Sub: Processing of proposals, in PARIVESH 1.0 for want of availability of complete end-to-end functionality of FC module in PARIVESH 2.0 as per the Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2022 – reg.

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to refer to this Ministry's letter of even number dated 18.07.2022 and 15.09.2022 on the above subject and to say that the progress made by the NIC to develop online facility in *Parivesh 2.0* for processing forest land diversion cases as per the Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2022 was reviewed in the Ministry.

2. It has been observed that many proposals in the PARIVESH 1.0 (proposals submitted by user agencies and accepted by the Nodal Officer (FCA)) are stuck up at various stages of processing in the State/UT and migration of such proposals to PARIVESH 2.0 may further delay the processing of these proposals. Similarly, proposals in PARIVESH 2.0 are also held up due to various technical issues.

3. Therefore, to resolve the situation, the Ministry has decided the following:

- i. Proposals submitted in PARIVESH 1.0 after 28.06.2022 and not migrated to PARIVESH 2.0, may be processed using the FC module of PARIVESH 1.0. However to adhere the procedures laid down in the Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2022, the minutes of the meeting of Project Steering Committee (PSC) may be attached with part-IV of forms and passing of proposals of less than 5 ha through Conservator of Forests, may be treated inert for procedural/technical purposes.
- ii. Till a time, the stabilization issues in PARIVESH 2.0 are resolved, new proposals may be submitted in PARIVESH 1.0 and their processing may be done as per arrangement mentioned under para 3 (i) above.
- iii. Proposals, already submitted in the PARIVESH 2.0 at various levels, may be processed in offline mode by the processing authorities of the State/UT concerned following the statutory process provided in the Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2022.
- iv. After rolling out of complete functionalities of the FC modules on PARIVESH

2.0, as envisaged in the Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2022, details of proposals processed in offline mode, as indicated under para 3 (iii) above, will be updated in the PARIVESH 2.0 by the authorities/user agency concerned.

In view of the above, I am directed to request the State Governments/UT Administrations to take appropriate action for processing such proposals and to accordingly inform the user agencies.

Subject: Approval with regards to wildlife clearance of "JDFPL - 4G Projects from Kela
Devi Wildlife Sanctuary for laying of underground OFC between Mandrayal to
Katalpur in Karauli District (Rajasthan)" (FP/RJ/OFC/4749/2019)

With reference to the above mentioned subject, SC-NBW in its 68th meeting held on
30.05.2022 had conditionally recommended the proposal of laying of underground optical fiber
cable between Mandrayal to Katalpur in Karauli District (Rajasthan).

In pursuance of the same, Chief Wildlife Warden, granted in-principle approval for the
project vide letter no. 1617 dated 05.07.2022, subject to compliance of conditions and mitigative
measures imposed by SC-NBW.

In compliance of the conditions mentioned in the in-principle approval, user agency has
deposited 2% of the proportional project cost of the project falling within the protected area i.e.
an amount of Rs 99060/- in RPACS account along with undertaking for compliance of the
remaining conditions, which have been certified by DCF RTR-II Karauli vide his letter no. 3743
dated 06.10.2022 and the same has been forwarded by Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) &
Field Director, RTR, Sawaimadhopur vide his letter no 4621 dated 11.11.2022.

The Chief Wildlife Warden, Rajasthan, hereby accords final sanction for wildlife
clearance under Section 29 of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, subject to

1. Compliance of all conditions as listed in the in-principle approval letter no. 1617 dated
05.07.2022 and other directions issued from time to time;
2. Submission of satisfactory annual compliance report;
3. Submission of documents providing final project cost by User Agency;
4. In case of cost overrun, the balance amount of 2% of proportionate project cost may
be deposited by User Agency in RPACS account.

In case, it is found that any of the conditions imposed by the various agencies as part of
wildlife clearance have not been complied with, this permission shall be liable to be cancelled.

The issue of this sanction does not bar any proceedings against the User Agency under any
other relevant Act, rules, guidelines, court judgments etc. for any other issues.

The final sanction for wildlife clearance should not be considered as NOC for commencement of work, if FCA clearance is required for the project and conditions as laid out in FCA clearance are complied with.
