Sub:- Proposal for seeking prior approval of the Central Government under Section 2(1) (ii) of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 for diversion of balance forest land of 89.961 ha (Fresh area 79.367 ha and 10.594 ha earlier diverted area for renewal and land use change) (Originally proposed area of 84.707 ha) in favour of Sri Avin Jain (Heir of Late Shri D.C.Jain) for mining of Iron and Manganese Ore in Dalpahar Iron and Manganese Ore mines located in Baitarani RF II, District Keonjhar (Odisha) – Compliance to Advisory Committee observations dated 06.10.2025 regarding.

Apropos to the subject cited above, this is to inform that Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (FC Division), New Delhi has requested to furnish compliance to Advisory Committee observations vide letter dated 06.10.2025. The compliance is furnished below-:

Observation No. (i) -: The 10.594 hectare area which is already diverted is represented by multiple small, scattered patches throughout the proposed lease, rather than as a single consolidated block. Therefore, the State shall verify the precise location of the 10.594 hectares of diverted area and submit a detailed layout of the same supported by documentary evidence.

Compliance: In compliance to the above, it is to inform that the Dalpahar Iron & Manganese Mining lease, over 251.00 acres or 101.171 ha, was previously granted to M/s M.A. Tulloch & Co (P) Ltd, in Dec 1956, for the excavation of manganese ore, and for many years the mining was carried out by the lessees up to July 1972. Thereafter, the work was dispensed with. Surface Right was granted in a phased manner from 1956 to 1964. Number of quarries over an area of 16.464 ha were developed by M/s M.A. Tulloch & Co (P) Ltd. As the mining was carried out manually during those days, only float manganese ores visible at the surface were extracted and hence, the workings are found in small and scattered patches instead of a single consolidated block, as is generally observed in present-day mechanized mining of Iron and Manganese Ore.

This lease was subsequently granted for a period of 20 years and was executed on 09.06.1986 for Iron and Manganese Ore in favour of Shri D. C. Jain. The lease comprised a total forest area of 101.171 hectares. A forest diversion proposal over 97.084 ha (101.171 ha - 4.087 ha safety zone along the ML boundary) was submitted to the Government of India, MoEF, New Delhi for consideration vide F&E Department Letter No. 14739/F&E dated 14.09.2000. The areas already mined out (broken up) by M/s M.A. Tulloch & Co. (P) Ltd. prior to 1980 were jointly verified by officials from the Mining, Forest and Revenue Departments in September 1999 with detailed forward/ backward bearings, and distances from pillar to pillar were recorded for 10 blocks and shown in plan (Copy enclosed as **Annexure-I**), while filing the diversion proposal under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. Based on the said report, final approval of Government of India, MoEF was obtained for 16.469 ha vide F.No. 8-103/2000-FC dated 14.11.2005 (Copy enclosed as **Annexure II**) only for the broken area.

As per the FAC observations cited above, the total area of the present mining lease of M/s D C Jain is 89.961 ha, which comprises 79.367 ha of virgin forest land and 10.594 ha of already broken & diverted forest area in Baitarani RF under Keonjhar Forest division. The precise location of the area has been verified repeatedly in the past and present, not only by the State Government alone but by the Regional Office of Bhubaneswar. Surveys were carried out by joint teams, and the DGPS survey has been vetted by the Odisha Space Application Center. The documents in support of the above are as below-:

- A) The area was jointly verified in September 1999 by mining and forest officials, with detailed forward and backward bearings. A copy of the same alongwith the authenticated map duly signed by all concerned is enclosed as **Annexure-I**.
- B) A copy of the Stage-I/in-principle letter dated 28.11.2002 and Final approval order dated 14.11.2005 of 16.469 ha of diverted land (broken up) by Govt.of India, MoEF, New Delhi is enclosed as **Annexure II Series**.
- C) The map showing the details of the diverted land (broken up) totaling to 10.594 ha within the Mining Lease of Dalpahar Iron & Mining (Block-A) over 89.961 ha duly signed by all concerned is enclosed as **Annexure-III**. Further, the user agency has submitted a drone survey map showing the mining lease area of Dalpahar Iron & Manganese Ore mines over 89.961 ha with superimposing of already diverted area over 10.594 ha (already broken up) which is enclosed as **Annexure-IIIA**.
- D) The map showing DGPS survey and joint verification by Forest, Revenue and mining officials with vetting by ORSAC in 2014 is enclosed as **Annexure IV**.
- E) A copy of the Site Inspection Report by DFO Keonjhar on dated 11.04.2015 attached as **Annexure-V.**
- F) A copy of the Site Inspection Report of the Regional Office, Govt. of India, MoEF & CC, Bhubaneswar on 07.01.2025 is enclosed as **Annexure-VI**.

