

No. (i)	<p>In compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal, Eastern Bench, Kolkata dated 23.07.2024 in O.A. No. 86/2024/EZ and IA No. 32/2024/EZ, the Government of Assam constituted an Internal Committee and a District-level Committee vide Notification Nos. E. No. 535050/15 dated 17.09.2024 and ECF No. 535050/852 dated 17.09.2024 (Annexure-I), respectively, for preparation and monitoring of District Survey Reports (DSRs). Accordingly, the District Survey Report of Divisional Forest Officer, Nagaon South Division, Hojai has been prepared (excerpt Annexure-II) strictly in accordance with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court vide order dated 10.11.2021 passed in Civil Appeal Nos. 3661-3662 of 2020 (State of Bihar & Others vs. Pawan Kumar & Others) (Annexure-III) and thereafter examined and duly approved by the State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) in its meeting held on 29.08.2025 (Annexure-IV). <u>An expert consultant M/s Gaheli Environmental Labortoty certified, Accredited by NABL.</u></p> <p>The approved DSR of Hojai District comprehensively assesses the availability of minor mineral resources, including stone and specifies category-wise reserves, replenishment potential, environmental sensitivity and scientifically determined sustainable extraction limits. The Bheleuguri Stone Mahal is one of the identified stone-bearing areas within the district and its mineral potential, environmental constraints and carrying capacity have been duly considered as part of the district-level assessment.</p> <p>The long-term sustainable mining for Bheleuguri Stone Mahal is envisaged to be implemented strictly within the framework of the approved DSR. The annual and lease-period extraction shall be regulated in accordance with the mineable reserves and sustainable quantities assessed in the DSR, ensuring that mining activity remains within the ecological carrying capacity of the area. Further, site-specific Mining Plan is already prepared and approved by the competent authority, incorporating safeguards prescribed under the Sustainable Sand Mining Management Guidelines, 2016, EMGSM-2020 (as applicable) and other statutory provisions.</p> <p>Thus, the approved DSR of Hojai District serves as the foundational long-term sustainable mining framework for Bheleuguri Stone Mahal, ensuring optimum and regulated extraction</p>

	of stone in an environmentally sound and sustainable manner, while safeguarding surrounding habitations, drainage and ecological features.
No. (ii)	<p>The Chief Conservator of Forests & Nodal Officer (FC Act), Assam, vide letter dated 03.10.2025, requested the Wildlife Institute of India (WII), to provide scientific and technical support for assessment of wildlife-related aspects of the proposed Bheleuguri Stone Mahal project. Accordingly, a team of experts from WII carried out a detailed site inspection of the proposed stone mining area on 07.12.2025 in association with the Nagaon Division (copy enclosed).</p> <p>As per the findings of the Site Inspection Report submitted by WII, the proposed Bheleuguri Stone Mahal is located within Doboka Reserve Forest and is situated at a considerable distance from notified Protected Areas, tiger corridors and elephant corridors. The nearest elephant corridor is located at a distance of approximately 51 km and no designated elephant movement corridor passes through or near the proposed quarry area. During the site inspection, no evidence of regular elephant movement or use of the proposed quarry area as a corridor was recorded.</p> <p>Based on field observations, secondary data and expert assessment, WII has provided a set of site-specific mitigation measures and wildlife conservation recommendations to minimise potential impacts of the proposed mining activities.</p> <p>The recommendations include, inter alia, installation of physical barriers/fencing to prevent wildlife entry into the quarry area, regulation of blasting activities including avoidance during night hours and sensitive periods, dust and noise mitigation measures, green belt development using native species, habitat restoration in adjoining areas, strict regulation of vehicular movement to prevent wildlife mortality and measures to minimise light pollution. These mitigation measures shall be incorporated into the mining operations and shall be implemented under the supervision of the Forest Department.</p> <p>It is submitted that the project proponent shall comply with all wildlife mitigation measures recommended by WII and any additional conditions that may be prescribed by the Ministry.</p>
No. (iii)	The KML files, a list of the existing and proposed mines in the Doboka Reserved Forest alongwith Govt. of India, MoEF & CC Final Approval letters are enclosed herewith.

