4. The Committee deliberated the proposal based on the information provided/presented by the proponent. After deliberation, the Committee has suggested the construction shall be strictly in accordance with the provisions of the CRZ Notification, 2011, as amended from time to time and as recommended by MCZMA (as project received in MCZMA before CZMP 2019 approval). It was also

- ii. Coastal road in CRZ area will be mostly on stilts and EAC suggested that it should be as per CRZ Notification 2011.
- iii. Shift in location of first and second rotary and connector proposed by the PP is has considerably reduced the impact of the project on mangrove.
- iv. The residential colonies are linked with coastal road by connecters/spurs to reduce traffic congestion in residential area.
- v. The Committee suggested that for ensuring safe crossing of the school students near DAV School and DPS School necessary provisions for Subways or Foot Over Bridge, whichever is suitable option, should be made and noise barriers should be provided, for which PP agreed and has agreed to submit an undertaking to this effect.
- vi. No future expansion of coastal road is permitted and agreed by PP.
- 5. In response, the proponent has agreed the same and submitted the undertakings in this regard *vide* letter dated 14/06/2024. The Committee has considered the same and found satisfactory while approving the minutes. The Committee after detailed deliberations and considering the submissions made by the project proponent recommended the proposal for CRZ Clearance as per CRZ Notification 2011 subject to certain specific conditions, as stipulated during its 362nd meeting held on 14/06/2024 other than general conditions.
- 6. Based on the recommendation of the Maharashtra Coastal Zone Management Authority and considering the submissions made by the project proponent, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, in acceptance of the recommendations of the Expert Appraisal Committee (CRZ), hereby accords CRZ Clearance to the project for 'Coastal Road from Jalmarg, Sector 16, Kharghar to Sector 11 in CBD & Balance link between Sector 15 CBD to Water transport Terminal Nerul, Navi Mumbai by M/s City and Industrial Development Corporation of Maharashtra Ltd (CIDCO)' under the provisions of the CRZ Notification, 2011 and amendments thereto, subject to the compliance of terms and conditions as under:

"The EAC noted that the Project Proponent has given undertaking that the data and information given in the application and enclosures are true to the best of his knowledge and belief and no information has been suppressed in the EIA / EMP report. If any part of the data / information submitted is found to be false / misleading at any stage, the project will be rejected and Environmental and or CRZ Clearance given, if any, will be revoked at the risk and cost of the project proponent."

The proposal was earlier considered by EAC in its 355th meeting held on 05/02/2024; wherein, considering the damage to mangroves, the Committee advised the proponent to consider the 3 alternate alignments and change in structural design of the on best proposed coastal road and Long Span Bridge / Cable-Stayed Bridges with minimal destruction of mangroves as already approved by the EAC for Mumbai i.e. Construction of Bridge from Lagoon Road to Infinity mall in P/N ward by MCGM. The EAC also suggested submit road design detailed information, traffic plan along with Noise barrier Plan and proposed Parking Plan. In response, the proponent agreed to assess the alternate alignments of proposed coastal road and structural change in proposed design. Further, the Committee recommended site inspection for assessing the possible alignment with minimal destruction of mangroves. Accordingly, the Committee deferred the proposal in its 355th meeting.

2. Accordingly, site inspection was done by Sub-Committee of EAC on 07/03/2024 and proponent has submitted the desired information on PARIVESH



portal. Subsequently, the proposal was deliberated EAC in its 361st meeting held on 05/04/2024; wherein EAC deliberated the site inspection report of Sub-Committee along with observations and same has been accepted by EAC.

- 3. After detailed deliberation, the Committee noted that PP has submitted their response and made the presentation before the EAC as per the suggestions made by the Sub-Committee Members during the site visit. However, some issues raised by the Sub-Committee in the site visit report have not been addressed during the current presentation. Therefore, the Committee advises the PP to submit their response as per the issues raised/suggestions made in the Sub Committees site visit report and carryout revision in the alignment/design of the road wherever required as per suggestions duly ensuring all needed safety standards as per rules. Accordingly, the Committee deferred the proposal in its 361st meeting held on 05/04/2024.
- 4. In response, proponent has submitted the information as suggested by EAC on PARIVIESH on 15/05/2024. Accordingly, the proposal has been considered in the present meeting and the Project Proponent (M/s City and Industrial Development Corporation of Maharashtra Ltd.) along with his EIA consultant (M/s Aditya Environmental Services Pvt. Ltd.) have made a presentation on above said proposal and informed the following salient features of the proposal, including the details provided in the application of the project, to EAC:

