### Interior-design and décor:

The University will be provided with the state-of-the-art interior design for which a substantial amount is provided in the Capex.

### Laboratories:

BE it enacted by the Legislature of Sikkim in the Sixty-fourth Year of the Hopublic of India as follows:

The University shall set up off-campus centre(s) and / or with the prior approval of the UGC and that of the State Government(s) where the centre(s) is/are proposed to be opened.

Any off-shore campus(es) in toroign countries shall be opened only after obtaining due permission from the Government of India and also that of the Government of the host country.

The University shall fulfill the minimum offeria in terms of programmes, faculty, infrastructural facilities, financial viability, etc., as laid down from time to time by the UGC and other concerned statutory bodies such as the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), the Bar Council of India (BCI), the Distance Education Council (DEC), the Dental Council of India (DC), the Indian Nursing Council (INC), the Métical Council of India (MCI), the National Council for Technic Education (NCTE), the Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), etc.

### CHAPTER VI

### MISCELLANEOUS

Every employee shaft be appointed under a written contract, which shall be kept in the University and a copy of which shall be turnished to the employee concerned.

Discriptionary action against the students/employees shall be governed by procedure prescribed in the Statutes.

Every employee or student of the University or of a constituent, college shall notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, have a right to appeal within such time as may be prescribed, to the Board of Management against the decision of any officer or authority of the University or of the Principal of any such college, and thereupon the Board of Management may confirm, modify or change the decision appealed egainst.

The University shall constitute for the benefit of its employees such provident or pension fund and provide such insurance scheme as it may doem fit in such maaner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by rules.

If any question anses as to whether any person has been duly elected or appointed as, or is entitled to be a member of any euthority or other body of the University, the matter shall be referred to the Chancellor whose decision thereon shall be tinal.

Any authority of the University mentioned in section 20 may constitute a committee of such authority, consisting of such members as such authority may deem fit and having such powers as the authority may deem fit.

THE STRUCTURE STRUCTURES STRUCTURES

A copy of any receipt, application, notice, order, proceeding or resolution of any authority or committee of the university or other documents in possession of the University or any entry in any register duly maintained by the University. If certified by the Registrar, shall be received as prima facie dvidence of such receipt, application, notice, order, proceeding, resolution or document or the existence of entry in the register and shall be admitted as evidence of the matters and transaction therein recorded where the original thereof would, if produced, have been admissible in evidence.

If the Sponsor proposes dissolution of the University in accordance with the law governing its constitution or incorporation, it shall give at least 12 (twelve) months notice in writing to the State Government and it shall ensure that no new admissions to the University are accepted during the notice period. All financial obligations, whatsoever may be, for dissolution of the University shall lie with the University.

On identification of mismanagement, mal-administration or in-discipline which lead to gross failure in the accomplishment of the substantive objects of University or economic non-viability, the State Government would issue directions to the management of University to rectify the situation. If such directions are not followed within such time as may be prescribed, the right to take appropriate decision for such rectification including the decision to wind up of the University after giving due opportunity to the University for being heard, would vest in the State Government.

The manner of winding up of the University would be such as may be prescribed in this behalf by the State Government.

Provided that no such action will be initiated without atfording a reasonable opportunity to show cause to the Sponsor.

(4) On receipt of the notice referred to in sub-section (1), the State Government shall, in consultation with the UGC make such arrangements for administration of the University from the proposed date of dissolution of the University by the Sponsor and until the last batch of students in regular courses of studies of the University complete their courses of studies in such manner as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

- b) To acquire and takeover all or any part of the immovable or movable properties or any society, Trust or Institution or any one whomsoever for the benefit of the society in future.
- i) To accept donations, endowments, gifts, devises, bequests (real or personal) grants-in-aid and subscriptions for all or any of the purposes of the Trust on such terms and conditions as the Trust may consider reasonable and fit from residents, non residents and foreign agencies including Government/Governmental Agencies (Indian / Foreign ) body firm corporates, instations, trusts, NGO's or individuals with in frame work of the Statutory Acts and regulations.

- b) The funds and properties of the Trust shall consist of the initial Corpus amount of Rs. 6000 /- and also properties, movable or immovable , which may be acquired by the Trust by way of Purchase, lease, grants or gift etc. in future.
- c) The Trustees shall apply such sums of money as may be available from time to time by way of income from properties of the Trust or through collection of fees donations (refer clause (i)) as well as its funds for carrying out the aims and objects of the Trust.
- d) The Trust shall maintain proper books of accounts and the same shall be closed every year on 31<sup>9</sup> day of March. A qualified Auditor to be appointed by the Board of Trustees shall sudit the accounts of the Trust.
- e) The trust shall not carry out any activity with the intention of earning profit.

- g) The funds or income of the Trust shall be solely utilised towards the objects of the Trust and no portion of it shall be utilised for payment to the Trustees by way of profit, interest, dividend etc.,

### VI. BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

- a) The Administration of the Trust and the entire control regulation, management and application of the Trust Funds and the rents and profits thereof and all other or any property for the time being whether capital or income, subject to the objects of the Trusts and power and authorities mentioned hereunder shall be the prerogative discretion of the Board of Trustees.
- b) The Beard of Trustees shall consist of not less than two and not more than oleven Trustees. The TRUSTEES hereby nominate the following Trustee as the Managing Trustee/president/Chairman of the Trust.