In view of the above, the compliance to the Advisory Committee observations of GoI, MoEF & CC (FC Division), New Delhi dated 06.10.2025 is sent herewith for favour of kind information and necessary action.

Sir,

Kindly refer to your letter No. 10F(Cons) 71/2000/14739/F&E dated 14.09.2000 and subsequent letter No. 10F(Cons) 65/2002/18564/F&E dated 27.10.2005 whereunder the above proposal was forwarded to this office seeking prior approval of the Central Government in accordance with the Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

After careful consideration of the proposal of the State Government, the Central Government hereby conveys its approval under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 16.464 ha of forest land for mining of iron and manganese ore in favour of M/s D. C. Jain in Keonjhar District, Orissa, subject to the fulfilment of following conditions :-

Legal status of the forest land shall remain unchanged.

Compensatory Afforestation shall be raised over equivalent non-forest land, and (i) (ii) shall be maintained at the project cost.

The non-torest land identified for Compensatory Afforestation shall be declared as Reserved Forest/Protected Forest under Indian Forest Act, 1927. (iii)

Penal Compensatory Afforestation shall be raised over degraded forest land double in extent to the area used in violation, i.e., over 32.928 ha, and shall be (iv) maintained at the project cost.

The mining lease period under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 shall be coterminus with the current lease granted under MMRD Act, 1957.

The State Government should transfer amount of NPV and other funds to Compensatory Afforestation Fund Management and Planning Authority (vi) (CAMPA), which has already been constituted and notified by the Central Government on 23.04.2004. Till such time, the CAMPA intimates the Head of Accounts for deposition of funds, the funds will be maintained in the form of fixed deposits in the name of Nodal Officer or concerned Divisional Forest Officer of the State Government. The funds realized towards the NPV shall not be utilized by the State Government.

RCC pillars of 4 feet height shall be erected to demarcate the area by the user agency at the project cost and will be marked with forward and back bearings.



The user agency shall raise, fence and maintain a safety zone around the mining area and will also raise and maintain the plantation over an area one and half times in extent of the safety zone at the project cost.

The concurrent reclamation plan shall be executed by the user agency from the very 1st year and an annual report shall be sent to the Nodal Officer and the RCCF, Bhubaneshwar. If it is found from the annual report that the concurrent reclamation plan is not being adhered to by the user agency, the mining activities shall remain suspended till such time, the annual programme is completed for that wear.

The top soil shall be protected at the project cost. (x)

Trees shall be felled only when it becomes necessary and that too under strict (xi) supervision of State Forest Department, and at the cost of the project.

No labour camps shall be established on the forest land.

All necessary measures should be taken by the user agency to protect the (xiii) environment.

Sufficient firewood shall be provided by the user agency to the labourers at the project cost after purchase from the State Forest Department/Forest Development Corporation.

The user agency shall ensure that there should be no damage to the available

The forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the (xvi) proposal.

The forest land thus diverted shall be non-transferable. Whenever the forest land is not required, it shall be surrendered to the State Forest Department under intimation to this Ministry.

The site inspection of the above project was carried out by the undersigned on 07.01.2025 along with DFO, Keonjhar and representatives from the user agency.

1. Legal status of the forest land proposed for diversion:

The legal status of the forest land is Reserved Forest.

2. Item-wise break-up details of the forest land proposed for diversion.

As per PCCF (Nodal), Odisha's letter No.6233/9F (MG)-18/2015 dated 15.03.2024, the item

3. Whether proposal involves any construction of buildings (including residential) or not. If yes, details thereof:

Yes, as mentioned at Sl.7 of the Table above.

