रालय की समय-समय पर यथासंशोधित अधिसूचना सं. का.आ. 630(अ) तारीख 20 जुलाई, 1998 द्वारा प्रकाशित जैव चिकित्सीय अपशिष्ट (प्रबंध और हथालन) नियम, 1998 के उपबंधों के अनुसार किया जाएगा।
- (11) **यानीय परिवहन** परिवहन की यानीय गतिविधियां आवास के अनुकूल विनियमित होंगी और इस संबंध में आंचलिक महायोजना में विशेष उपबंध अधिकथित किए जाएंगे और आंचलिक महायोजना के तैयार होने और राज्य सरकार के सक्षम प्राधिकारी के द्वारा अनुमोदित होने तक, मानीटरी समिति प्रवृत्त नियमों और विनियमों के अनुसार यानीय गतिविधियों के अनुपालन को मानीटर करेगी।
- 4. पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में प्रतिषिद्ध और विनियमित क्रियाकलापों की सूची पारिस्थितिक संवेदी जोन में सभी क्रियाकलाप पर्यावरण (संरक्षण) अधिनियम, 1986 (1986 का 29) के उपबंधों द्वारा शासित होंगे और नीचे दी गई तालिका में विनिर्दिष्ट रीति में विनियमित होंगे, अर्थात :--



New Delhi, the 22nd April, 2016

S.O. 1485(E).—Whereas, a draft notification was published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, vide notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change number S.O. 2540(E), dated 17th September, 2015 inviting objections and suggestions from all persons likely to be affected thereby within the period of sixty days from date on which copies of the Gazette containing the said notification were made available to the public;

And whereas, copies of the Gazette containing the said notification were made available to the public on the 17th September, 2015;

And whereas, objections and suggestions received from all persons and stakeholders in response to the draft notification have been duly considered by the Central Government;

And whereas, the Kalesar National Park and Kalesar Wildlife Sanctuary of about 100.88 square kilo meter are located on the junction of the four states, viz., Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Uttrakhand and Haryana, it falls in Shiwalik foot hills, and shares boundaries with two protected areas of two different states, namely, the Simbalbarha Wildlife sanctuary of Himachal Pradesh towards the North and the Rajaji National Park of Uttrakhand towards the East and Kalesar Wildlife Sanctuary is just towards the East-West of Kalesar National Park and as such there does not exist any physical barrier between the two and the entire area is very rich in plant and animal species and have historical, economic and medicinal significance and the Kalesar National Park and Kalesar Wildlife Sanctuary are rich in reptilian fauna which includes large monitor lizard, India rock python, King cobra, common krait, Red snake, Russel viper, Pit viper etc.;

And whereas, it is necessary to conserve and protect the area the extent and boundaries of which is specified in paragraph 1 of this notification around the protected area of the Kalesar National Park and Kalesar Wildlife Sanctuary as Eco-sensitive Zone from ecological and environmental point of view and to prohibit industries or class of industries and their operations and processes in the said Eco-sensitive Zone;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) and clauses (v) and (xiv) of sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986) read with sub- rule (3) of rule 5 of the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986, the Central Government hereby notifies an area to the extent of upto 1900 meters from the boundary of the protected area of Kalesar National Park and Kalesar Wildlife Sanctuary within the State of Haryana as the Kalesar Eco- sensitive Zone (hereinafter referred to as the Eco-sensitive Zone) details of which are as under, namely:-