It was observed by the Committee that:

The PP has explored 5 alternative alignments as per the suggestions made by the Sub-Committee and finalised the alignment which has least impact.

ii. Coastal road in CRZ area will be mostly on stilts and suggested, it should be as per CRZ Notification 2011.

iii. The residential colonies are linked with coastal road by connecters/spurs to reduce traffic congestion in residential area and noise barriers were provided near DAV School and DPS School.

iv. The Committee suggested that for ensuring safe crossing of the school students necessary provisions for Subways or Foot Over Bridge, whichever is suitable option, should be made for which PP agreed and has agreed to submit an undertaking to this effect.

v. No future expansion of coastal road is permitted and agreed by PP.

6. In response, the proponent has agreed the same and submitted the undertakings in this regard *vide* letter dated 14/06/2024. The Committee has considered the same and found satisfactory while approving the minutes.

All liquid waste arising from the proposed development will be disposed of (iv) as per the norms prescribed by Central/State Pollution Control Board. There shall not be any disposal of untreated effluent into the sea/coastal water bodies. It shall be ensured that the wastewater generated is treated in the STP as committed by the project proponent. The treated waste water shall be reused for landscaping, flushing and/or HVAC cooling purposes etc. within the development. The project proponent should also make alternate arrangement for situation arising due to malfunctioning of STP. There shall be regular monitoring of standard parameters of the effluent discharge from STP under intimation to the SPCB.

Any hazardous waste generated during construction phase, shall be (v) disposed off as per applicable rules and norms with necessary approvals of

the State Pollution Control Board.

A copy of the clearance letter shall be uploaded on the website of the (vi) concerned State Coastal Zone Management Authority/State Pollution Control Board. The Clearance letter shall also be displayed at the Regional Office, District Industries Centre and Collector's Office/Tehsildar's office for 30 days.

A six-monthly monitoring report shall need to be submitted by the project (vii) proponent to the concerned Regional Office of this Ministry regarding the

implementation of the stipulated conditions.



The Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change or any other (viii) Competent Authority may stipulate any additional conditions or modify the existing ones, if necessary in the interest of environment and the same shall be complied with.

Full co-operation shall be extended to the officials from the Regional Office (ix) of MoEF&CC, during monitoring of implementation of environmental safeguards stipulated. It shall be ensured that documents/data sought pertinent is made available to the monitoring team. A complete set of all the documents submitted to MoEF&CC shall be forwarded to the concerned Regional Office of MoEF&CC.

In the case of any change(s) in the scope of the project, the project would (x)

require a fresh appraisal by this Ministry.

The Ministry reserves the right to add additional safeguard measures (xi) subsequently, if considered necessary, and to take action to ensure effective implementation of the suggested safeguard measures in a time bound and satisfactory manner, including revoking of the environment clearance under the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, for noncompliance.

All other statutory clearances such as the approvals for storage of diesel (xii) from Chief Controller of Explosives, Fire Department, Civil Aviation Department, Forest Conservation Act, 1980 and Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 etc. shall be obtained, as applicable by project proponent from the

respective Competent Authorities.

The project proponent should advertise in at least two local Newspapers widely circulated in the region, one of which shall be in the vernacular (xiii) language informing that the project has been accorded CRZ Clearance and copies of clearance letters are available with the State Pollution Control Board (SPCB) and may also be seen on the website of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change at https://parivesh.nic.in/. The advertisement should be made within Seven days from the date of receipt of the Clearance letter and a copy of the same should be forwarded to the concerned Regional Office of this Ministry.

A copy of the clearance letter shall be sent by the proponent to concerned Panchayat, Zilla Parisad/Municipal Corporation, Urban Local Body and the Local NGO, if any, from whom suggestions/representations, if any, were (xiv)

received while processing the proposal.

The proponent shall upload the status of compliance of the stipulated conditions, including results of monitored data on their website and shall update the same periodically. It shall simultaneously be sent to the (XV) Regional Office of MoEF&CC, the respective Zonal Office of CPCB and the

The environmental statement for each financial year ending 31st March in Form-V as is mandated to be submitted by the project proponent to the concerned State Pollution Control Board as prescribed under the (xvi) Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986, as amended subsequently, shall also be put on the website of the project proponent along with the status of compliance of clearance conditions and shall also be sent to the respective Regional Office of the Ministry by e-mail.
