While examining with the forest block KML boundaries available on State Forest Department portal, the KML file of 45.50 ha. revenue land in Village Pahada was shown within the forest area of Meva Block. 2. As per the revenue records the 45.5 ha. land for CA falls in khasra nos 964,964/1, 1457,1457/10, 2070 of revenue village Pahada and the land belongs to State revenue department (copy of jamabandi enclosed). Proper analysis of the area was carried out by cross checking all adjoining block files and maps of Pahada Block, Mobi Block and Meva Block. Superimposing the revenue maps and forest maps in scale was carried out and it was found that earlier shown forest department portal KML of particular area which is now suggested by revenue authority for NFL, was wrongly incorporated.

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		3. Further, 45.5 ha of revenue land for CA in Village Pahada has been again jointly verified on ground with the revenue and forest officers and it is found that above said land belongs to the revenue department and located completely outside the forest boundary. 4. Therefore, a request for correction in KML of forest boundaries was made to the state authorities. In this regard, it has now been informed that the essential correction has been done in the forest block boundaries and the corrected forest block boundaries have been uploaded on the State Forest Department website. Earlier shown non forest land of Pahada village was excluded from updated KML of forest areas. 5. A CD containing the KML of 75 ha revenue land for CA and the KML of corrected forest block boundaries revised KML file showing this proposed non forest land is submitted herewith for your reference. It is further requested that the corrected KML forest boundaries may kindly be forwarded to the Forest Survey of India (FSI) for its uploading on the DSS portal.
2	Few settlements, small area under agriculture and existence of road are found in the proposed forest land for diversion. Moreover, encroachment in form of agriculture and the settlements are also visible just outside the boundary of proposed forest land for diversion. This requires justification and clarification.	forest and other lands and grow some agriculture crops seasonally and erect some temporary hutments. The State Forest Department time to time takes penal action against the encroachers and tries to evacuate the unauthorised possessions on the forest land.
3	As per DSS analysis, out of identified 75 ha. non-forest land for CA, 13 ha. is Moderately Dense (MDF),39 ha. is Open Forest (OF), 02	Three non forest lands comprising total 75 ha. area identified in 3 different villages were proposed by district revenue authorities for CA purpose. Some non forest land in Praptapgarh has excellent vegetation cover. It is to be noted that Pratapgarh receives around 1300 mm rainfall annually. Selected 75 ha. NFL for this project do support the vegetation growth. To compensate forest for diversion, it is always good to have forest back. Along with 45.50 ha of Pahada revenue land as CA-NFL,

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	4	remaining 21 ha is Non-forest. Further, the State Govt has submitted the site Suitability certificates intimating that the NFL proposed for CA is suitable for planting. Keeping this in view the justification for submitting details of 85 ha DFL for the purpose of CA is not understood. This needs clarification. The State Govt. has not provided the KML file of 85 ha degraded forest land identified for the purpose of CA in forest block-Sukad (RF) of village Dhawada, Tehsil- Chotisadri, District	areas. To further enrich this area with vegetation and soil moisture conservation, assisted natural regeneration (ANR) model was considered and planting of 200 plants/ha was proposed in these 75 ha non forest lands. Although, as per MoEF&CC, New Delhi guideline a C A model is to be prepared @ 1000 plants/ha. Therefore, in order to compensate the balance plants, 85 ha degraded forest land was identified wherein planting at 800 plants/ha will be carried out by the Forest Department. The User agency is agreed to bear the additional cost of compensatory afforestation. A copy of the same is attached herewith. KML of 85 ha degraded forest land has been uploaded at S. No. 09, PART-II form on PARIVESH and the same is also submitted herewith in CD.
	5	An area of 0.75 ha is proposed to be used for Roads and Buildings, however the nature of buildings proposed to	roads and buildings in the proposal, 0.71 ha will be used for roads essentially required to carry out mining activities such as extraction and transportation of mined out mineral while only 0.04 hectare (400 square metre) area is to be used for temporary portable structures such as
		be constructed has not been given. The State Govt. shall explore the possibility of carrying out building construction	workshop, storage of tools and plants, rest Shelters and small office essential on site to carry out mining activities. All these structures will be temporary in nature and will be removed at the time of closure of mining activities and before handing over the proposed forest land back to the State Forest Department. An undertaking submitted by user agency in this regard is attached here with.
