

Site Inspection Report

Site Inspection by The Divisional Forest Officer, Jaintia Hills Territorial Division, Jowai on the Proposal for Diversion of Forest Land **4.869 hectares** for road widening was done on the 11th May, 2015. The Project site is bordering with the Narpuh Wildlife Sanctuary. The requirement of Forest land as proposed by the user agency in **Col. 2 of Part – I** involves no forest diversion from the Narpuh Wildlife Sanctuary except from unclassified Forest falling under deemed private forest land (under the control and management of the Jaintia Hills Autonomous District Council). The Project proposal is within the existing Right of Way (i.e. 7 m Existing Black topping between 141.500 Km-145 Km and 7-10 m between 160 KM-167.100 Km) of the existing road of NH-44.. Enumeration and valuation of trees species was done as per rules/regulation in force. There is no protected archaeological/heritage site/defence establishment located in the area. Presently no works in violations of the Forest Conservation Act is taking place. Therefore, the project is recommended for its acceptance subject to observance of applicable rules/regulation and Forest Conservation Act, 1980.