- **1. Extent and boundaries of Eco-sensitive Zone.**—(1) The Eco-sensitive Zone varies from zero to 1900 meters from the boundary of Kalesar National Park and Kalesar Wildlife Sanctuary within the State of Haryana and the area of Eco-sensitive zone is 38.92 square kilo meter approximately. The co-ordinates of Kalesar National Park and Wildlife Sanctuary are given at Annexure-I.
- (2) The Eco-sensitive Zone is bounded by 30°18'49.861"N latitude and 77°35'7.269"E longitude towards East-South (point No.14 of Annexure I map); 30°24'35.016"N latitude and 77°24'37.293"E longitude towards west (point No.1 of Annexure IA map); 30°18'2.561"N latitude and 77°32'26.990"E longitude towards South (point No. 12 of Annexure I map) and Simbalbara National Park of Himachal Pradesh is falling on the Northern side and on Eastern side of Yamuna River.
- (3) The map of Eco-sensitive Zone boundary together with its latitudes and longitudes is appended as **Annexure IA**.
- (4) The coordinates of Eco-sensitive Zone with its latitudes and longitudes are appended as **Annexure II**.
- (5) The villages whose area or parts thereof falling within the Eco-sensitive Zone are, Ibrahimpur, Taharpur Kalan, Taharpur Khurd, Fakir Majra, Fatehgarh, Kot Mushtarka, Bachchon, Shahabuddinpur Kalan, Shahabuddinpur Khurd, Yarah, Sipianwala, Jatanwala, Darpur, Baniwala, Kansli, Chikan, Khilanwala, Bagpat, Khizri, Ambwali, Tibriyon, Nagalpatti Milak, Baumbewala, Chandpur, Rayanwala, Jhandu Oad, Faizpur, Kalesar, Garhi, Banjarwas, Mamduwas.

- **2. Zonal Master Plan for the Eco-sensitive Zone.-** (1) The State Government shall, for the purpose of the Eco-sensitive Zone prepare, a Zonal Master Plan, within a period of two years from the date of publication of this notification in the Official Gazette, in consultation with local people in accordance with this notification.
- (2) The Zonal Master Plan shall be approved by the competent authority in the State Government.
- (3) The Zonal Master Plan for the Eco-sensitive Zone shall be prepared by the State Government in accordance with this notification and also in consonance with the relevant Central and State laws and the guidelines issued by the Central Government, if any.
- (4) The Zonal Master Plan shall be prepared in consultation with all concerned State Departments, namely:-
 - (i) Environment;
 - (ii) Forest;
 - (iii) Urban Development;
 - (iv) Tourism;
 - (v) Municipal;
 - (vi) Revenue;
 - (vii) Agriculture; and
 - (viii) Haryana State Pollution Control Board,

for integrating environmental and ecological considerations into it.

- (5) The Zonal Master Plan shall not impose any restriction on the approved existing land use, infrastructure and activities, as on the date of publication of this notification in the Official Gazette, unless so specified in this notification and the Zonal Master Plan shall factor in improvement of all infrastructure and activities to be more efficient and eco-friendly.
- (6) The Zonal Master plan shall provide for restoration of denuded areas, conservation of existing water bodies, management of catchment areas, watershed management, groundwater management, soil and moisture conservation, needs of local community and such other aspects of the ecology and environment that need attention.
- (7) The Zonal Master Plan shall demarcate all the existing worshipping places, village and urban settlements, types and kinds of forests, agricultural areas, fertile lands, green area, such as, parks and like places, horticultural areas, orchards, lakes and other water bodies.
- (8) The Zonal Master Plan shall regulate development in Eco-sensitive Zone so as to ensure Eco-friendly development and livelihood security of local communities.
- 3. **Measures to be taken by State Government.**—The State Government shall take the following measures for giving effect to the provisions of this notification, namely:-
- (1) **Land use.**—Forests, horticulture areas, agricultural areas, parks and open spaces earmarked for recreational purposes in the Eco-sensitive Zone shall not be used or converted into areas for commercial or industrial related development activities:

Provided that the conversion of agricultural lands within the Eco-sensitive Zone may be permitted on the recommendation of the Monitoring Committee, and with the prior approval of the State Government, to meet the residential needs of local residents, and for the activities listed against serial numbers 27, 35 and 40 in column (2) of the table in paragraph 4, namely:-

