Minutes of the 16th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) dated 4th December, 2020

The 16th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) was held on Friday the 4th December, 2020 under the Chairmanship of Shr., Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Maharashtra State through Video Conference at 1600 hrs. The list of the members who attended the meeting is attached herewith as Annexure-L.

The Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (Wildlife) and Member Secretary, State Board for Wildlife welcomed Hon'ble Chairman & the Chief Minister, Maharashtra State and Hon'ble Vice-Chairman & Minister (Forests), Hon'ble Minister (Environment, Tourism and Protocol) and other members of the SBWL and presented issues listed in the Agenda for discussions with the permission of the Chairman. The details of the discussions and decisions taken by the board are as follows.

Agenda No. 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the 15th meeting of the State Board for Wild Life held on 07th August, 2020

The member secretary of the board briefed that the Minutes (English and Marathi) of the 15th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) held on 7th August 2020 had been circulated to the members vide letter dated 14/09/2020. Some members suggested changes in the Minutes of Meeting (MoM) of 15th meeting of SBWL and these changes had been submitted to Government. Principal Secretary (Forests) conveyed that the changes would be considered and decision taken thereon would be circulated along with the minutes of this meeting. Members informed that the Minutes of the 14th Meeting have not been confirmed so far and in this meeting it was erroneously mentioned that the board has recommended the proposal of cement roads in the core area of Melghat Tiger Reserve and due to this National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) also recommended the proposal. However, this proposal is now under consideration of Central Empowered Committee (CEC). In response to this, member secretary clarified that while recommending the cement roads in question, NBWL had imposed certain conditions on the project authority, these conditions take care of the concerns raised by the members and since the proposal is now under consideration of CEC, the work on any of the roads in question has not been started. The members shall be communicated accordingly.





The Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (Wildlife) and Member Secretary, State Board for Wildlife welcomed Hon'ble Chairman & the Chief Minister, Maharashtra State and Hon'ble Vice-Chairman & Minister (Forests), Hon'ble Minister (Environment, Tourism and Protocol) and other members of the SBWL and presented issues listed in the Agenda for discussions with the permission of the Chairman. Some members suggested changes in the Minutes of Meeting (MoM) of 15th meeting of SBWL and these changes had been submitted to Government. Principal Secretary (Forests) conveyed that the changes would be considered and decision taken thereon would be circulated along with the minutes of this meeting. Members informed that the Minutes of the 14th Meeting have not been confirmed so far and in this meeting it was erroneously mentioned that the board has recommended the proposal of cement roads in the core area of Melghat Tiger Reserve and due to this National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) also recommended the proposal. However, this proposal is now under consideration of Central Empowered Committee (CEC). In response to this, member secretary clarified that while recommending the cement roads in question, NBWL had imposed certain conditions on the project authority, these conditions take care of the concerns raised by the members and since the proposal is now under consideration of CEC, the work on any of the roads in question has not been started. The members shall be communicated accordingly.

Minutes of the 16th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) dated 4th December, 2020

The 16th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) was held on Friday the 4th December, 2020 under the Chairmanship of Shri. Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Maharashtra State through Video Conference at 1600 hrs. The list of the members who attended the meeting is attached herewith as Annexure-I.

The Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (Wildlife) and Member Secretary, State Board for Wildlife welcomed Hon'ble Chairman & the Chief Minister, Maharashtra State and Hon'ble Vice-Chairman & Minister (Forests), Hon'ble Minister (Environment, Tourism and Protocol) and other members of the SBWL and presented issues listed in the Agenda for discussions with the permission of the Chairman. The details of the discussions and decisions taken by the board are as follows.

