affidavit of Mr. Amitabh Gautam, Conservator of Forests, in
which it is stated as follows:-

"Para-4 That the contents of this para are admitted to the extent that Naddi area is important from tourism point of view and may hotels have been repaired being constructed purely on private lands for tourism purpose. It is vehemently denied that the hoteliers in connivance with forest staff have made road through the demarcated protected forest and for that purpose trees were cut without permission. In fact, no road is being constructed in DPF (Demarcated Protected Forest) and no trees have been cut for the said purpose. It is further submitted that there exists an age old Katcha path in Undemarcated Protected Forest (UPF) which is being used by the inhabitants/community of Mohal Dhayal in Mauza Dharamshala. This path originates from Satobari Bus Stand and terminates at Naddi and was constructed by Gram Panchayat, Bhatalla in the year 2003. (Annexed as Annexure R-3). A portion of this path measuring 166 metres in length falling in Khasra No. 103 was being surface dressed and leveled by Sh. Om Parkash S/O Sh. Roshan Lal and other inhabitants of Mohal Dhayal for which Damage Reprot No.1/741 dated 01.05.2012 (Annexed as Annexure R-4) was issued against Sh. Om Parkash S/o Sh. Roshan Lal. This damage report has been compounded under section 68 of IFA, 1927 and compensation rates approved by C.F. Dharamshala vide his Memo No. C.XII-I/Vol-VI/3749-51 dated 24.07.2010 and subsequent Memo No. C.XII-I/4248-50 dated 09.08.2010 by realizing an amount of Rs.29,830 only

which stands remitted into Govt. Treasury. The rest of the contents of this para are denied, as no tree has either been removed or dried along the portion of the above mentioned kaacha path and no debris or much have been thrown on the trees."

We are shocked to see this reply being filed by Conservator of Forests. From the photographs annexed with the petition, it is more than obvious that the road, which is being constructed, is not a pedestrian path but a full fledged road. How could the villagers or anybody else have constructed this road through the land which is admittedly a forest land without the knowledge of the forest officials? What action the Conservator of Forests has taken against the Forest Guard and the Range Officer concerned? Therefore, Mr. Amitabh Gautam, is directed to personally visit the spot and verify these facts and file a fresh affidavit by the next date before this Court. List the matter on 4th January, 2013.

2. At the outset we may notice that even as per this affidavit lot of construction was going on. The affidavit now filed is also similar to the earlier affidavit though some more details have been given. From the new affidavit filed it is apparent that in addition to some villagers allegedly widening and maintaining the path a huge retaining wall of 65 meters

had also been constructed. We are not at all satisfied with the averment that since some forest official was on leave and another forest official was given dual charge these violations of forest laws could not be found out. The area in question is not a remote area. There are houses and hotels around this entire area. This area is very close to the main Dharamshala - Meclodganj road and is a highly frequented area.

3. By the next date the Conservator of Forests, Dharamshala, should explain to us why action has not been taken against the erring forest official(s). Even now we find in the affidavit that the Conservator of Forests is trying to cover up certain things. We in our last order had specifically noticed that para -4 of the reply was wrong because from the photographs which were annexed with the petition it was more than obvious that the road which was constructed was not a pedestrian path but a full fledged road. We, therefore, direct the Chief Engineer, HPPWD, Dharamshala to personally visit the area and under his supervision he will get the entire road measured and shall depict the width of the road in the affidavit to be filed by the next date.

4. It shall be the responsibility of the Conservator of Forests and other forest officials to ensure that no further construction of the road is permitted unless all approvals are obtained as required under the law and by the next date we

According to the petitioner, two roads, shown in map at Pages-139 and 141, have been constructed at the behest of respondents No. 9 and 10, who would be the beneficiaries as the road ends near the place of construction put up by the said respondents. In other words, the petitioner asserts that the said respondents instigated the villagers to insist for construction of road, referred to in the map at Pages 139 and 141 respectively, to subserve their ulterior design. The fact that respondents No. 9 and 10 have put up construction in and around the said area, is not in serious doubt. The fact remains that it has come on record that around 150 roads have been constructed without obtaining prior permission of the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Government of India, which is the pre-condition for using the land in forest area for non-forest activity. The Ministry of Environment & Forest is already ^{seized} ceased of this issue. In that case, we expect the said Ministry to respond to the course of action, to be adopted against the erring officials as well as the beneficiaries of the illegal and

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inclined to move a formal proposal to the Ministry of Environment to ratify the action of construction of those roads undertaken by the State Government in good faith on such conditions, as may be permissible in law, including by imposing environmental damage compensatory costs and further direction to put up retention walls in certain areas, which need strengthening and upon compliance of such conditions, a formal ex-post facto sanction can be granted in respect of those roads.

2. We are inclined to accept this submission in public interest, provided such authority vests with the Ministry of Environment in law. If such proposal is moved by the State Government, appropriate decision thereon can be taken within reasonable time and preferably within six weeks from its receipt. The Ministry of Environment will be free to examine the said proposals uninfluenced by the orders passed by this Court in COPC No. 56 of 2009 or any other order passed in the companion proceedings. The decision taken by the Ministry of Environment, however, will be subject to the outcome of the present proceedings and can be given effect to only after the Court so directs.

3. We make it clear that if the State is required to pay compensatory costs, if so ordered by the Ministry of Environment, Government of India, the manner of recovery of such compensatory costs and from persons responsible for the situation can be evolved by the State Government and even that proposal can be submitted to the Court, if so required.

3. The learned Assistant Solicitor General of India submits that the MoEF, Government of India, has no objection to examine the proposal initiated by the State Government, but the officials of the said Ministry are finding difficulty in working out the final arrangement and, more particularly, because of the directions given by the learned Single Judge of this Court in order, dated 28th August, 2009, in COPC No. 56 of 2009.

4. Keeping in mind this grievance of the respondent-Authorities, we thought it appropriate to direct the Registry to circulate the papers concerning COPC No. 56 of 2009. Although, the order has not been challenged by any Authority or party to the proceedings, in the peculiar facts of the present case, it has become essential to consider whether the direction contained in the said order should be kept in abeyance or otherwise.

5. the State Government cannot and should not brook delay. The issue regarding ratification of the action of the State Government regarding construction of 841 road projects across the State of Himachal Pradesh will have to be resolved in the first place in conformity with the requirement of law, which the State Government as well as the MoEF has ~~also~~ assured the Court to consider the same in right earnest.

6. In these peculiar facts, we are inclined to hold that it is but appropriate that the direction given in COPC No. 56 of 2009, in order dated 28th August, 2009, should be kept in abeyance to enable the concerned departments to take a final decision on the proposal submitted by the State Government.

7. Counsel appearing for the department as well as the State Government have submitted that the Authorities would report about the possibility and feasibility of granting approval or otherwise on the proposal of the State before the next date of hearing, which can be scheduled after three weeks. In the circumstances, hearing of these matters is deferred till 5th September, 2013, to enable the MoEF, Government of India and the State Government to work out a holistic plan for not only restoration of the environment, besides quantifying the compensatory costs to be paid by the State Government.