It is requested that the aforementioned details may be communicated to the Government of India, MoEF&CC, New Delhi for further processing of the proposal.

Foreword

In Pursuance to the Gazette Notification, published by Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change (MoEF&CC), the Government of India, Notification No. S. O. 141(E) Appendix-X, Dated 15.01.2016 and S.O. 3611 (E) New Delhi 25th July 2018 laid procedure for preparation of District Survey Report of Sand mining or river bed mining and minor mineral other than Sand mining or river bed mining.

The notification and guidelines suggest the preparation of District Survey Report for the better management of the Sand and Silt extraction. The main purpose of District Survey Report (DSR) is "identification of areas of aggradations or deposition where mining can be allowed; and identification of areas of erosion and proximity to infrastructural structures and installations where mining should be prohibited". This District survey report of Hojai District, Assam State has been prepared as per the guidelines and notification, for the better management of River Bed Mining (Sand & Silt) and Minor Minerals other than River Bed Mining (Stone Materials & Brick Earth).

Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining (EMGSM) January 2020, issued by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change is prepared in consideration of various orders/directions issued by Hon'ble NGT in matters pertaining to illegal sand mining and also based on the reports submitted by expert committees and investigation teams. This DSR has been prepared in conformity with the S O 141 (E), S O 3611 (E), and other sand mining guidelines published by MOEF&CC from time to time as well as the requirement specified in AMMCR, 2013.

The main objective of the preparation of District Survey Report (as per the Sustainable Sand Mining Guideline) is to ensure the following:

- (i) Identification of areas of aggradations or deposition where mining can be allowed;
- (ii) Identification of areas of erosion and proximity to infrastructural structures and installations where mining should be prohibited and calculation of annual rate of replenishment and allowing time for replenishment after mining in that area;
- (iii) Identification of mineral wealth in the district;
- (iv) Identification of areas where no mining zone.

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- (i) "Having regard to the findings at (a), (b) and (c) above, we direct the State to undertake further exercise for preparation of a fresh DSR for the Banka district.

- (ii) As the DEIAA is not functioning as a consequence of the decision of the Tribunal in *Satendra Pandey* (supra), the DSR shall be prepared through a consultant(s) accredited by the National Accreditation Board of Education and Training/Quality Control Council of India in terms of O.M. of MoEF & CC dated 16.03.2010.

- (iii) The DSR so prepared shall be submitted to the District Magistrate who shall verify the DSR only in respect of the relevant facts pertaining to the physical and geographical features of the district which shall be distinct from the scientific findings based on the parameters

prescribed in the SSMMG- 2016. After such verification, the District Magistrate shall forward the DSR for examination and evaluation by the State Expert Appraisal Committee (SEAC) having regard to the fact that the SEIAA comprises of technical/scientific experts. The SEAC after appraisal of the report shall forward it to the SEIAA for consideration and approval if it meets all scientific/technical requirements.

(iv) While preparing the DSR, the MoEF & CC Accredited Agency/Consultant shall scrupulously follow the procedure and the parameters laid down under the SSMMG-2016 and EMGSM-2020 read in sync with each other."

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2. The appellant-State of Bihar has assailed the said judgment and order dated 14th October 2020, on various grounds.