Agenda No. 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the 15th meeting of the State Board for Wild Life held on 07th August, 2020

The member secretary of the board briefed that the Minutes (English and Marathi) of the 15th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) held on 7th August 2020 had been circulated to the members vide letter dated 14/09/2020. Some members suggested changes in the Minutes of Meeting (MoM) of 15th meeting of SBWL and these changes had been submitted to Government. Principal Secretary (Forests) conveyed that the changes would be considered and decision taken thereon would be circulated along with the minutes of this meeting. Members informed that the Minutes of the 14th Meeting have not been confirmed so far and in this meeting it was erroneously mentioned that the board has recommended the proposal of cement roads in the core area of Melghat Tiger Reserve and due to this National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) also recommended the proposal. However, this proposal is now under consideration of Central Empowered Committee (CEC). In response to this, member secretary clarified that while recommending the cement roads in question, NBWL had imposed certain conditions on the project authority, these conditions take care of the concerns raised by the members and since the proposal is now under consideration of CEC, the work on any of the roads in question has not been started. The members shall be communicated accordingly.

- Wildlife Sanctuary (148 sq.km) and resettle it with the funds from Govt. of Telengana. Settle the rights over agricultural lands of Rudha, Sukli and Bhimkund which are located within the WLS.
- 8.3.19 Complete the proceedings under sec 19 to 25 of WPA 1972 for all PAs within two years of the notification.
- 8.3.20 Upgradation of Kolamarka reserve to Kolamarka wild buffalo sanctuary. To take up captive breeding programme of wild buffaloes.
- 8.3.21 Setting up of a committee of bird experts to review the management plans of bird sanctuaries.
- 8.3.22 Upgradation of Tillari Conservation Reserve into Tiger Reserve.
- 8.3.23 To declare Pohra-Malkhed WLS in Amravati District.
- 8.3.24 To increase the buffer area of Pench Tiger Reserve due to its reduction after declaration of Mansinghdeo WLS.
- 8.3.25 Prohibit logging operations in all CRs.
- 8.3.26 Policy decision for voluntary resettlement of villages from buffer/corridor villages of Tiger reserves.
- 8.3.27 To prepare SOP to decide the strategy to address the illegal fishing issue in Pench NP.

Issues proposed by Shri. Debi Goenka, Representative of BNHS

- 8.3.28 Widening the corridor between SGNP and Tungareshwar WLS.
- 8.3.29 Building a boundary wall along the western boundary of Tungareshwar WLS.
- 8.3.30 Implementation of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court judgment for protection of SGNP.

The Hon'ble Chairman of the Board informed that the additional issues proposed by the members as mentioned in the subject no. 8.3 (Issue no. 8.3.1 to 8.3.30) are important and will be considered at the Government level and the decision taken thereon would be informed at the earliest to the board members.

The meeting ended with the permission of the Chair after a vote of thanks to all the members of the Board.







Minutes of the 16th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) dated 4th December, 2020

The 16th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) was held on Friday the 4th December, 2020 under the Chairmanship of Shri. Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Maharashtra State through Video Conference at 1500 hrs. The list of the members who attended the meeting is attached herewith as Annexure-I.

The Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (Wildlife) and Member Secretary, State Board for Wildlife welcomed Hon'ble Chairman & the Chief Minister, Maharashtra State and Hon'ble Vice-Chairman & Minister (Forests), Hon'ble Minister (Environment, Tourism and Protocol) and other members of the SBWL and presented issues listed in the Agenda for discussions with the permission of the Chairman. The details of the discussions and decisions taken by the board are as follows.

Agenda No. 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the 15th meeting of the State Board for Wild Life held on 07th August, 2020

The member secretary of the board briefed that the Minutes (English and Marathi) of the 15th Meeting of the State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) held or 7th August 2020 had been circulated to the members vide letter dated 14/09/2020. Some members suggested changes in the Minutes of Meeting (MoM) of 15th meeting of SBWL and these changes had been submitted to Government. Principal Secretary (Forests) conveyed that the changes would be considered and decision taken thereon would be circulated along with the minutes of this meeting. Members informed that the Minutes of the 14th Meeting have not been confirmed so far and in this meeting it was erroneously mentioned that the board has recommended the proposal of cement roads in the core area of Melghat Tiger Reserve and due to this National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) also recommended the proposal. However, this proposal is now under consideration of Central Empowered Committee (CEC). In response to this, member secretary clarified that while recommending the cement roads in question, NBWL had imposed certain conditions on the project authority, these conditions take care of the concerns raised by the members and since the proposal is now under consideration of CEC, the work on any of the roads in question has not been started. The members shall be communicated accordingly.
