उपर्युक्त विषयक संदर्भ में सूचित करना है कि भारत सरकार, वन, पर्यावरण एवं जलवायु परिवर्तन मंत्रालय, नई दिल्ली के प्रासंगिक पत्र-1 द्वारा बनहरदी कोल ब्लॉक हेतु कुल 515.32 हे० के हेतु वनभूमि अपयोजन प्रस्ताव (FP/JH/MIN/147316/2021) में 37 बिन्दुओं पर पृच्छा की गई थी, जिसका अनुपालन प्रतिवेदन वन संरक्षक, प्रादेशिक अंचल, मेदिनीनगर के पत्रांक 279 दिनांक 06.06.2025 द्वारा इस कार्यालय को प्राप्त हुआ था। उक्त अनुपालन प्रतिवेदन में कतिपय बिन्दुओं पर प्रतिवेदन अपूर्ण रहने के कारण इस कार्यालय के पत्रांक 499 दिनांक 19.06.2025 द्वारा पृच्छा की गयी, जिसका निराकरण प्रतिवेदन वन संरक्षक, प्रादेशिक अंचल, मेदिनीनगर के पत्रांक 619 दिनांक 11.11.2025 (छायाप्रति संलग्न) द्वारा इस कार्यालय को प्राप्त हुआ है।

Accordingly, the diversion of Forest is applied for 515.32 Ha of Forest land. Considering the proved reserve of coal as per Geological report and GSI report, the total coal reserve is estimated as 561.56 million tonne (Approximately) as Geological Reserve and 378 Million Tonne as Mineable reserve out of which 350.50 Million Tonnes (Approximately) shall be extracted. 