4. Total cost of the project at present rates:

The total cost of this project is reported to be about 37.709 Crores.

5. Wildlife:

As reported by DFO, Keonjhar no rare or endangered flora or fauna is noticed in this area. The area is coming under Elephant Habitat Zone-2 as per ORSAC report. The movement of Wild elephant is often noticed in the area.

Whether forest area proposed for diversion is important from wildlife point of view or not:

The DFO, Keonjhar Forest Division has reported that the applied area does not form part of any National Park/ Wildlife Sanctuary/ Biosphere Reserve/ Tiger Reserve/ Elephant Corridor. It was also reported that the proposed site for the project does not come under ecosensitive zone of any protected area.

As elephant movement is observed occasionally in the nearby applied area and the area is coming under Elephant Habitat Zone-2 as per ORSAC report, in order to conserve and protect the wildlife and their habitat, a comprehensive Site Specific Wildlife Conservation Plan prepared by the user agency pertaining to this project and the PCCF (WL) & CWLW, Odisha vide letter No.13358 dated 14.12.2023 has approved with total financial outlay of Rs.491.46 Lakhs, out of which Rs.286.26 Lakhs will be incurred in Project Impact area of Keonjhar Division and Rs.205.20 Lakhs will be incurred in the Project Impact of Bonai Division. The user agency has deposited the said amount in Orissa CAMPA account.

Further, the user agency has deposited has deposited Rs.76,01,002/- towards proportionate contribution for implementation of Regional Wildlife Management Plan prepared for Keonjhar and Bonai Forest Division.

6. Vegetation:

The density of vegetation is reported to be 0.5 in virgin forest land and 0.2 in broken up forest area as per Site Inspection report of DFO, Keonjhar. However, density of vegetation in the

broken up area appears to be almost equal to that in the virgin area. Hence, average density of vegetation can be taken as 0.5 for the entire lease area.

As per DSS analysis, most of the proposed forest land comes under Moderately Dense Forest.

(a) Total number of trees to be felled.

Total 6388 nos. of trees above 30 cm girth and 15,779 nos. of trees below 30 cm girth have been enumerated over 89.961 Ha forest land proposed for diversion. Further, 2717 nos. of trees above 30 cm and 7520 nos. of trees below 30 cm girth have been enumerated over 10.594 ha of broken up forest land.

Effect of removal of trees on the general ecosystem in the area:

Felling of trees will affect the general ecosystem of the area. Trees should be felled in a phased manner when absolutely essential to remove to minimize the adverse impact on the eco-system.

(b) Important species:

As reported by the State Govt., the tree species available in the applied area are Sal (Shorea robusta), Piasal (Pterocarpus marsupium), Gambhar (Gmelina arborea), Jamun (Syzygium cumini), Kendu (Diospyros melanoxylon), Asan (Terminalia tomentosa), Dhaura (Annogeissus latifolia), Kurum (Adina cordifolia), Bandhan (Ougeinia oojeinensis), Kasi (Bridelia retusa), Sissoo (Dalbergia latifolia), etc. Sal is the pre-dominant species.