- d) Any Trustee may retire from his / her uffice of Trustee open giving one month notice to the Board of Trustees of his / her intention to do so and seeh resignation shall take officer spointing explicy of such notice period or its earlier acceptance by the Board of Trustees.

### VIL POWER OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

- a) The Board of Trustees shall have power to frame rules and regulations to solutinister the property / funds of the Trust and also have power to amend the same from time to time.
- b) The Board shall have power to appoint Sub-committees from time to time enoug themselves or from other philanthropic persons for carrying out the various objectives of the Trust.
- c) The Board of Urustees shall have power to open bank account or accounts in the tiame of the Trust and the same shall be operated by the Managing Trustees' thairman or any other person or persons with the authorization of the managing Trustee.
- d) The Board of Trustees may apply for and raise funds through or credit or bonds or debentures any loan from any hank or other institutions or persons for any specific purpose to meet the objectives of the Trust on such terms and conditions in the best intensist of the Trust by pledging or allemating or mortgaging assets either moviable or intensable towards the spid financial assistance that may be negatived in future.
- e) The Board of Trustees can invest, purchase, withdraw, cell, mortgage, redeem and compractise the matters arising out of the Trust and its aspets and properties.
- f) The Board of Trustees will be authorized to invite from time to time, necept and receive any grants, donations, or volumitry contributions in each or in kind which such characteristic donations, grants and such other contributions might have been received.

- g) The Board of Trustees will appoint necessary staff and to incur necessary expenditure for the purpose of carrying out the objectives of the Trust and all costs and expenses incidental to the administration of the Trust,
- h) The Board of Trustees shall have power to authorise any one or more Trustees or hold any property or any fund or any investment of the Trust that may be acquired in future subject however to the terms of these presents in such manner and subject to such terms and conditions, rules, and regulations as the Board of Trustees may from time to time think fit and proper.
- i) The Board of Trustees shall spend any portion of the corpus or the income of the Trust fund for purchasing any land and or constructing any building or buildings in future for and in the name of the Trust for the purpose of carrying out, promoting and / or executing any or all of the objects of the Trust.
- j) The Board of Trustees shall be at liberty to sell such portion or portions of movable or immovable properties that may be acquired in future forming part of the Trust Estate either by public auction or private contract at such price or prices and on such terms and conditions relating to title or otherwise on all respects as they may in their absolute discretion think fit and to rescind or vary any contract for the sale thereof and to resell the same without being answerable for any loss occasioned thereby and to execute all conveyances or deeds or other assurances and to pass valid and effectual receipts, and discharges for all moneys received by the Trust.
- k) The Board of trustees are authorized to appoint Secretaries, Managers, Lawyers, Solicitors, Auditors, architects, Engineers, Surveyor or other employees for the purpose of management and supervision of the Trust Estate, for collection of rents, effects of rents and profits, for keeping the accounts and records and for other purpose of the Trust.
- I) The Board of Trustees have powers to compromise or compound all actions, suits and other proceeding and settle differences and disputes touching the Trust Estate and / or the Trust properties that may be acquired in future and to refer any such differences or disputes to arbitration and to adjust and settle all accounts relating to the Trust Estate and / or the Trust Properties and being liable or answerable for any bonafide loss occasioned thereby.
- m) The Board of Trustoes may reimburse themselves and pay and discharge out of the Trust Fund, all expenses incurred by them in or about the execution of the Trust or any on their duties under these presents including travelling expenses.
- n) The Board of Trustees shall have power to authorise any one or more trustees exclusively to sign documents, relevant correspondence to the Income Tax Department to apply for exemption, for Permanent Account Number and Tax deducted at Source Account Number, for regular annual filing of Income Tax Return and other related documents provided they should not be Persons in service with any State or Central Government offices.

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# VIII. MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

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- b) A general meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be held-once atleast in every financial year at which the audited annual accounts of the earlier financial year of the Trust and a report concerning the same shall be presented for the approval of the Board of Trustees.
- c) All proceeding and questions and matters arising at the meeting of the Trustees shall be elected by a majority of votes and in case of equality of votes the president/Managing Trustee of the trust shall have a second or easting vote.
- d) A Resolution in writing circulated smongst all the Trustees and signed by a majority of the Trustees shall be as valid and effectuel as if it had been passed at a meeting of the trustees duly called and convened.
- e) All meetings of the Trust shall be held at such place and at such time as the trustees decide from time to time.
- I) The minutes of the proceeding of every meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purposes and signed by the chairman of such meeting or of the following meeting when they are read over and shall when so entered and signed by conclusive evidence of the husiness and other matters transacted at such meeting.

#### XI. DISSOLUTION:

- a) If at any point of time, the activities of the Trust cannot be carried out lawfully or due such other reasons as the Board of Trustees considers fit, with the consent of majority of the Board of Trustees, it may recommend to Trustees for dissolution of Trust who shall decide to dissolve the Trust or otherwise.
- b) In the event of dissolution or winding up of the Trust, the assets refliaining as on the date of dissolution shall be wholly transferred to any other charitable Trusts, Societies, associations or institutions whose objects are aimilar to those of this Trust and which enjoys recognition under section 80G of the Income Tax Act 1961.