3. Shri Atmaram Nadkarni, learned Senior Counsel appearing on behalf of the State of Bihar submitted that the Tribunal has grossly erred in holding that unless the State Expert Appraisal Committee (hereinafter referred to as "SEAC") and the State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (hereinafter referred to as "SEIAA") grants approval to the District Survey Report (hereinafter referred to as "DSR") for the purpose of mining of sand, the same cannot be carried out. He submitted that the Tribunal has further held that the very invitation of the tenders without preparing the DSR in accordance with the judgment of the Tribunal in the case of ***Satendra Pandey v. Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change and Another***¹ could not have been done. He submitted that after the tenders are invited in accordance with the DSR prepared by the District Level Committee, the

successful bidder will be required to prepare a mining plan and unless such a mining plan is approved by SEAC and SEIAA, the Environmental Clearance would not be granted and in turn, mining activities cannot be carried out. He submitted that the finding of the Tribunal is like putting the cart before the horse. He further submitted that the Tribunal has also grossly erred in holding that the DSRs prepared by the State were without following the requisite procedure and without considering the relevant factors. He submitted that not only the procedure as prescribed under the relevant rules and regulations was complied with, but the voluminous material in support of the same was also placed on record before the Tribunal. He submitted that the Tribunal has not taken into consideration the said material. He therefore submitted that the judgment and order passed by the Tribunal dated 14th October 2020, needs to be set aside and the State needs to be permitted to finalize the tenders received by it.

4. Shri Nadkarni further submitted that on account of the orders passed by the Tribunal, the old lessees are continuing

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with the mining activities by paying a meagre amount to the State Government. He therefore submitted that on account of this, a huge loss would be caused to the public exchequer. In the alternative, he submitted that the State, at least, needs to be permitted to undertake mining activities through Bihar State Mining Corporation until the DSRs are finalized in accordance with the judgment of the Tribunal.

5. Shri P.S. Patwalia, learned Senior Counsel appearing on behalf of the original applicant vehemently opposed the appeals. He submitted that the Tribunal has rightly held that the DSRs are not prepared in accordance with the relevant rules as well as policy guidelines. He submitted that it is apparently clear that the State has taken into consideration only financial enrichment without considering the environmental aspects.

6. Though, we have heard the learned counsel for both the parties at length on merits, we find that it will be appropriate

that the appeals are kept pending for further consideration and till then, certain interim orders are passed.

7. It cannot be in dispute that though the developmental activities are not stalled, the environmental issues are also required to be addressed. A balanced approach of sustainable development ensuring environmental safeguards, needs to be resorted to. At the same time, it also cannot be ignored that when legal mining is banned, it gives rise to mushroom growth of illegal mining, resulting into clashes between sand mafias, criminalization and at times, loss of human lives. It also cannot be disputed that sand is required for construction of public infrastructural projects as well as public and private construction activities. A total ban on legal mining, apart from giving rise to illegal mining, also causes huge loss to the public exchequer.

8. Taking into consideration these aspects of the matter, we propose to issue certain interim directions.

9. The Tribunal, in the case of *Satendra Pandey* (supra), has found that the notification dated 15th January 2016, which provided Environmental Clearance to be given by the District Environment Impact Assessment Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "DEIAA") was not in consonance with the judgment of this Court in the case of *Deepak Kumar v. State of Haryana and Others*². The Tribunal therefore in *Satendra Pandey* (supra), had directed Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (hereinafter referred to as "MoEF and CC) to take steps to revise the procedure laid down in the notification dated 15th January 2016. It is to be noted that MoEF and CC, in accordance with the directions of the Tribunal, had issued Enforcement and Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining (hereinafter to referred to as "the 2020 guidelines") in the month of January 2020. Chapter 4 of the 2020 guidelines deals with identification of possible sand mining sources and preparation of DSR. It will be relevant to refer to Clause 4.1.1 (a), (o) and (p) of the 2020 guidelines:-

2 (2012) 4 SCC 629

"4.1 Identification of possible sand mining sources and preparation of District Survey Report (DSR)

4.1.1 Preparation of District Survey Report.

a) District Survey Report for sand mining shall be prepared before the auction/e-auction/grant of the mining lease/Letter of Intent (Loi) by Mining department or department dealing the mining activity in respective states.