7. Background note on the proposal:

State Govt. reported that original mining lease was granted for a period of 20 years for iron ore in village Dalpahar in favour of Shri Dharam Chand Jain over an area of 101.570 Ha vide Govt. in the erstwhile Mining & Geology Department Proceedings No.III(A)MG.101/84-6179-MG dated 05.06.1984. The mining lease is located entirely in Baitarani RF near village Dalpahar village under Barbil Tahasil of Keonjhar District. The granted mining lease area was reduced to 101.171 Ha in five blocks following survey and demarcation which was communicated in letter No.III(A)MG.19/86/MG dated 10.04.1986 of Govt. of Odisha, Mining & Geology Department. Thereafter, the mining leases were executed on 09.06.1986 for five blocks separately such Block-A: 89.981 Ha, Block-B1: 0.607 Ha, Block-B2: 7.689 Ha, Block-B3: 1.012 Ha and Block-C: 1.902 Ha totaling 101.171 Ha for a period of 20 years with effect from 09.06.1986 to 08.06.2006. Manganese ore was later allowed to be included as 2nd mineral in the mining lease vide letter No.5(23)/95-M.IV dated 17.08.1995 of Govt. of India, Ministry of Mines which was subject to the condition that the lessee will have to obtain the approval of Govt. of India, MoEF for diversion of included forest land in the leasehold area before execution of the inclusion of lease deed. Govt. of Odisha, Department of Steel & Mines vide Proceeding No.III(A)SM-12/99-2376/SM had also ordered that manganese ore be included in the existing mining lease of iron ore already executed in favour of lessee for a period co-terminus by execution of a supplementary lease deed. Accordingly, supplementary lease deed for iron and manganese were also executed for all the five blocks separately on 25.05.2000 totaling over 101.171 Ha without obtaining prior approval of MoEF, Govt. of India.

During original mining lease period, a forest diversion proposal for diversion of 97.084 ha of forest land in this lease was filed/processed to MoEF for consideration excluding 4.087 Ha of forest land earmarked to be maintained as Safety Zone as per practice prevailing then vide F&E Department letter No.14739 dated 14.09.2000. However, MoEF, Govt. of India had considered the project for diversion of 16.464 Ha of pre-1980 broken up forest land of the mining lease only vide their letter No.8-103/2000-FC dated 14.11.2005.

Five separate Renewal of Mining Lease applications have been filed by the user agency in respect of five blocks on 01.06.2005 which is one year prior to expiry of mining period on 08.06.2006. Thus the leases are under deemed extension provision of Rule 24A(6) of MC Rules, 1960.

It is worth mentioning that the total lease area of 101.171 Ha has been declared lapsed by the State Govt. in Steel & Mines Department as per relevant provisions of MMDR Act and MC Rules, 1960. The lessee appealed before the Revisional Authority against the order of LAPSING of State Govt. The Revisionary Authority, Ministry of Mines, Govt. of India vide his interim order dated 27.09.2013 has directed the State Govt. not take any coercive measures against the revisionist/lessee. The Deputy Director Mines, Joda Circle has also clarified that the RMLLSs, as applied for stand valid till final disposal of the Revision Application by the Revisional Authority. In the meantime, the order of Govt. of India, Ministry dated 16.12.2014 addressed to the Secretary, Steel & Mines Department, Govt. of Odisha with copy to DFO, Keonjhar vide letter dated 06.01.2015 states that the Revisionists is a liberty to pursue its proposal of forest diversion before the concerned authority of the State Govt. and MoEF.

Further, the lessee challenged the Lapsing orders of State Govt. in Steel & Mines Department by filing a Writ Petition No.993/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court, Orissa. Hon'ble High Court vide their order dated 21.01.2015 in M.C. No.1081/2015 arising out of above Writ Petition have directed as interim measure that no final order shall be passed by the State on the RML application of the petitioner seeking renewal and further directed that auction policy decision dated 05.01.2015 published in extra ordinary Gazette dated 12.01.2015 shall be kept in abeyance till next date. Further the Hon'ble High Court vide their interim order dated 11.01.2015 in M.C. No.8894 of 2015 arising out of Writ Petition mentioned above, have directed that no coercive action shall be taken in the matter till next date.

In view of the above order of Revisional Authority as well as of the Hon'ble High Court, Orissa, the instant proposal for diversion has been processed for necessary approval under Section 2 of FC Act, 1980.

In the due course of time, as per order dated 26.02.2019 in WP No.993/2015, the Hon'ble High Court remanded back the matter to the State Govt. with a direction to "hear the matter at fresh in line with the order dated 04.04.2016 in WP (C) No.114 of 2014 by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and to dispose the matter. Further, on the basis. Further on the basis of hearing at Steel & Mines Department, Govt. of Odisha passed the order vide No.6610/IV (AB)SM-11/2015/S&M dated 06.09.2019 that "pleased to decided not to declare and record the Iron & Mn mining lease of Late D.C. Jain (power of attorney Sri Avin Jain) over an area of 89.961 Ha (Block-A) of Keonjhar district as lapsed.