- (i) small scale industries not causing pollution;
- (ii) rainwater harvesting; and
- (iii) cottage industries including village artisans:

Provided further that no use of tribal land shall be permitted for commercial and industrial development activities without the prior approval of the State Government and without compliance of the

provisions of article 244 of the Constitution or the law for the time being in force, including the Scheduled Tribes and other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 (2 of 2007):

Provided also that any error appearing in the land records within the Eco-sensitive Zone shall be corrected by the State Government, after obtaining the views of the Monitoring Committee, once in each case and the correction of said error shall be intimated to the Central Government in the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change:

Provided also that the correction of error shall not include change of land use in any case except as provided under this sub-paragraph:

Provided also that there shall be no consequential reduction in green area, such as forest area and agricultural area and efforts shall be made to reforest the unused or unproductive agricultural areas.

- (2) **Natural Springs.**—The catchment areas of all natural springs shall be identified and plans for their conservation and rejuvenation shall be incorporated in the Zonal Master Plan and the guidelines shall be drawn up by the State Government in such a manner as to prohibit development activities at or near these areas which are detrimental to such areas.
- (3) **Tourism.**—(a) The activity relating to tourism within the Eco-sensitive Zone shall be as per the Tourism Master Plan, which shall form part of the Zonal Master Plan.
- (b) The Tourism Master Plan shall be prepared by the Department of Tourism, Government of Haryana in consultation with the Department of Revenue and Forests, Government of Haryana.
- (c) The activity of tourism shall be regulated as under, namely:-
- (i) all new tourism activities or expansion of existing tourism activities within the Eco-sensitive Zone shall be in accordance with the eco-tourism guidelines issued by the National Tiger Conservation Authority, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (as amended from time to time) with emphasis on ecotourism, eco-education and eco-development and based on carrying capacity study of the Eco-sensitive Zone;
- (ii) new construction of hotels and resorts shall not be permitted within the Eco-sensitive Zone;
- (iii) till the Zonal Master Plan is approved, development for tourism and expansion of existing tourism activities shall be permitted by the concerned regulatory authorities based on the actual site specific scrutiny and recommendation of the Monitoring Committee.
- (4) **Natural Heritage.**—All sites of valuable natural heritage in the Eco-sensitive Zone, such as the gene pool reserve areas, rock formations, waterfalls, springs, gorges, groves, caves, points, walks, rides, cliffs, etc. shall be identified and preserved and plan shall be drawn up for their protection and conservation, within six months from the date of publication of this notification and such plan shall form part of the Zonal Master Plan.
- (5) **Man-made heritage sites.**—Buildings, structures, artefacts, areas and precincts of historical, architectural, aesthetic and cultural significance shall be indentified in the Eco-sensitive Zone and plans for their conservation shall be prepared within six months from the date of publication of this notification and incorporated in the Zonal Master Plan.
- (6) **Noise pollution.**—The Environment Department of the State Government shall draw up guidelines or, as the case may be regulations for the control of noise pollution in the Eco-sensitive Zone in accordance with the provisions of the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 (14 of 1981) and the rules made thereunder.
- (7) **Air pollution.**—The Environment Department of the State Government shall draw up guidelines or, as the case may be regulations for the control of air pollution in the Eco-sensitive Zone in accordance with the provisions of the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 (14 of 1981) and the rules made thereunder.
- (8) **Discharge of effluents.**—The discharge of treated effluent in Eco-sensitive Zone shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974(6 of 1974) and the rules made thereunder.
- (9) **Solid wastes.**—Disposal of solid wastes shall be as under:-

