2.	In check list SI no. 07, the extent of Revenue Forest and that of Reserve Forest have been mentioned as 166.29 ha & 176.58 ha respectively. But in the Part-II & Site Inspection Report, the extent of Revenue & RF have been mentioned as 166.28 and 176.59 ha respectively. The discrepancies, in this regard needs to be clarified / rectified.	The extent of Reserve forest (i.e. 176.59 ha and Revenue forest (i.e. 166.28 ha mentioned in part II and site inspection report is correct. Further, the user agency has submitted the Gazette Notification (GoI) of land acquisition for Dip-side Manoharpur coal block, the area of Reserve forest is 176.59 ha (i.e. Hunderkhole RF and Kanupahad RF). Topo map of CA land – The user agency has submitted Topo map of CA land on scale of 1:50000 which is attached as Annexure 10 (Vol. II - Drawing/Map file).
DGPS map of the CA land- The user agency has submitted the DGPS map of CA land on scale of 1:3960 which is attached as Annexure 11 (Vol. II - Drawing/Map file).
The land identified for compensatory afforestation are within the Division boundary as seen with KML file.
The proposal for diversion of forest land over 342.870 Ha including diversion of Reserve forest (176.59 Ha) and Revenue forest
(166.28 Ha) for the development of Dip side Manoharpur Coal Mine Block of OCPL. Earlier, in Site Inspection Report at Sl. No. 8 due to typographical error, the Reserve Forest area i.e. 176.59 has been left which should be considered.
About 12,562 nos. of trees (Sample tree enumeration list, enclosed with FDP at Page no 406-409) has been enumerated over the
forest land proposed for diversion and sample tree enumeration over non forest govt. land is under progress for which user agency has furnished an undertaking as mentioned above in point no. 8.
Species wise abstract of sample tree enumeration over forest land has been furnished in the FDP at Page no 407-408 . Felling of trees over forest land and non

Since the project is essential for the development of coal mine to meet the fuel requirement of power plants, the adverse impact on ecosystem may be considered insignificant. Further, the user agency has submitted an undertaking regarding the deposit of cost of NPV and cost of CA scheme which is attached in FDP as Annexure 12 and Annexure 13 respectively at Page no 309 & 400. Moreover, an undertaking regarding the deposit of additional NPV, as would be assessed by State Government (GoO) / Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has been submitted by user agency which is attached in FDP as Annexure 14 at Page no 398
12.	The PDF file of the proposal in C.D. form has not been submitted.	The U/A has submitted the PDF file of the proposal in CD form which is attached as Annexure 15 with FDP file (Page no. 394).
13.	In the RR Plan, it has been stated that there are 230 nos. of displaced families & 525 nos. of affected families due to the above project. But in the site inspection report against Sl. No. 14, i.e. the position of displacement of people and adequacy of rehabilitation, if any is reported to be Nil. Needs clarification.	The user agency has intimated that earlier figures was wrongly mentioned which may be ignored. As per approved Mining Plan (Rev III) of Manoharpur and Dip-side Manoharpur Coal Block; the total displaced families are 190 nos. (i.e. number of Schedule caste: 4, Scheduled Tribe Families: 127, Other families: 59; total 127 nos. in village Kathfali and 63 nos. in village Parmanandpur respectively). The details of same have been furnished in FDP at Page no 18 A-3.
		Further user agency has intimated that Socio Economic Survey of the displaced families / affected families due to proposed project is under progress. An undertaking in this regard has been submitted by user agency which is attached in FDP as Annexure 17 at Page no. 396.

15.	It should be specifically reported whether any court case is pending against this project or not.	The user agency has submitted that no court cases are pending towards the said project. An undertaking in this regard has been submitted by user agency which is attached in FDP as Annexure 16 at Page no 397.	
16.	All the documents furnished in the DP should be authenticated by the DFO. Although instruction in this regard has been issued earlier, the same is not adhered to.