8. Compensatory afforestation:

In lieu of 79.367 Ha of virgin forest land (89.961 Ha - 10.594 Ha already diverted forest land) fresh proposed for diversion, State Govt. has identified 81.545 Ha of non-forest land in village Gundula (66.745 Ha), Champajhar (9.80 Ha) under Banspal Tahasil and in village Binida & Delenga (5.00 Ha) under Ghatgaon Tahasil of Keonjhar District for raising compensatory afforestation.

(a) Whether land for compensatory afforestation is suitable from plantation and management point of view or not:

The DFO, Keonjhar Forest Division has furnished land suitability certificate in respect of 81.545 ha of non-forest Govt. land in village Gundula (66.745 Ha), Champajhar (9.80 Ha) under Banspal Tahasil and in village Binida & Delenga (5.00 Ha) under Ghatgaon Tahasil of Keonjhar District for raising compensatory afforestation.

The proposed site has been visited and found to be suitable to accept for compensatory afforestation.

Further to accommodate the balance seedlings, State Govt. has identified 83.49 ha of degraded forest land in Bansuli RF (16.00 Ha) and Jyotipur RF (67.49 Ha) under Keonjhar Forest Division.

Whether land for compensatory afforestation is free from encroachment/other encumbrances:

The Tahasildar, Banspal and Tahasildar, Ghatgaon have certified that non-forest C.A. land is free from encroachment and encumbrances and not covered under DLC report.

(b) Whether land for compensatory afforestation is important from Religious/Archaeological point of view:

It has been reported that the land for CA is not important from Religious/Archaeological point of view.

(c) Land identified for raising compensatory afforestation is in how many patches, whether patches are compact or not:

The non-forest land identified over 81.545 ha for raising compensatory afforestation is comprising three patches. Two patches are close to each other. The third patch is in a different place.

(d) Map with details:

The DGPS map and SoI Toposheet indicating location of identified non-forest land has been submitted by the State Govt.

(e) Total financial outlay:

The PCCF (Nodal), Odisha has technical approved the CA Schemes for Rs.2,24,49,300/- over 66.745 Ha of non-forest land, Rs.49,67,000/- over 9.80 Ha of non-forest land and Rs.77,70,800/- over 5.00 Ha of non-forest land.

The PCCF (Nodal), Odisha has also technically approved the Additional CA Schemes for Rs.87,23,000/- over 16.00 Ha of degraded forest land and Rs.2,62,44,200/- over 67.49 Ha of degraded forest land.

9. Whether proposal involves violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 or not. If yes, a detailed report on violation including action taken against the concerned officials:

As reported by the DFO, Keonjhar and RCCF, Rourkela, illegal production of Iron (Fe) Ore has been taken place in the mining lease during the following period:

1993-94 - 708 MT 1994-95 - 453 MT 1995-96 - 327 MT

For the illegal production of mineral made in the ML area, as above OR case No.80CH of 2014-15 dated 01.08.2014 of Champua Range of Keonjhar Forest Division has been booked. Prosecution has been sanctioned against the Mines Manager and submitted in the Court of JMFC, Barbil vide PR No.11 of 2014-15 dated 15.11.2014. As reported by the user agency no penalty has been imposed by the Steel & Mines Department against this lease as per Hon'ble Supreme Court judgement dated 2nd August, 2017.

MoEF&CC vide letter No.8-103/2000-FC dated 14.11.2005 has granted approval (Stage-II) for diversion of 16.464 Ha of forest land and imposed Penal CA over 32.928 Ha of degraded forest land (double in extent to the area used in violation). The DFO has reported that the Penal CA has been raised in Barbanka RF during 2009-10.

10. Whether proposal involves rehabilitation of displaced persons. If yes, whether rehabilitation plan has been prepared by the State Government or not:

The project does not involve displacement of any human habitation. Hence, Resettlement & Rehabilitation Plan is not required.

