महाशय,

उपर्युक्त विषयक संदर्भ में सूचित करना है कि भारत सरकार, पर्यावरण वन एवं जलवायु परिवर्तन मंत्रालय, नई दिल्ली के प्रासंगिक पत्र-1 द्वारा सी0सी0एल0 के मगध ओ0सी0पी फेज-2 हेतु 192.36 हे0 (वन भूमि- 57.29 हे0 एवं जंगल झाड़ी भूमि- 135.07 हे0) वन भूमि अपयोजन प्रस्ताव में 14 बिन्दुओं पर पृच्छा की गई है, जिसका अनुपालन प्रतिवेदन क्षेत्रीय मुख्य वन संरक्षक, हजारीबाग के पत्रांक 1785 दिनांक 20.07.2023 एवं 1787 दिनांक 20.07.2023 द्वारा प्राप्त हुआ था, जिसके पृच्छा संख्या-8, 10, 11 एवं 13 का निराकरण अपूर्ण रहने के कारण इस कार्यालय के पत्रांक 848 दिनांक 17.08.2023 द्वारा वांछित निराकरण प्रतिवेदन मांगी गयी। इस संदर्भ में क्षेत्रीय मुख्य वन संरक्षक, हजारीबाग के पत्रांक 2238 दिनांक 15.09.2023 द्वारा निराकरण प्रतिवेदन प्राप्त हुआ था, परन्तु पृच्छा संख्या- 11 एवं 13 के आलोक में Wildlife Management Plan की स्वीकृति अप्राप्त रहने के कारण पुनः इस कार्यालय के पत्रांक 1011 दिनांक 07.10.2023 द्वारा पृच्छा की गयी। उक्त पृच्छा के अनुपालन में क्षेत्रीय मुख्य वन संरक्षक, हजारीबाग के पत्रांक 2737 दिनांक 05.12.2023 (छायाप्रति संलग्न) द्वारा पृच्छा संख्या- 11 एवं 13 का संशोधित निराकरण प्रतिवेदन समर्पित किया गया है।

क्षेत्रीय मुख्य वन संरक्षक, हजारीबाग के प्रतिवेदानुसार पृच्छा का निराकरण निम्नवत् प्रतिवेदित है :-

Initially Magadh OCP had a total area of 643.19 Ha in Chatra Dist. In order to achieve operational efficacy, it was decided to operate another mine named Sanghmitra. For this 147.27 Ha of Magadh OCP was transferred to proposed Sanghmitra & 495.92 Ha remains with Magadh OCP. Out of previously released 96.72 Ha forest, 83.68 Ha lies within boundary of Magadh OCP and 13.04 Ha was transferred to Sanghmitra OCP. Both Magadh OCP & Sanghmitra OCP are under administrative control of GM MS Area, CCL which is part of the User agency i.e Central Coalfields limited (CCL) and as such there is no change in user agency.