o) Potential site for mining having its impact on the forest, protected area, habitation, bridges etc, shall be avoided. For this, a sub-divisional committee may be formed which after the site visit shall decide its suitability for mining. The list of mining lease after the recommendation of the Committee needs to be defined in the following format given in as **Annexure-II**. The Sub-Divisional Committee after the site visit shall make a recommendation on the site for its suitability of mining and also records the reason for selecting the mining lease in the Patta land. The details regarding cluster and contiguous cluster needs to be provided as in **Annexure-III**. The details of the transportation need to be provided as in **Annexure IV**.

p) **Public consultation**-The Comments of the various stakeholders may be sought on the list of mining lease to be auctioned. The State Government shall give an advertisement in the local and national newspaper for seeking comments of the general

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public on the list of mining' lease included in the DSR. The DSR should be placed in the public domain for at least one month from the date of publication of the advertisement for obtaining comments of the general public. The comments so received shall be placed before the sub-divisional committee for active consideration. The final list of sand mining areas [leases to be granted on riverbed & Patta land/Khatedari land, de-siltation location (ponds/lakes/dams), M-Sand Plants (alternate source of sand)] after the public hearing needs to be defined in the final DSR in the format as per **Annexure-V**. The details regarding cluster and contiguous cluster needs to be provided in **Annexure-VI**. The details of the transportation need to be provided in **Annexure-VII**."

10. It could thus be seen that in accordance with the 2020 guidelines, the DSR is required to be prepared before the auction/e-auction/grant of mining lease by Mining Department or Department dealing with mining activity in the respective States. It is further provided that the potential site for mining having its impact on the forest, protected area, habitation and bridges should be avoided. For this, a sub-divisional committee is required to be formed which, after the site visit, is required to decide regarding the suitability of the sites for mining. The

sub-divisional committee is further required to record its reasons for selecting the mining lease in the patta land. Various details are required to be given in the annexures appended to the said policy.

11. It is further to be noted that Appendix-X of the notification dated 15th January 2016, issued by MoEF and CC also provides for composition of the sub-divisional committee:-

“A Sub-Divisional Committee comprising of Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Officers from Irrigation department, State Pollution Control Board or Committee, Forest department, Geology or mining officer shall visit each site for which environmental clearance has been applied for and make recommendation on suitability of site for mining or prohibition thereof.”

12. It is to be noted that with the advent of modern technology, various technological gadgets like Drones and satellite imaging etc. can be used for identification of the potential sites and preparation of the DSR and also to check misuse and unauthorized mining.

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13. We further find that when the 2020 guidelines as well as the notification issued by MoEF and CC of 2016 itself provide for constitution of sub-divisional committees comprising of the officers of the State Government from various Departments for identification of the potential sites for mining, there would be no necessity of the DSRs being prepared through private consultants as directed by the Tribunal in the impugned order. The sub-divisional committee consists of various officers from Revenue Department, Irrigation Department, State Pollution Control Board, Forest Department and Geology Mining Department of the State Government. They are better equipped to visit the sites and prepare the draft DSR for the concerned district. Apart from that, preparation of DSR through private consultants would also unnecessarily burden the public exchequer. We are therefore of the view that the direction in that regard issued by the Tribunal requires to be modified. We are further of the considered view that until the DSRs are finalized and granted approval by SEAC and SEIAA, it is appropriate that certain necessary arrangements are permitted

so that the State can continue with legal mining activities. This apart from preventing illegal mining activities, would also ensure that the public exchequer is not deprived of its share in legalized mining.