- (i) the solid waste disposal in Eco-sensitive Zone shall be carried out as per the provisions of the Municipal Solid Waste (Management and Handling) Rules, 2000, published by the Government of India in the erstwhile Ministry of Environment and Forests *vide* notification number S.O. 908(E), dated the 25th September, 2000, as amended from time to time;
- (ii) the local authorities shall draw up plans for the segregation of solid wastes into biodegradable and non-biodegradable components;
- (iii) the biodegradable material shall be recycled preferably through composting or vermiculture;
- (iv) the inorganic material shall be disposed of in an environmentally acceptable manner at site identified outside the Eco-sensitive Zone and no burning or incineration of solid wastes shall be permitted in the Eco-sensitive Zone.
- (10) **Bio-medical waste.**—The bio-medical waste disposal in the Eco-sensitive Zone shall be carried out as per the provisions of the Bio-Medical Waste (Management and Handling) Rules, 1998, published by the Government of India in the erstwhile Ministry of Environment and Forests *vide* notification number S.O. 630(E), dated the 20th July, 1998, as amended from time to time.
- (11) **Vehicular traffic.**—(a) The vehicular movement of traffic shall be regulated in a habitat friendly manner and specific provisions in this regard shall be incorporated in the Zonal Master Plan and till such time as the Zonal Master Plan is prepared and approved by the competent authority in the State Government.
- (b) The Monitoring Committee shall monitor compliance of vehicular movement under the relevant Acts and the rules and regulations made thereunder.
- **4.** List of activities prohibited or to be regulated within the Eco-sensitive Zone.—All activities in the Eco-sensitive Zone shall be governed by the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986) and the rules made thereunder and shall be regulated in the manner specified in the table below, namely:-

- **5. Eco-sensitive Zone Monitoring Committee.**—(1) The Central Government hereby constitutes a Monitoring Committee, for effective monitoring of the Eco-sensitive Zone, which shall comprise of the following, namely:-
 - (a) Deputy Commissioner, Yamunanagar Chairperson;
 - (b) a representative of Non-governmental Organisations working in the field of environment (including heritage conservation) to be nominated by the Government of Haryana for a term of one year Member:
 - (c) Regional Officer, Haryana State Pollution Control Board, Yamunanagar- Member;
 - (d) District Town Planner, Yamunanagar Member;
 - (e) One expert in the area of ecology and environment to be nominated by the Government of Haryana Member;
 - (f) Divisional Wildlife Officer, Panchkula- Member; and
 - (g) Deputy Conservator of Forests (Territorial) Yamunanagar Member-Secretary.
- (2) The Monitoring Committee shall monitor the compliance of the provisions of this notification.
- (3) The activities that are covered in the Schedule to the notification of the Government of India in the erstwhile Ministry of Environment and Forest number S.O. 1533(E), dated the 14th September, 2006, and are falling in the Eco-sensitive Zone, except for the prohibited activities as specified in the table under paragraph 4, shall be scrutinised by the Monitoring Committee based on the actual site-specific conditions and referred to the Central Government in the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change for prior environmental clearances under the provisions of the said notification.
- (4) The activities that are not covered in the Schedule to the notification of the Government of India in the erstwhile Ministry of Environment and Forest number S.O. 1533(E), dated the 14th September, 2006 and are falling in the Eco-sensitive Zone, except for the prohibited activities as specified in the table under paragraph 4, shall be scrutinised by the Monitoring Committee based on the actual site-specific conditions and referred to the concerned regulatory authorities.
- (5) The Monitoring Committee may invite representatives or experts from concerned Departments, representatives from industry associations or concerned stakeholders to assist in its deliberations depending on the requirements on issue to issue basis.
- (6) The Member-Secretary of the Monitoring Committee or the concerned Deputy Commissioner shall be competent to file complaint under section 19 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986) against any person who contravenes the provisions of this notification.
- (7) The Monitoring Committee shall submit the annual action taken report of its activities as on 31st March of every year by 30th June of that year to the Chief Wild Life Warden of the State as per proforma appended as **Annexure III**.
- (8) The Central Government in the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change may give such directions, as it deems fit, to the Monitoring Committee for effective discharge of its functions.
- **6.** The Central Government and the State Government may specify additional measures, if any, for giving effect to the provisions of this notification.