11. Reclamation plan:

The RCCF, Rourkela has reported that since mining operation is closed and no pit has been fully exhausted yet, concurrent reclamation is not feasible at this stage. Reclamation & Rehabilitation will be carried out as per the progressive mine closure plan approved by IBM. The user agency has furnished an undertaking to implement the phased reclamation plan.

The Mining Plan including Progressive Mine Closure Plan has been approved by the Regional Controller of Mines, IBM, Bhubaneswar over an area of 89.961 ha in respect of Dalpahar Iron & Manganese Ore Mines of D.C. Jain vide letter No.MRMP-2273/2023-24-IBM-RO-BBS dated 27.05.2024 which is valid upto 31.03.2026.

12. Details on catchment and command area under the project:

Not reported.

13. Cost benefit ratio:

As reported, the total benefit of this proposal has been assessed at Rs.85.50 Crores. The loss on forests including environmental loss, NPV cost and other mandatory payments comes to Rs.3.0246839 Crores. Hence, the cost benefit ratio comes to 1:28.27.

14. Recommendations of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests/State Government:

The forest area proposed for diversion has been duly recommended by PCCF.

15. Utility of the project:

As reported by State Govt., the project will generate employment for more than 250 people directly and 500 nos. of people indirectly.

Not reported.

Not reported.







- 19. Recommendations of Dy. Director General of Forests (Central) along with detailed reasons:
- 1. Total land involved in this mining lease is 89.961 Ha (101.171 Ha 11.21 Ha) of RF. Out of which 79.367 Ha of virgin forest land and 10.594 ha of already diverted forest land. (11.21 Ha area was not considered while assigning the present lease)
- 2. The Mining Plan including Progressive Mine Closure Plan has been approved by the Regional Controller of Mines, IBM, Bhubaneswar over an area of 89.961 ha in respect of Dalpahar Iron & Manganese Ore Mines of D.C. Jain vide letter No.MRMP-2273/2023-24-IBM-RO-BBS dated 27.05.2024 which is valid upto 31.03.2026.
- 3. The State Govt. has reported that the project does not involve displacement of any human habitation. Hence, Resettlement & Rehabilitation Plan is not required.

Further, the user agency has also deposited Rs.76,01,002/- towards proportionate contribution for implementation of Regional Wildlife Management Plan prepared for Keonjhar and Bonai Forest Division.
- 7. As reported by the State Govt. the user agency has deposited Rs.9,49,99,569/- /- towards NPV entire forest area involved in the mining lease.
- 8. As reported, the scheme for afforestation in degraded forest land to the extent of 1.5 times the area of Safety zone over 8.0625 Ha identified in Naibuga RF under Keonjhar Forest Division has been approved by RCCF, Rourkela with financial outlay of Rs.24,42,000/-. The user agency has deposited the above approved amount in Orissa CAMPA account.
- 9. Out of total Mining Lease area of 101.171 Ha, Steel & Mines Department, Govt. of Odisha has declared 11.21 Ha as lapsed vide Proceedings dated 09.07.2013. The area declared as lapsed consists of 4 nos. of mining blocks viz. Block-B1 (0.607 Ha), Block-B2 (7.689 Ha), Block-B3 (1.012 Ha) and Block-C (1.902 Ha). Ministry vide letter No.8-103/2000-FC dated 14.11.2005 has accorded final approval for diversion of 16.464 ha of forest land in this mining lease.
- 10. Out of 16.464 ha of diverted forest land vide Ministry's letter No.8-103/2000-FC dated 14.11.2005, 5.87 ha of forest land is within the lapsed area of the above mining blocks. The balance 10.594 Ha which is having approval by the Ministry is in 8 patches distributed in the lease area.
- 11. The Regional Office, MoEF&CC, Bhubaneswar vide letter No.5-ORA265/2015-BHU dated 01.07.2020 had recommended the proposal to Ministry.

This diversion proposal is for mining of Manganese and Iron ore, which is site specific. The user agency has identified 81.545 Ha of non-forest land for raising Compensatory Afforestation. The diversion of 79.367 Ha of virgin forest land and change in land use of 10.594 Ha of already diverted forest land is recommended with standard conditions and observation made during inspection.