14. We therefore find it appropriate to substitute the directions issued by the Tribunal vide judgment and order dated 14th October 2020, with the following directions:-

- (i) The exercise of preparation of DSR for the purpose of mining in the State of Bihar in all the districts shall be undertaken afresh. The draft DSRs shall be prepared by the sub-divisional committees consisting of the Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Officers from Irrigation Department, State Pollution Control Board or Committee, Forest Department, Geological or mining officer. The same shall be prepared by undertaking site visits and also by using modern technology. The said draft DSRs shall be prepared within a

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period of 6 weeks from the date of this order. After the draft DSRs are prepared, the District Magistrate of the concerned District shall forward the same for examination and evaluation by the SEAC. The same shall be examined by the SEAC within a period of 6 weeks and its report shall be forwarded to the SEIAA within the aforesaid period of 6 weeks from the receipt of it. The SEIAA will thereafter consider the grant of approval to such DSRs within a period of 6 weeks from the receipt thereon;

- (ii) Needless to state that while preparing DSRs and the appraisal thereof by SEAC and SEIAA, it should be ensured that a strict adherence to the procedure and parameters laid down in the policy of January 2020 should be followed;
- (iii) Until further orders, we permit the State Government to carry on mining activities

through Bihar State Mining Corporation for which it may employ the services of the contractors. However, while doing so, the State Government shall ensure that all environmental concerns are taken care of and no damage is caused to the environment.

Background:

The proposed stone quarry is situated in Bheleuguri village, within the Doboka Reserve Forest under Kathiatoli Range of Nagaon Forest Division in Hojai District, Assam. The proposed Bheleuguri Stone Mahal project covers a total area of 5.11 ha, of which 4.14 ha is designated for mining operations, 0.86 ha for safety zone and 0.11 ha for approach road. The proposed quarry aims to produce stone to meet the local demand, supplying raw material to stone crusher units and catering to government, semi-government and private agencies for civil construction works.

As per the directions of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, to mitigate the impact of the proposed mining activities on wildlife including elephants a comprehensive Wildlife Management Plan for the landscape in consultation with institute of repute should be prepared and submitted (**Annexure 1**). In this context, the Chief Conservator of Forests & Nodal Officer (FC Act) Government of Assam, vide official communication dated 03.10.2025 requested the Wildlife Institute of India to provide scientific and technical support in preparing the WMP for the proposed mining project in Nagaon Forest Division (**Annexure 2**). Since the proposed mining project in the Nagaon Forest division is relatively small, and falls within ecologically sensitive landscape which is regularly used by elephants and other wildlife species, a detailed site inspection was proposed to understand the site specific ecological characteristics, wildlife presence and potential impacts of mining operations (**Annexure 3**). WII constituted a team to undertake the site inspection and provide inputs regarding the proposed mining project in the Nagaon Forest Division of Assam.

The WII team comprising of Dr. G.V. Gopi, Scientist - F & Nodal Officer, Conservation Advisory and Policy Cell, Dr. Frank S.J.D, Scientific Consultant, visited the proposed site on 07/12/2025 to evaluate the potential ecological implications and impacts of mining operations. The site inspection was collaboratively done by the WII team with the officials from the Forest Department led by Shri. Rajendra G. Garawad, CCF & Nodal Officer (FC Act), DFO, Nagaon Division, Forest staffs and the project proponent (**Fig.1&2**).

Project Area:


The proposed mining project - Bheleuguri Stone Mahal falls inside the Doboka Reserve Forest, under Kathiatoli Range of Nagaon Forest Division, Assam. The Doboka Reserve Forest is located in the southern part of the Hojai District. The physiography of Hojai District is predominantly characterized by an extensive alluvial plain that constitutes the major portion of the region's landscape. The district is surrounded by the foot hills of East & West Karbi Anglong and Dima hasao district in the east, west and southern side and Nagaon district lies in the northern and western side. The Doboka Reserve Forest is an ecologically significant area within the Nagaon Forest Division, providing habitat for diverse floral and faunal species. The Doboka Reserve Forest forms part of the notified Kaziranga- Karbi Anglong Elephant Reserve (ER) and proposed mining project falls within the ER (**Fig.3**). The Kaziranga – Karbi Anglong Elephant Reserve encompasses reserve forest and Protected Areas in Eastern Assam Wildlife forest division, Golaghat, Karbi Anglong East, Nagaon and Nagaon South Forest Divisions. It is a contiguous habitat with the southern boundary of the reserve bordering with the Dhansiri-Lungding Elephant Reserve in Assam. The Elephant Reserve is critical for the conservation of elephants within the Kaziranga - Karbi Anglong landscape and for mitigating human - elephant conflict in its fringe areas. The area on the foot hill were the mines are located are degraded and affected by previous mines activity. The proposed diversion project is for extraction of stone and boulder to meet the demand of government infrastructure projects and employment generation.

Sir,

This has got reference to the State Govt letter No. FRS.148/2017/37 dated 22.06.2017 on the subject mentioned above, seeking prior approval of the Central Government in accordance with Section 2 of the FCA, 1980.

After careful consideration of the proposal, In-Principle approval was granted vide this office letter of even number dated 25.01.2018 subject to fulfillment of certain conditions. The State Government has furnished compliance report in respect of the conditions stipulated in the In-Principle Approval and has requested the Central Government to grant final approval.

In this connection and on the basis of the compliance report furnished by the State Government No. FRS.27/Nodal/Proposal/Bipin Stone Mahal/Nagaon dated 26.03.2018, No. FRS.148/2017/107 dated 14.11.2018 and confirmation of Ad-hoc CAMPA, New Delhi letter No 1-4/2014-CAMPA dated 29.10.2018, 'Final Approval' of the Central Government is hereby granted under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for diversion of 1.0 hectare of forest land for operation of Bipin Stone Mahal under Nagaon Division in favour of Md. Ziaur Rahman, Nagaon for a period of 5 (five) years from the date of the issue of this approval for the annual extraction of a maximum of 10000 m³ quantity as per the Environment Clearance given by District Environment Impact Assessment Authority, Hojai, Assam vide letter No. HJF01/2017/316 dated 25.08.2017 subject to the following conditions:

- (1) The legal status of the forest land shall remain unchanged.
- (2) The State Forest Deptt shall raise compensatory afforestation over 1.0 Ha Monglai Phonglo village under Garampani Range of Dima Hasao District of

Assam as per the fund deposited by the User Agency & scheme furnished by the State Govt.

- (3) Additional amount of the NPV of the diverted forest land, if any, becoming due after revision of rates by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India shall be charged and collected by the State Government from the User Agency.
- (4) The State Govt. shall take all precautionary measures to ensure that the neighboring forests are not adversely impacted due to quarry operations.
- (5) The user agency shall not remove Stone/Boulders/Bajri etc. in a way to expose area to soil erosion and they shall also take all suitable measures to prevent probable erosion as well as land slips due to quarry operation or removal of stones.
- (6) No labour camps shall be set up over the diverted forest land or in the nearby Reserve Forest for the labour involved in the extraction works, and user agency shall ensure that no illicit removal of forest produce takes place surrounding their quarry site.
- (7) No stone crusher shall be set up near National Highway or near quarry site without proper permission under relevant rules from concerned competent authorities.
- (8) No removal of stone/forest produce shall be done before sunrise and after sunset.
- (9) There shall not be any tree felling and removal of natural forest beyond lease area of 1ha. Surrounding forest shall not be used for parking of trucks, etc or for any ancillary purpose of mining.
- (10) The user agency shall not make any fresh approach road over any part of forest land, but may use existing forest roads after due permission of competent Officer of Forest Department.

- (17) All other clearances / NOCs under different rules / regulations / local laws and under Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 as required vide

MoEF, New Delhi guideline No. 11-9/1998-FC(Pt) dated 03.08.2009 shall be complied with.

- (18) Any other conditions as may be found appropriate in future for the betterment of environment & wildlife, may be imposed by North Eastern Regional Office, MoEF &CC, Shillong.
- (19) This approval can be revoked, if the above conditions of approval are not complied to the satisfaction of the North Eastern Regional Office, Shillong.


